EPISTLE: Galatians 2:15-21; 3:10-14 NET

¹⁵ Since we were born Jews and not Gentile sinners, ¹⁶ we know that a person cannot be justified [declared righteous] by doing what the Law says, but only by believing in Jesus Christ. So we also believed in Jesus Christ in order to be justified [declared righteous] by faith in Christ and not by the works of the Law, because not one person will be justified [declared righteous] by the works of the Law.

¹⁷ Now if we who are seeking to be justified [declared righteous] in Christ are found to be sinners ourselves, has Christ then become one who encourages sin? Never! ¹⁸ For if I build up again the very things which I have torn down, I make myself a sinner ¹⁹ To be sure, by the Law I died to the Law that I might live to God. I have been crucified with Christ. ²⁰ So, it is no longer I who live, but it is Christ who lives in me. The life I now live in my body I live by believing in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me. ²¹I do not reject the grace of God. For if we could receive righteousness through the Law, then Christ died for nothing.

^{3:10} There is a curse on all who depend on doing what the Law says, because it is written: "Cursed is everyone who does not continue to do everything written in the book of the Law." ¹¹ It is clear that no one is justified [declared righteous] before God by doing what the Law says, because the just [righteous] will live by faith. ¹² But the Law is not based on faith; rather, it says: "The person who does these things will find life in them." ¹³Christ paid the price to free us from the curse of the Law by becoming a curse for us, for it is written: "Cursed is everyone who on a tree [cross]."

¹⁴ He redeemed us so that in Jesus Christ the blessing of Abraham might come to the nations, and that we by believing might receive the promised Spirit.

HOLY GOSPEL: Luke 7:36-8:3 NET

L: The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the seventh chapter.

³⁶ One of the Pharisees invited Jesus to eat with him. Jesus went into the Pharisee's home and reclined at the table.

³⁷ In the town there was a sinful woman. When she found out He was eating at the Pharisee's home, she brought an alabaster jar of perfume ³⁸ and stood behind Him at His feet. She was weeping and began to wet His feet with her tears. Then with the hair of her head she dried His feet, kissed them, and poured perfume on them.

³⁹ The Pharisee who had invited Jesus saw this and said to himself, "If He were a prophet, He would know who is touching Him and what kind of woman she is, for she is a sinner."

⁴⁰ Jesus answered him, "Simon, I have something to say to you." "Say it, Teacher," he said.

⁴¹ "Two men owed a moneylender some money: One owed him five hundred denarii, and the other fifty. ⁴² When they could not pay it back, he was kind enough to cancel the debt for both of them. Now, which of them will love him more?"

⁴³ Simon answered, "I suppose the one who had the bigger debt canceled." "You are right," Jesus told him. ⁴⁴ Then, turning to the woman, He said to Simon, "Do you see this woman? I came into your home, and you gave Me no water for My feet, but she wet My feet with her tears and dried them with her hair. ⁴⁵ You gave Me no kiss, but ever since I came in, she has not stopped kissing My feet. ⁴⁶ You poured no olive oil on My head, but she poured perfume on My feet. ⁴⁷ That is why I tell you that her many sins have been forgiven--for she loved very much. But he who has little forgiven loves little."

⁴⁸ Then He said to her, "Your sins are forgiven." ⁴⁹ His fellow guests began to ask among themselves, "Who is this Person who even forgives sins?"

⁵⁰ Jesus said to the woman, "Your faith saved you. Go in peace!"

^{8:1} After this Jesus traveled from one town and village to another, preaching and telling the Good News of God's Kingdom. The Twelve were with Him, ² and some women who had been healed of evil spirits and diseases: Mary, also called the woman from Magdala (seven demons had gone out of her); ³ Joanna the wife of Chusa, Herod's manager; Susanna; and many other women. They supported Jesus and His disciples with their property.

SERMON: "Dem Bones, Dem Bones, Dem Dry Bones" – Now Hear the Word of the Lord" Ezekiel 37:1-14

¹The LORD laid His hand on me and <u>by His</u> <u>Spirit</u> took me out and put me down in the middle of a valley that was full of bones. ²He led me past them all around: There were a great number lying on the floor of the valley, and they were very dry.

³ "<u>Son of man</u>," He asked me, "can these bones become alive?" "Lord GOD," I answered, "You know."

⁴ "Prophesy about these bones," He told me, "and say to them: Dry bones, listen to what the LORD says. ⁵ The Lord GOD says this to these bones: I will make breath enter into you, and you will live. ⁶ I will put sinews on you, have flesh come on you, cover you with skin, and put breath in you so you will live and 'know I am the LORD'." '

⁷ I prophesied as I was ordered, and as I prophesied, there was a noise and a rustling as the bones came together, one bone to another. ⁸ I saw sinews coming on them, flesh came on them, and skin covered them, but there was no breath in them.

⁹ "Prophesy to the <u>wind</u>," He told me. "Prophesy, <u>son of man</u>, and tell the wind, the Lord GOD says this: Come from the four directions, O wind, and breathe on these slain people so they will live." ¹⁰ So I prophesied as He ordered me, and breath entered into them and they stood on their feet—a very great army.

¹¹ "Son of man," He said to me, "these bones are all the people of Israel. They are saying, 'Our bones are dry, and we have lost all hope. We are completely cut off.' ¹² So prophesy and tell them, the Lord GOD says this: I will open your <u>graves</u> and raise you out of them, O My people, and bring you to the land of Israel. ¹³ Then you will know I am the LORD when I open your graves and raise you, O My people. ¹⁴ I will put <u>My Spirit</u> in you so you will live, and I will settle you in your own land. Then you will know I the LORD said it and I did it, says the LORD."
