Revelation 1:1-6 ESV

The Newborn King Is Now Victorious and Reigning!

Sunday, December 27 at 10:00 First Sunday after Christmas – 2015

Join us for our New Year's Eve Divine Service at 7 PM A good way to conclude 2015 and begin 2016!

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: It's the season of
Christmas so we are celebrating Jesus' birth, yet we also know of His victory on Calvary, His resurrection from the dead,
His ascension into heaven, and His present reign in heaven and on earth.

Today we focus on the *first six verses of the book of Revelation*, which include ⇒the source of the information,
⇒the importance of taking heed to the book, ⇒a Trinitarian greeting, and ⇒a focus on Jesus – *the Christ of Christmas!*

1. The Message – From God to Us: ¹ The revelation [the making things known] of Jesus Christ, which God [the Father] gave him [Jesus] to show to his servants [literally His slaves – like the apostle John] the things that must soon take place. He [Jesus] made it known by sending his angel to his servant John [that is, the apostle John], ² who bore witness to the word of God and to the testimony of Jesus Christ, even to all that he saw. // Did you catch the order of how the book of Revelation came from God to us? The information passed from the Father, to Jesus, to His angel, to the apostle John, to

the written Word, to us! So it came through many to get to us, but God the Father is the Source!

- The Message Let Us Know and Do It: ³ Blessed is the one [reading and the one hearing] the words of this prophecy and [keeping] what has been written in it, for the time is near. // That verse identified these things:
 - a. <u>The one reading</u>: That could be a pastor, leader, or teacher; *all such people should share the Word of God with others!*
 - b. <u>The one hearing</u>: That includes all people who gather for our services; *they should faithfully come* and *they should listen carefully*!
 - c. <u>Both those reading and those hearing</u>: They should *continue keeping* the Word of God; keeping is not just for full-time church workers, *but for everyone who knows Jesus as His Savior*!
 - d. Why are reading, hearing, and keeping important? Because the time of the end of the world is near!
- 3. The Message The Trinitarian Greeting: ⁴ John to the seven churches that are in Asia [which possibly represent the whole Christian Church on earth and the troubles that congregations will face during the NT era]: Grace to you and peace from [God the Father] him who is and who was and who is to come, and from [God the Holy Spirit] the seven spirits who are before his throne, ⁵ and from [God the Son] Jesus Christ...

- The Message Focusing on Jesus: ...the faithful witness, the firstborn of the dead, and the ruler of kings [of the] earth. To him [Jesus] who loves us and has freed us from our sins by his blood ⁶ and made us a kingdom, priests to his God and Father, to him be glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen.
 - a. <u>The Faithful Witness</u>: Jesus faithfully told God's truth during His ministry *when it was easy and when it was difficult*.
 - b. <u>The Firstborn of the Dead</u>: Jesus is the first fruits of those who have died (1 Cor. 15:20). He rose first; *all will be raised when He returns!*
 - c. <u>The Ruler of the kings of the earth</u>: They seem to be in control here, *but He is over them all!*
 - d. <u>The One who loves us</u>: True love is sacrificial, *so Jesus put our needs before His own*; even when we did not love Him, *He loved us*!
 - e. <u>The One who has freed us from our sins by His</u> <u>blood</u>: The entire human race had brought a death sentence upon itself. In all the universe there was only one antidote—Jesus holy precious blood, so He shed it for our freedom!
 - f. <u>The One who made us a kingdom of priests</u>: Because of *His work* and *our relationship with Him*, we are members of God's kingdom. Every member is a priest, so we are called to *pray for others* and *share the good news about Jesus!*

Conclusion: As we will soon conclude 2015 and begin 2016, we do so \checkmark with peace—our sins are forgiven, \checkmark with confidence—Jesus is reigning, and \checkmark with purpose—to pray for others and share the good news about Jesus, who is God's gift to the world!

And all God's people said: Amen!
