Call For Repentance

- 9. Romans 10:9-10 "...if you confess with your mouth Jesus as Lord, and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved; for with the heart a person believes, resulting in righteousness [the exact thing God requires for us to enter heaven], and with the mouth he confesses, resulting in salvation."
 - a. Long ago, during certain periods of the Roman Empire, people were required to confess "Caesar is Lord". For Christians, that was a direct conflict with their religious beliefs; refusal often led to severe persecution.
 - b. <u>Today</u>, many proceed by SAYING Jesus is Lord but by LIVING as if <u>family</u>, job, <u>money</u>, <u>sports</u>, <u>etc</u>. is Lord.

Biblical repentance *is in harmony with God's will (2Co. 7:10), *is worked by the Spirit (1Co. 12:3), *is worked through the word (Jam. 1:18), and *is a change of allegiance from the things of this world to our Lord Jesus Christ. Biblical repentance:

- begins in the heart,
- is spoken by the lips, and
- is lived out in daily life!
- 10. Romans 10:13 "Whoever [πᾶς denoting highest degree of all (BW, Friberg)] will call on the name of the Lord will be saved." // When God invites us to call on Him (Mk. 1:15 –

- which is a gospel imperative), God's invitation includes the power to respond to His invitation (Jn. 6:44).
- 11. Romans 5:1 "...having been <u>justified</u>
 <u>by faith</u>, we have <u>peace with God</u>
 through our Lord Jesus Christ..."
 - a. By works There is no peace! Why? Because we could never know if we had done enough to meet our false version of God's requirement.
 - b. By faith There is peace! Why? Because we are trusting in Jesus, who has fully met God's true requirement for us. People saved by faith are:
 - Forgiven by God!
 - Indwelt by the Holy Spirit!
 - Spiritually alive!
 - Members of God's kingdom!
 - In possession of eternal life!
 - Heaven bound!

Live For Christ

12. Romans 12:2 "...do <u>not</u> be conformed to this world, <u>but</u> be transformed by the renewing of your mind, so that you may prove what the will of God is, that which is good and acceptable and perfect."

// We <u>were</u> controlled by our old nature – *like the rest of the fallen world*, but <u>now</u> we want our new nature to change our lives by:

- a. Growing us in God's word.
- b. Helping us put Christ first.
- c. Helping us say "no" to sin.
- **d.** Moving us to live in harmony with the Bible.
- **e.** Guiding us to care about the spiritual condition of others.

Conclusion

Let us remain ready – since Jesus will return at an unexpected time: 1 Thess. 5:2 "...you yourselves know full well that the day of the Lord will come just like a thief in the night."

Let us not delay – the time is now: **2Co. 6:2** "...**now** is 'the acceptable time,' behold, **now** is 'the day of salvation...'"

Ask Thought-Provoking Questions



Get permission: Can I ask you a few important questions?

- 1. Do you think people continue to exist after they die? Y N
- 2. Do you believe in the existence of heaven and hell? Y N If not, see this brochure: BAD News, GOOD News
- 3. Are you afraid of dying? Y N
- 4. Where are you headed?
- 5. How do you know?
- 6. Can I share God's saving truth?

<u>Note</u>: Even if someone has the right answers, *keep sharing for practice*.

Establish the Source of Truth

We all tend to believe what makes sense:

- Francis Bacon "Man prefers to believe what he prefers to be true."
- Proverbs 14:12 "There is a way [to heaven] which seems right to a man, but its end is the way of death."

The Bible is God's written word to *show us the truth and *give us eternal life:

- John 17:17 "Your word is truth."
- John 20:31 "...these [signs (miracles) performed by Jesus] have been written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God; and that believing you may have [et.] life in His name."
 The Bible Is True!

The Roman Road

Roman roads were of several kinds, ranging from small local roads to broad, long-distance highways built to connect cities, major towns, and military bases.



The Roman Road in this brochure has the purpose of moving people **from** <u>deception</u> **to** <u>truth</u>, **to** <u>repentance</u>, **to** <u>forgiveness</u>, and **to** <u>living for Jesus</u>!

The rest of this brochure focuses on key passages from the book of Romans, a.k.a., the Roman Road. Let's keep <u>reading</u>, <u>thinking about</u>, <u>understanding</u>, <u>believing</u>, and applying God's reliable word!

Clarify Our Problem

- 1. Romans 3:10 "There is none righteous, not even one." // NO ONE is perfectly right in thoughts, words, and deeds ...
- 2. Romans 3:23

"...<u>all</u> have sinned and <u>fall short</u> of the glory of God." // Because <u>NO</u>
ONE can live *a SINLESS LIFE*.

- 3. Romans 5:12 "...just as through one man [Adam] sin entered the world, and death through sin, and so death spread to all men, because all sinned..." // We have each inherited many things from our parents, including sin and death.
- 4. Romans 6:23a "...the wages of sin is death..." // Both inherited sin and actual sin make us *spiritually dead and *in line for eternal punishment.

Show Our Helplessness

5. Romans 10:3 "...not knowing about God's righteousness [which requires us to be sinless] and seeking to establish their own [righteousness] [by believing good is good enough], they did not subject themselves to [put themselves under] the righteousness of God." //

God has set the rules and the grading scale (Ja. 2:10) but

most *don't know they are helpless and *keep trusting in themselves for heaven. For all who think their goodness will save them, they will never receive God's eternal gift.

Explain God's Love

6. Romans 5:8 "...God demonstrates his own love toward us, in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us."

// Love is taking sacrificial action to freely supply what someone needs.

God loves us because of who He is (1Jn. 4:8), not because of what we do.

God's love moved Him to send His Son (Jn. 3:16) to be our perfect substitute by *living a sinless life (Heb. 4:15) and *receiving our eternal punishment (1Jn. 2:2).

7. Romans 6:23b "...the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord." // God *made us and *wants us to be with

<u>Him forever</u>. **He knows** that **no one can earn eternal life**. Therefore, *God is inviting everyone to receive* <u>His precious qift</u> **through faith alone in Jesus**.

8. Romans 8:3-4 "...what the Law could not do, weak as it was through the flesh [since no one can keep it perfectly], God did: sending His own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh and as an offering for sin, He condemned [our] sin in [Jesus'] flesh, so that the requirement of the Law might be fulfilled in us..." // Since we could never meet God's requirement, the Son of God did it for us through *His sinless living and *His reception of our sins and our eternal condemnation. Jesus did for us what

we could never do for ourselves!
