What Is More Important: What We Think or What God Commanded?

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: Today is part 3 of our series: God's Life-Changing Truth. Today's question: What is more important: what we think **or** what God commanded? Let's think about our lives: *Are we led by our own personal thoughts or by God's Holy Word?* In today's text we are going to see a wrong emphasis – *which is sin against God!* Then Jesus will tell us the truth – *which is a call to repent!*

1. The Setting: ¹Now when the Pharisees gathered to him [Jesus], with some of the scribes who had come from Jerusalem, ² they saw that some of his disciples ate with hands that were defiled, that is, unwashed [they gathered NOT for the purpose of hearing but of arguing; also, the Jews understood the significance of not washing, but Mark adds this explanation for the Greeks].³ (For the Pharisees and all the Jews do not eat unless they wash their hands, holding to the tradition of the elders, ⁴ and when they come from the marketplace, they do not eat unless they wash [βαπτίσωνται]. And there are many other traditions that they observe, such as the washing [βαπτισμούς] of cups and pots and copper vessels and dining couches.) // To the Pharisees and scribes, they were not concerned about cleanliness – freedom from germs; they saw the lack of washing as **greater** than breaking the commandments of God!

- Two Different Positions: ⁵ And the Pharisees and the scribes asked him, "Why do your disciples not walk [live, conduct themselves] according to the tradition of the elders, but eat with defiled hands?" // Their rules of washing had become more important than God's commands[®]. They did not look at the heart, but at the outward actions.
 - a. <u>Jesus reply</u>: ⁶ And he said to them, "Well did Isaiah prophesy of you hypocrites, as it is written,
 - i. 'This people honors me with their lips, but their heart is far from me; // So they spoke rightly, but believed wrongly!
 - ii. ⁷ in vain [producing no result] do they worship me, teaching as doctrines the commandments of men.' [So Jesus said:]
 ⁸ You leave the commandment of God and hold to the tradition of men." // So they worshiped outwardly, but it meant nothing! And they taught their man-made teachings as if they were God's teachings! Dr. Kretzmann wrote: "all people that place the commandments of men on the same level with God's holy Law" are like those Pharisees and scribes (NT 1:200).
 - b. <u>An example of hypocrisy</u>: ⁹ And he said to them, "You have a fine way of rejecting the commandment of God in order to establish your tradition! ¹⁰ For Moses said [the LORD thru

Moses], 'Honor your father and your mother'; and, 'Whoever reviles father or mother must surely die.' ¹¹ But you say, 'If a man tells his father or his mother, "Whatever you would have gained from me is Corban''' (that is, given to God)-- ¹² then you no longer permit him to do anything for his father or mother, ¹³ thus making void [canceling] the word of God by your tradition that you have handed down. And many such things you do." // So they made their own laws which canceled out God's Laws! Do we sometimes do the same – following our way, not God's way – with how we love, hwhen we worship, hwhat we give, or how we serve?

- 3. Jesus Taught the People: ¹⁴ And he called the people to him again and said to them, "Hear me, all of you, and understand [Jesus had something very important to say]: ¹⁵ There is nothing outside a person that by going into him can defile him, but the things that come out of a person are what defile him." ¹⁶ [See the footnote.¹] // The OT includes various food restrictions (see Lev. 11) about what goes into the body, but Jesus turned the focus toward what comes out of the heart.
- 4. Jesus Taught His Disciples:
 - a. <u>About what goes in</u>: ¹⁷ And when he had entered the house and left the people, his disciples asked him about the <u>parable</u> [a comparison that was hard to understand]. ¹⁸ And he said to them, "Then are you also [like the ordinary people] without understanding? Do

you not see that whatever goes into a person from outside cannot defile him, ¹⁹ since it enters not his heart but his stomach, and is expelled?" (Thus he declared all foods clean.) // Jesus kept God's Law perfectly for everyone; His fulfillment brought an end to *the ceremonial law*, which included food restrictions and animal sacrifices.

b. About what comes out: ²⁰ And he said, "What comes out of a person is what defiles him. ²¹ For from within, out of the heart of man, come evil thoughts, sexual immorality, theft, murder, adultery, ²² coveting, wickedness, deceit, sensuality, envy, slander, pride, foolishness. ²³ All these evil things come from within, and they defile a person." // Is it good to eat healthy? Yes! Will eating with dirty hands lead us to eternal punishment? No! The problem is not with what goes into the body, but with what *comes out of the heart!* The LORD to Israel: ²⁵ " will sprinkle clean water on you, and you shall be clean from all your uncleannesses, and from all your idols I will cleanse you [baptism]. ²⁶ And I will give you a new heart, and a new spirit I will put within you. And I will remove the heart of stone from your flesh and give you a heart of flesh [faith]. ²⁷ And I will put my Spirit within you, and cause you to walk in my statutes and be careful to obey my rules [H.S. & obedience]." (Ezekiel 36 ESV)

Conclusion: So, having new hearts through Jesus, let us always value God's Word over our own thoughts! **Amen!**

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¹ Some Greek manuscripts have verse 16: If anyone has ears to hear, let him hear.
