B. THE BEGINNINGS: INFANCY OF JOHN THE BAPTIZER AND JESUS THROUGH THE PRESENTATION OF JESUS AT THE JERUSALEM TEMPLE: Luke 1:5—2:39

THE ANGEL GABRIEL COMES TO MARY

Luke 1:26-38

In the sixth month *God sent* the angel **Gabriel** to a <u>town in Galilee</u> called <u>Nazareth</u>, to a <u>virgin</u> (Gk.: *parthenos*; Heb.: *almah* – Isaiah 7:14; cp. Genesis 24:43, not bethulah – Genesis 24:16) engaged to a man by the name of Joseph, a descendant of David. The virgin's name was Mary (Heb. = Miriam).

28 When the angel entered her home, he said, "Greetings/Rejoice, you who <u>are</u> greatly favored/blessed. "The Lord is with you." Quote Just, Jr. Luke 1:1—9:5. <u>p. 67</u>.

29 She was startled by what he said and tried to figure out what such a greeting might mean.

The angel told her, "Stop being afraid, Mary. You have found **favor** with God. (Lenski: "she has been shown grace by God.") 31 You see: You will conceive and give birth to a Son, and you will name Him JESUS. 32 He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give Him the throne of His ancestor David. 33 He will be King over the people of Jacob forever, and His Kingdom will never end." (See John 12:34; Daniel 2:44.)

Mary asked the angel, "How can this be? I have had no relations [sexual relations] with a man."

The angel answered her, "The Holy Spirit will come over you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. And for that reason the Holy Being (neuter gender; think: from/of another world) being born (Gk.: present participle) of you will be called the Son of God. (Incarnation [in carnis] = most difficult miracle of ALL time – see 1 Timothy 3:16.

Nicene Creed: "was incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the virgin Mary and was made man." Dr. Just: Mary's womb becomes "the flesh-and-blood home" of the incarnate Son of God.)

"Also consider the fact that even Elizabeth, your relative, has conceived a <u>son</u> in her old age. People call her childless, but she is now in her <u>sixth month</u>. 37 There is nothing that God will not be able to do."

"Let it happen to me as you said." Quote Just, Jr. Luke 1:1—9:5, p. 62.

Then the angel left her.

MARY VISITS ELIZABETH; HER SONG

Luke 1: 39-56

39 At this time Mary hurried away to the <u>hill country</u> to a town of Judah. 40 There she went into the home of Zacharias and greeted Elizabeth.

When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the baby leaped in her womb. Then Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit, 42 and she cried out in a loud voice, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the Child who will come from your womb. 43 But how does this happen to me that the mother of my Lord [theotokos – B of C, F.C. twice] comes to me?

As soon as I heard your greeting, the baby leaped with delight in my womb (recall 1:15b). 45 And blessed is she who believed that the Lord will accomplish what He promised to do for her."
