## Acts of Repentance?

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: Jesus, when He spoke about heaven, put all people into two categories – the many and the few (Matt. 7:13-14):

- The many think they are okay, but are actually deceived.
- The few, by God's grace, are actually on the path to heaven.

For **the many** and **the few**, *they are all sinners, so they do not deserve heaven*. But there is <u>one important difference</u> between *the many* and *the few*:

- <u>The many are unrepentant</u>; they might seem like nice people, but they \*do not yet know Jesus (John 17:3) and \*they are mostly living for themselves (Mark 8:35).
- <u>The few are **repentant**</u>; God has worked in them a change of heart and attitude, which shows in their various acts of repentance (2 Cor. 5:17).

Today, *as we focus on Zacchaeus*, let us marvel at his amazing acts of repentance!

1. Zacchaeus Was Interested In Jesus: <sup>1</sup> [Jesus] entered Jericho and was passing through. <sup>2</sup> And there was a man named Zacchaeus. He was a <u>chief tax collector</u> and was <u>rich</u>. <sup>3</sup> And he was seeking to see who Jesus was, but on account of the crowd he could not, because he was small of stature. <sup>4</sup> So he ran on ahead and climbed up into a sycamore tree to see him, for he was about to pass that way.

- a. <u>Even though Zacchaeus was rich, he was still</u> <u>interested in Jesus</u>: When people are rich – like most Americans – they can buy whatever they need, so they have no need for God. But Zacchaeus was different; <u>how was God at work</u> <u>in his life</u>? Did a loved one recently die; did he have a near-death experience. We don't know, but, by God's grace, he wanted to see Jesus!
- b. Zacchaeus thought things through:
  - <u>Jesus route</u>: Zacchaeus thought about the route Jesus would take, and he had treeclimbing abilities, so he took immediate action to run ahead and climb a tree! What is your desire to see Jesus?
  - ii. <u>His route</u>: Zacchaeus thought about his life and his death, so he knew he needed more than money! We are ready to live today, but are we ready to face Jesus?
- Jesus Was Interested In Zacchaeus: <sup>5</sup> And when Jesus came to the place, he looked up and said to him, "Zacchaeus, <u>hurry</u> and come down, for I must [δεῖ] stay at your house today." <sup>6</sup> So he hurried and <u>came down</u> and <u>received him joyfully</u>.

- a. <u>Even though Jesus knew Zacchaeus was a sinner,</u> <u>He was still interested in him</u>: Zacchaeus might have felt like his desire to see Jesus was a one way street, yet Jesus – knowing the heart of Zacchaeus – took special interest in him. In fact, Jesus wants everyone to benefit from His work!
- b. <u>Even though Zacchaeus was not liked by others</u>, Jesus was not ashamed to identify with him: Even though the people looked down on Zacchaeus – thinking he was a BIG sinner, Jesus
  loved him, \*talked to him, and \*wanted to stay with him! The Bible says that the kindness of God leads us to repentance (Rom. 2:4)!
- 3. The People Didn't Get It: <sup>7</sup> And when [the people of Jericho] saw it, they all grumbled, "He has gone in to be the guest of a man who is a sinner." // Is everyone in the same boat or not? In other words, except for Jesus, has everyone broken God's laws? "Yes!" Except for Jesus, is anyone good enough for heaven? "No!" The people didn't get those things; they knew Zacchaeus was a law-breaker, but they didn't know they were law-breakers!
- 4. Zacchaeus Did Get It: <sup>8</sup> And Zacchaeus stood and said to the Lord, "Behold, Lord, the half of my goods [property, possessions] I give to the poor. And if I have defrauded [cheated] anyone of anything, I restore it fourfold." <sup>9</sup> And Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house, since he also is a son of Abraham [literally, because even he is a son of Abraham].

<sup>10</sup> For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost."

- a. <u>Do you get it</u>? When people are known to be BIG sinners, some write them off by saying, "Heaven is closed for them!" In the minds of many, Zacchaeus was in that category, yet Jesus said that even Zacchaeus, though a very unlikely candidate, is a son of Abraham – thus he had the faith of Abraham, the faith which receives God's gift of righteousness!
- b. <u>What about acts of repentance</u>? Oftentimes **money** is where *the rubber meets the road*; sometimes people are willing to attend and serve, *but money is a separate category*.
  - <u>Did Zacchaeus see it that way</u>? By no means! He gave away half of his possessions and promised to pay anyone he had cheated four times that amount!
  - ii. <u>Do we see it that way</u>? Is money in a separate category, or are we willing to ◆show our repentance and ◆honor the Lord by following God's Holy Word?

**Conclusion**: Let us pray: Dear Father in heaven, every good and perfect gift comes from You (James 1:17), so help us to always receive with thanksgiving and honor our Lord Jesus Christ with Bible-agreeing acts of repentance! In Jesus' name, we pray. Amen!
