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Series – Part 7: How to Live as a Christian:

Be a Doer of the Word!

James 1:22-27 ESV

3rd Sunday After Pentecost / 2nd After Trinity – 2013 Sunday, June 9 at 8:00 & 10:45; Monday, June 10 at 7 PM

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ, Lutherans tend to be familiar with Ephesians 2:8 and 2:9 but not 2:10. What am I talking about?

- 2:8 and 2:9 tell us that we have been saved by grace through faith; *God has done it*; it is His gift to us!
- Then 2:10 follows with the rest of the story; God has saved us to be doers of His Word!

In today's text God is speaking through James \rightarrow to show us what is normal for believers and \rightarrow to open the eyes of those who are deceiving themselves.

1. Are You Becoming a Doer of the Word? Earlier, in James chapter 1, we learned that God gave us spiritual birth through the Word of Truth; then, at the end of last week's text, we were told to ²¹ "...receive with meekness the implanted word, which is able to save [our] souls." <u>Thus, by GOD'S WORK, we are saved</u>! Now James tells us what to do with that implanted word: ²² But be⁴ [And become] doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves. // We are being called to LIVE what we PROFESS! Some hear and do; others hear but take no action, such people are misleading or fooling themselves. The Bible says: "...not the hearers of the Law are just before God, but the doers of the Law will be justified." (Rom 2:13 NAS) The doing does NOT save, but it is the outward expression of our faith! But "for 'faith' to be real, it must be translated into 'works.'"² Luther: "faith is a living, busy, active, mighty thing, so that it is impossible for it not to be constantly doing what is good.³

- a. <u>Hearing without doing</u>: ²³ For [indicating this to be the explanation of v. 22] if <u>anyone</u> [today's key word] is <u>a hearer of the word and not a doer</u>, he is like a man who looks intently [looking] at his natural face in a mirror. ²⁴ For he looks [looked] at himself and goes [has gone] away and immediately forgets [forgot] what he was like.
 - i. <u>Too busy</u>: "Everything in that description stresses haste and casualness."⁴ Let us NOT receive God's Word in those ways!
 - ii. <u>Actual Mirror</u>: We look and see the need to comb our hair, *but we quickly go away and forget to comb it*.
 - iii. <u>Spiritual Mirror</u>: We hear the Word of God, *but we quickly go away and forget to do it*. James is calling all such people to
 be sorry, ***receive God's forgiveness in Christ, and ***become doers of the Word!

- b. <u>Hearing and doing</u>: ²⁵ But the one who looks [having looked] into the perfect law, the law of liberty, and perseveres [remaining / continuing / abiding], being no hearer who forgets [not being a forgetful hearer] but a doer who acts [of work], he will be blessed in his doing. //
 - i. <u>The perfect law of liberty</u>: That is God's perfect Word about ◆our sin, ◆His saving work, and ◆His will for all believers.
 - ii. <u>Remaining / continuing / abiding</u>: Jesus said: "If you abide in My word, *then* you are truly disciples of Mine..." (John 8:31 NAS) Those who abide in God's Word are not forgetful hearers, *but doers!*
 - iii. Encouragement for doers: They will be blessed! "The blessed one is not he who knows these things but the one who does them..."⁵ Jesus said: "Blessed...are those who hear the word of God and keep it!" (Luke 11:28 ESV)
- Does Your Life Show Your Connection to Christ? In this section James gives two examples, one regarding what we say and another regarding what we do:
 - a. <u>False religion</u>: ²⁶ If anyone <u>thinks</u> ["frequently used in the NT for false opinion"⁶] he is religious, and does not bridle [bridling / controlling] his tongue but deceives [deceiving] his heart, this person's [his] religion is worthless. // To some it may seem

right to put others down, get angry, and use profanity, *but such people are deceived!* Jesus said: "...his mouth speaks from that which fills his heart." (Luke 6:45 NAS) Also, "A professed Christianity that centers on the external expressions of faith—attendance at worship, rote prayers, church membership, participation in [the Supper]—but is devoid of the regenerating power of the gospel—is [as] futile and unprofitable as idol worship."⁷

b. <u>True religion</u>: Religion that is pure and undefiled before [the] God, the [and] Father, is this: to visit [look after] orphans and widows in their affliction / difficult circumstances, and to keep himself unstained from the world. // So pure religion, thus living as believers in Christ, is to keep •helping those who cannot repay us (Luke 14:12-14) and •saying "no" to our sinful desires.

Conclusion: Let's remember and apply God's Word:

- 1. God has saved us to be _____ of His Word!
- 2. We are being called to ______ what we PROFESS!

May the joy of God's salvation move us to faithfully learn the Word and gladly do it!

And all God's people said: Amen!
