## LESSON 4

# INFANCY NARRATIVES OF JOHN & JESUS FROM LUKE'S GOSPEL

**B.** THE BEGINNINGS: INFANCY OF JOHN THE BAPTIZER AND JESUS THROUGH THE PRESENTATION OF JESUS AT THE JERUSALEM TEMPLE: Luke 1:5—2:39

CONCERNING LUKE, THE PHYSICIAN (COLOSSIANS 4:14), WHO EMPHASES <u>MEDICAL</u> DETAILS: Circumcision on the 8<sup>th</sup> day; "swaddling clothes," the "Good Samaritan", "sweating" blood in the Garden, etc.

#### JESUS IS BORN

### Luke 2:1-5

In those days Caesar Augustus ordered that a census be taken of the whole world [for tax purposes].
(This was the <u>first</u> census <u>before</u> [or, "while"] Quirinius was governing Syria.)
Everyone went to register, each to his own town.

**Joseph** also went <u>up</u> from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to <u>David's town in Judea</u>, <u>which is called *Bethlehem*</u>, because <u>he was one of the descendants of **David**</u>, **5** to register with **Mary**, his fiancée (Lit.: "who was <u>promised</u> to him in marriage"), who was going to have a child.

### **INTERJECTING MATTHEW 1:18-25**

18 This is how Jesus Christ was born.

When His mother **Mary** was <u>engaged</u> to **Joseph**, <u>before</u> they came together, she was found to have conceived [the Child] by the **Holy Spirit**. **19 Joseph**, her <u>husband</u>, was an honorable man and did not want to disgrace her. So he decided to <u>divorce/dismiss</u> her secretly. **See Hahn**, *JW*, **pp. /Dedication page, Contents page, 73, 81.** 

20 After Joseph had thought about it, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take your <u>wife</u> Mary home with you; for her Child is from the Holy Spirit. 21 She will have a <u>son</u>, and you will name Him JESUS, because He will <u>save</u> His people from their sins." 22 All this happened so that what the Lord said through the prophet [Isaiah] would be <u>fulfilled</u>: 23 "Look! The virgin will conceive and have a <u>Son</u>, and they will name Him Immanuel," which means "God-With-Us."

24 When Joseph awoke, he did what the Lord's angel had commanded. He took his <u>wife home with him</u> 25 but did <u>not</u> have relations [sexual relations] with her <u>until</u> she had a son. And he named Him JESUS.

## Luke 2:6, 7

6 Now while they were <u>there</u>, the time was fulfilled for her to have her baby, 7 and she gave birth to her <u>firstborn</u> son. She wrapped Him in <u>baby clothes</u> and laid Him in a <u>manger</u> because there was no room for them in the inn. Cp. Micah 5:2 & Matthew 2:6.

### THE SHEPHERDS

#### Luke 2:8-20

And there were **shepherds** <u>living out in the countryside</u> nearby. They were taking turns watching their flocks <u>at night</u>.

Then **an angel of the Lord** appeared to them, and <u>the **GLORY** of the Lord</u> shone all around them. They were <u>terrified</u>. **10** "Stop being afraid," the angel said to them, "for look, I have <u>good news</u> for you. A great joy will come to all the people, **11** because the <u>Savior</u>, <u>who is <u>Christ the Lord</u> (cp. Acts 2:36), was born for you <u>today</u> in <u>David's town</u>. **12** And this is how you will know Him: you will find an <u>Infant</u> wrapped in <u>baby clothes</u> and lying in a <u>manger</u>" [a *linen* SIGN to be sure, <u>and think</u>: empty *linen* in the Easter tomb].</u>

**13** Suddenly there was with the angel **a large number of the heavenly army** who were praising **God** and saying:

"<u>GLORY</u> to God in the <u>highest</u> heavens (known as the "Gloria in Excelsis") and on earth <u>peace</u> to those who have His favor/good will!"

**15** When the angels had left them and gone to heaven, the shepherds <u>repeatedly</u> said to one another, "The Lord has told us what has happened. Let's go to <u>Bethlehem</u> and see it." **16** Then they came <u>in a hurry</u> and found Mary and Joseph, <u>and</u> the <u>Baby</u> lying in the manger. **17** When they had seen Him, <u>they told others</u> what they had been told about this <u>Child</u>. **18** And everyone was <u>surprised</u> to hear the story that the shepherds told. **Quote Just, Jr.** *Luke 1:1—9:5.* <u>pp. 107 & 108</u>.

**19** But Mary <u>treasured</u> all these things in her heart and <u>kept thinking/pondering</u> <u>about them</u>.

**20** The shepherds went back, **glorifying** and <u>praising</u> God for everything they had heard and seen. <u>It was just as they had been told</u>.

## *IN THE BETHLEHEM <u>SYNAGOGUE</u>—Christ's "<mark>Active Obedience</mark>" & His "<mark>Passive Obedience</mark>." Luke 2:21-39*

**21** On the eighth day when the time was fulfilled to circumcise the Child, He was named JESUS, the Name the angel had given Him before He was conceived in the womb.
