Ephesians 6:10-20 ESV

Do You Know about the Devil's Scheme to Devour You?

Introduction: Dear friends in Jesus Christ: We are so blessed here in America to be *relatively free* from engaging in war on *our soil*. Yes, we were attacked in 2001 *but our enemies killed themselves*. So, *to find war on our soil*, we have to go back to December 7, 1941 when the Japanese attacked Pearl Harbor. Yes, we attempted to fight back, but we also suffered many casualties (wounded and dead) *because we were unprepared*.

When a person dies in a physical battle – *it is heart-wrenching for his family*. But *when a person dies in a spiritual battle,* it is even more heart-wrenching – *he is lost for eternity!*

Today, *in Ephesians 6:10-20*, God wants us to see that – even now – we are engaged in a *spiritual battle!* **In Revelation chapter 12**, *the devil tried to devour Jesus (4), but failed; *then, *twice*, he tried to destroy *all believers* (13-16), but failed; *¹⁷ "Then the dragon became furious... and went off to make war... on those who keep the commandments of God and hold to the testimony of Jesus" (ESV).

Therefore, today, let us learn more about our spiritual enemies; then, let us **put on the full armor of God*, **receive the Sword of the Spirit*, and **be faithful soldiers of Christ!*

1. We Need <u>God's Strength</u> Against the Devil: <u>So who is</u> <u>the devil</u>? **He** has been sinning from the beginning; **he** tempted Eve—and she fell; **he** tempted Jesus—but He did not fall; **he** prevents the seed of God's Word from taking root unto eternal life; **he** is the father of lies; **he** prowls around like a roaring lion seeking someone to devour; **he** is the deceiver of the whole world; and **he** will be thrown into the lake of fire.¹

- a. ¹⁰ Finally, be strong *in the Lord* and *in the strength of his might*. [How?] ¹¹ Put on [clothe yourselves with] the whole armor of God, [Why?] that you may be able [powerful] to stand against the schemes of the devil. // Since our enemy is so tough, it is essential for us to ever-continue
 in the Lord's strength and *in the Lord's armor! Think about David against Goliath, he went against him *in the name of the LORD!*
- b. ¹² For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but [against spiritual enemies] against the rulers, against the <u>authorities</u>, against the <u>cosmic powers over</u> [or world rulers of] <u>this present</u> <u>darkness</u>, against the <u>spiritual forces of evil in</u> <u>the heavenly places</u>. // Note that our fighting is wrestling, thus up close, hand-to-hand combat! Furthermore, it is **not** against the *lower evil powers*, **but** against those which are *very high* – so we *desperately* need our Lord JESUS CHRIST!
- c. ¹³ Therefore take up the whole armor of God, [Why?] that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand firm.
- 2. We Need <u>God's Armor</u> Against the Devil: Not only each piece of armor, but the ability to **use** each piece!

- a. ¹⁴ Stand therefore, having fastened on the belt of truth [Bible], and having put on the breastplate of righteousness [Christ], ¹⁵ and, as shoes for your feet, having put on the readiness given by the gospel of peace [assurance]. // As a belt goes all the way around, so we are to surround ourselves with <u>God's truth</u>! As a breastplate protects the vital organs, so we have God's vital gift of <u>righteousness in Jesus Christ</u>! As boots enable soldiers to step forward without fear, so the gospel forgiveness through Jesus enables us to go forward with <u>assurance</u>!
- b. ¹⁶ In all circumstances take [having taken] up the shield of faith, with which you can [will be able to] extinguish all the flaming darts [arrows] of the evil one; ¹⁷ and take [receive, δέξασθαι] the helmet of salvation, // Salvation is never taken or earned, but received by grace through faith!
- We Need <u>God's Weapons</u> Against the Devil: So part 2 described our *defensive protection*; now, in part 3, we focus on our *offensive weapons*!
 - a. ^{17b} and [receive] the <u>sword of the Spirit</u>, which is the word of God, ¹⁸ pr<u>aying at all times in the</u> <u>Spirit</u>, with all prayer and supplication. //
 - So the Word of God is also received; Jesus said to Peter: "...flesh and blood has not revealed this to you [thus you didn't take it or figure it out], but my Father who is in heaven [enabled you to see or receive it]" (Matt. 16:17 ESV). So we never change God's Word; instead, we receive it, believe it, and apply it!

Dr. Luther wrote: "Here it is not enough that we defend ourselves against the devil with faith and hope..., but we must also draw the sword and go for him *[for the devil]*..." Since the Word of God is this weapon, it behooves us to... become acquainted with it both by means of public preaching and by earnest Bible study at home. [Brief] reading must be supplemented by careful memorizing of proof-texts and strong passages. Only in this way shall we be able to make the proper use of the Word of God as a true weapon of offense at all times (Kretzmann, NT II:292).

- ii. Also, as good soldiers, we pray not just in times of difficulty and not on our own, but at all times and with the help of the Spirit!
- b. To that end keep alert with all perseverance, making supplication [earnest prayer] for all the saints [believers], ¹⁹ and also for me, that words may be given to me in opening my mouth boldly to proclaim the mystery of the gospel, ²⁰ for which I am an ambassador in chains [under house arrest], that I may declare it boldly, as I ought to speak. // I also ask for your prayers!

Conclusion: Finally, since our enemies are so fierce, let us be faithful soldiers of our Lord Jesus Christ!

<u>**Prayer of Response</u>**: Dear Lord, now that I am more aware of the spiritual battle raging around me, cover me with Your armor and fortify me with Your Word and prayer. Amen!</u>

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
