INFANCY NARRATIVES OF JOHN & JESUS FROM LUKE'S GOSPEL

B. THE BEGINNINGS: INFANCY OF JOHN THE BAPTIZER AND JESUS THROUGH THE PRESENTATION OF JESUS AT THE JERUSALEM TEMPLE: Luke 1:5—2:39

LUKE 2:25-35

IN THE JERUSALEM TEMPLE—the Account of Simeon & the Nunc Dimittis

NOTE: "Simeon" is both Hebrew & Greek; its later Hebrew counterpart is "Simon"! Remember the 2nd son of Jacob.

25 Now, there was a man in Jerusalem by the name of Simeon. He was a <u>righteous</u> man, who feared God and was waiting for the <u>One</u> who would <u>comfort/give consolation</u>
io Israel. The Holy Spirit was upon him. 26 The Holy Spirit had told him that <u>before</u> he would die he would see the <u>Christ</u> [Messiah] sent by the Lord.

27 Moved by the Spirit, he went into the Temple. When the parents brought in the Child Jesus to do for Him what was customary according to the Law, 28 Simeon took Him in his arms, praised God, and said:

"Lord, now You are letting Your servant depart in peace as You promised, ["be dismissed"," the basis for the Latin Nunc Dimittis (Now Dismissing/Departing) because my eyes have seen Your <u>Salvation</u> which You prepared for <u>all people</u> to see a <u>Light</u> to shine on the <u>Gentiles</u>, and the <u>Glory</u> of Your <u>people Israel</u>." (See Isaiah 60:1-3.^{*})

33 His father and mother were <u>surprised</u> at the things that were being said about Him.

34 Then Simeon blessed <u>them</u> and said to His mother Mary, "Behold, this **One** [this Child] is placed for a <u>falling</u> <u>and</u> <u>rising</u> of many in Israel—and for a <u>Sign</u> that many will speak <u>against</u> <u>35</u> in order to show <u>what they are thinking in their hearts</u>.^{*} And a <u>sword</u> will pierce <u>your</u> own soul <u>too</u>." Think: A "sword of revelation" for Mary! When? At Christ's ______ !) <u>(See Laestch, Luke, pp 93, 94.</u>

*"Arise, shine, for your light [Gospel] has come.... His glory will appear upon you. Gentiles will come to your light [Gospel]...."

*Secondary Will of God **VS.** Primary Will of God

LUKE 2:36-38

IN THE JERUSALEM TEMPLE—the Account of Anna (Greek); Hannah (Hebrew)

36 Anna, a prophetess, was also there. She was a daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of <u>Asher</u>. She was now very old, having lived with her husband seven years after her virginity, **37** and she was a widow of 84 years [either 84 years old **OR** 84 + 7= 91 years old **OR** if married at 15, then possibly 106 years old at this time]. She never left the Temple but worshiped day and night, fasting and praying. **38** Just then, she too came forward, thanked God, and talked about the Child to all who were looking for redemption in Jerusalem.

LUKE 2:39

Back to Bethlehem, Down to Egypt, Back to Nazareth (Matthew Completes Luke.)
39 When Joseph and Mary had done everything the Law of the Lord commanded them to do, ..., they went back to Galilee to their town of Nazareth.

Simeon parallels "the Christmas angels," being an *evangelist*, who <u>preaches</u> the Good News, while Anna parallels "the Christmas shepherds," being a *missionary* who <u>spreads</u> the Good News.—Dr. Just
