Are We Honoring Jesus as Lord – Part 8: Luke 15:1-3, 11-32 ESV

## UNREPENTANCE – Sometimes It <u>Shows</u> and Sometimes It Is <u>Hidden</u>!

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: Last Sunday included the parable of the fruitless fig tree; today's parable is known by many as the parable of the prodigal son. Initially that son was <u>unrepentant</u> – *life was all about him*; but when his money was gone and he was starving, <u>God worked a change</u> <u>of heart</u>, which led to changes of attitude and action! Let us listen, think, and learn; then be repentant!

 The Setting: <sup>1</sup> Now the tax collectors and sinners were all drawing near to hear him. <sup>2</sup> And the Pharisees and the scribes grumbled, saying, "This man receives sinners and eats with them." <sup>3</sup> So he told them this parable... <sup>11</sup> ... "There was a man who had two sons. // •The first parable in Luke 15 is about the lost sheep, •the second one is about the lost coin, and •the third one is about the prodigal son. As Jesus spoke, <u>two</u> <u>groups of people were listening</u>: (1) the sinners represented by the younger son; and (2) the Pharisees—represented by the older son. Even though the <u>younger</u> son was obviously wrong and the <u>older</u> son looked right, both were in need of repentance! So, for the <u>younger son</u>, his unrepentance showed, but, for the <u>older son</u>, his unrepentance was hidden!

- 2. Open Unrepentance: <sup>12</sup> "And the younger of [the two sons] said to his father, 'Father, give me the share of property that is coming to me.' And he divided his property between them [1/3 to the younger son, 2/3's to the older son]. <sup>13</sup> Not many days later, the younger son gathered all he had and took a journey into a far country, and there he squandered his property in reckless living." // The younger son had this attitude: I don't care what anybody thinks, not even God; I'm going to eat, drink, and be merry! Decades ago in America, there was shame, so people sinned behind closed doors. But now, as it says in Zephaniah 3:5, "the unjust knows no shame" (Zep 3:5 ESV). Furthermore, they want us to approve of their shameful ways!
- 3. Broke and Hungry: <sup>14</sup> "And when he had spent everything, a severe famine arose in that country, and he began to be in need. <sup>15</sup> So he went and hired himself out to one of the citizens of that country, who sent him into his fields to feed pigs. <sup>16</sup> And he was longing to be fed with the pods that the pigs ate, and no one gave him anything." // When all resources are gone, people will either \*curse God or \*become more open to receiving His help.
- 4. Planned Confession: <sup>17</sup> "But when he came to himself [when he began to think again], he said, 'How many of my father's hired servants have more than enough bread, but I perish here with hunger! <sup>18</sup> I will arise and go to my father, and I will say to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven [since all sins are against God (Ps. 51:4)] and before you [since I demanded my inheritance before you died; then threw it away with evil living]. <sup>19</sup> I am no longer worthy

to be called your son. Treat me as one of your hired servants." // So, by God's grace, he thought it through; then he planned how he would express his sincere sorrow to his father and eask for his mercy.

- 5. The Father's Love and Forgiveness: <sup>20</sup> "And he arose and came to his father. But while he was still a long way off, his father saw him and felt compassion, and ran and embraced him and kissed him. [Why? His father had been longing for his son to return – even as God the Father longs for all unrepentant sinners to return to Him!]<sup>21</sup> And the son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you. I am no longer worthy to be called your son.' <sup>22</sup> But the father [filled with joy] said to his servants, 'Bring quickly the best robe, and put it on him, and put a ring on his hand, and shoes on his feet. <sup>23</sup> And bring the fattened calf and kill it, and let us eat and celebrate. <sup>24</sup> For this my son was dead, and is alive again; he was lost, and is found.' And they began to celebrate. // The LORD said to Jeremiah, "I will forgive their iniquity, and I will remember their sin no more" (Jer. 31:34 ESV). That is what the father did toward his younger son! God the Father wants to do the same for every wrongdoer!
- 6. Hidden Unrepentance: <sup>25</sup> "Now his older son was in the field, and as he came and drew near to the house, he heard music and dancing. <sup>26</sup> And he called one of the servants and asked what these things meant. <sup>27</sup> And he said to him, 'Your brother has come, and your father has killed the fattened calf, because he has received him back safe and sound.' <sup>28</sup> But he was angry and refused to go in. His father came out and

entreated him, <sup>29</sup> but he answered his father, 'Look, these many years I have served you, and I never disobeyed your command, yet you never gave me a young goat, that I might celebrate with my friends. <sup>30</sup> But when this son of yours came, who has devoured your property with prostitutes, you killed the fattened calf for him!''' // What was the older son thinking? THIS ISN'T FAIR; my little brother sinned while I served, yet he gets the fattened calf and I get nothing! Let's think about the two sons:

- a. <u>The younger son</u> thought about himself, so he took his money and spent it on himself. Just like people today who live in open sin!
- b. <u>The older son</u> stayed and served, yet he did so for himself, not out of love for his father. Just like people today who go through the right motions for the wrong reasons!
- 7. The Father's Love Is Greater than Our Sin: <sup>31</sup> "And [the father] said to him, 'Son, you are always with me, and all that is mine is yours. <sup>32</sup> It was fitting to celebrate and be glad, for this your brother was dead, and is alive; he was lost, and is found."" // There is no jealousy in the kingdom of God; there are plenty of blessings for everyone!

**Conclusion:** Let us pray: Dear Holy Spirit, You have made us new in Christ, *so we are forever blessed through Jesus*; therefore, help us to be *sincerely repentant* and *sincerely rejoice* over **all** who repent! In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.

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
