

Introduction: Dear friends in Jesus Christ: Life in this sinful world can be difficult, we have all experienced it. *So God invented the wonderful blessing of encouragement!* How does it work?

- <u>Multiple people are necessary</u>; they are *the givers* and *the receivers* of the encouragement.
- <u>Communication is necessary</u>; those multiple people *interact* to give and receive the encouragement.
- Love is necessary; the love of one person to another is what *moves a person* to give genuine encouragement.

In today's gospel reading, take note of the many expressions of encouragement:

1. Jesus Encouraged Peter, John, and James: ²⁸ Now <u>about eight days after these sayings</u> he took with him Peter and John and James and went up on the mountain to pray.



a. <u>What sayings</u>? About eight days earlier Peter, *speaking on behalf of all the apostles*, testified that Jesus is "<u>The Christ of God</u>" (Luke 9:20 ESV).

From the gospel of Matthew, we learn that *God the Father* had made that known to Peter (Matt. 16:17); now, very soon, *up on the mountain*, that reality will be **seen** by Peter and the others!

- b. <u>How did Jesus give encouragement</u>? He did so by choosing Peter, John, and James to go with Him! So multiple people were involved, they interacted, and love was shown!
- Moses and Elijah Encouraged Jesus: ²⁹ And as he was praying, the appearance of his face was altered, and his clothing became dazzling white. ³⁰ And behold, two men were talking with him, [who were] Moses and Elijah, ³¹ who appeared in glory and spoke of his departure [ἕξοδον], which he was about to accomplish [in] Jerusalem.
 - a. <u>Jesus encouraged the Father</u>: How? **By drawing near to Him through prayer** to gain wisdom and strength for a very difficult part of His ministry! *Let us also draw near each day through prayer!*
 - <u>The Father encouraged Jesus</u>: How? By changing His appearance and by sending Moses and Elijah.
 - c. <u>Moses and Elijah encouraged Jesus</u>: How? By talking with Jesus about what was coming. We don't know what they said, but possibly something like this: "Jesus, long ago we went through much, yet You carried us through! Since You encouraged us, we are here to encourage you! Your work will open heaven to all who receive you, so be faithful no matter what!"

- 3. Peter Tried to Encourage Jesus, Moses, and Elijah: ³² Now Peter and those who were with him were heavy [burdened, weighed down] with sleep, but when they became fully awake they saw his glory and the two men who stood with him. ³³ And as the men were parting from him, Peter said to Jesus, "Master, it is good that we are here. Let us make three tents [booths], one for you and one for Moses and one for Elijah" --not knowing [or understanding] what he said.
 - a. <u>Trying to lengthen a good experience</u>: Think of a good experience in your life..., we want such experiences to continue as long as possible!
 - b. <u>Peter's attempt</u>: As Peter saw Moses and Elijah begin to leave, he tried to prolong their stay by offering to make each of them a resting place. Peter was expressing his joy with their presence and trying to make it continue, yet it was time for them to leave the mountain and go to Jerusalem so Jesus could complete His mission! We also love pleasure, yet it is time to deny ourselves, take up our crosses, and follow Jesus!
- 4. God the Father Encouraged Peter, John, and James: ³⁴ As he [Peter] was saying these things, a cloud came and overshadowed them, and they were afraid as they entered the cloud. ³⁵ And a voice came out of the cloud, saying, "This is my Son, my Chosen One; listen to him!" ³⁶ And when the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. And they kept silent and told no one in those days anything of what they had seen.

- a. <u>The glory of the LORD appeared in the cloud</u>: That happened over and over again in the Old Testament. However, now, that same cloud surrounded Peter, John, and James. What an experience; *what encouragement!*
- b. <u>The Father spoke</u>: Peter, John, and James believed that Jesus is the Christ, yet to hear the Father say, "This is my Son, My Chosen One," must have been very encouraging!
- c. <u>The Father made a very important point</u>: "listen to him!" What does that mean? It means to ⇒hear, ⇒understand, and ⇒take action! There are three categories:
 - i. **Ignore** Jesus⊗.
 - ii. **Pretend to hear** Jesus⊗.
 - iii. Hear and understand Jesus, then take action[©]! May the Holy Spirit move every heart to <u>hear</u>, <u>understand</u>, and <u>take action</u>!

Conclusion: As a result of today's sermon, may the Lord help us to assess our lives on the topic of **encouragement**:

- Wherever we are communicating discouragement, *let us repent!*
- Wherever God is leading us to give encouragement, *let* us speak and act in love!
- Wherever God is leading us to receive encouragement, *let us do so with thanksgiving!*
