God's Own Child, I Gladly Say It

Sunday, October 9 at 8:00 & 10:45 + Monday, October 10 at 7 PM 21st Sunday after Pentecost; 20th Sunday after Trinity – 2016

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: *Being alive* and *being in sin* both began when we were conceived (Psalm 51:5); therefore, *all people need to be saved* (Rom. 3:10), *and only God can do it* (John 14:6; Acts 4:12)! God told us in His Word that He has chosen to work *through baptism* to save us! <u>How</u>? **God the Father** sends **the Spirit** to unite sinners to **His Son**! The Bible says:

- God "saved us...by the washing of regeneration and renewing by the Holy Spirit, whom He poured out upon us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior" (Titus 3:5-6 NAS). So baptism is a primary tool (means) through which God regenerates a person; God takes a person who is <u>dead in</u> <u>sin</u> and makes him <u>alive in Christ</u>!
- "For all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ" (Galatians 3:27 NAS). Try to picture the disgusting filth of sin; then *imagine it being covered with a clean sheet*. That is a picture of baptism; *Jesus, the very Son of God, is the clean sheet that covers our sin!*

<u>Since Jesus lived and died to remove our sins</u>, *it is essential to be in relationship with Him*! If you are, **rejoice**; if you are not, the Spirit is calling you to **repent** – *to be sorry for your sins and return to the wonderful blessings of baptism*!

Today's sermon is different; most sermons are **based directly on the Bible**, but this sermon is **built on a Bible-based hymn**.

After each stanza is preached, *we will sing it together*; as we sing, let us rejoice in the great blessings that belong to us thru Jesus!

1. Stanza 1 (Rom. 6:1-10; 1 Pet. 3:18-22; Tit. 3:4-7; Rom. 8:17; Gal. 4:1)

- a. God's own child, I gladly say it: I am baptized into Christ! // So, having been baptized into Christ, we are clothed, thus covered, with Jesus' sinless life!
- b. He, because I could not pay it, gave my full redemption price. // Since we have all sinned, we all owe a debt that we cannot pay; therefore, we stand in awe and rejoice that Jesus paid our full redemption price! "For Christ also died for sins <u>once for all</u>, <u>the just for the unjust</u>, in order that He might bring us to God" (1 Pet. 3:18 NAS).
- c. Do I need earth's treasures many? I have one worth more than any, that brought me salvation free, lasting to eternity! // Let's be honest: We are each living a short, temporary life; even the things we tend to value like houses and cars are temporary. So let us \$see the great value of Jesus and \$always treasure Him! Sing Stanza 1

2. Stanza 2 (Rom. 6:1-10; 1 Pet. 3:18-22; Tit. 3:4-7; Act. 22:16; Exo. 24:8; Heb. 9:19-21)

- a. <u>Sin</u>, disturb my soul no longer: I am baptized into Christ!
 // What's going on in the life of a Christian? He was dead in sin; now he is alive in Christ; yet sin is still at work to \$tempt him, \$destroy His peace, and \$pull him away from Christ.
- b. I have comfort even stronger: Jesus' cleansing sacrifice. // Sin is powerful to kill, but Jesus' holy precious blood is even more powerful to wash us clean: "...the blood of Jesus... cleanses us from all sin" (1Jo 1:7 NAS).
- c. Should a guilty conscience seize me, since my Baptism did release me, in a dear forgiving flood, sprinkling me with Jesus' blood? // Even those who are continuing in Christ can be overwhelmed with guilt; therefore, God invites us to "draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean [by the blood of Jesus]" (Heb. 10:22 ESV). Sing Stanza 2

3. Stanza 3 (Rom. 6:1-10; Rom. 8:33-39; 2Co. 4:8-10; Isaiah 50:8-9)

- a. <u>Satan</u>, hear this proclamation: I am baptized into Christ! // Lucifer, a great created holy angel, is now Satan, a very powerful evil ✓ angel, ✓ enemy, and ✓ accuser against all who know Jesus. So the Bible says: "woe to you, O earth and sea, for the devil has come down to you in great wrath, because he knows that his time is short" (Rev. 12:12 ESV).
- b. Drop your ugly accusation, I am not so soon enticed. // The devil's scheme is to accuse us to the point of hopelessness, to make us think our sin is greater than Jesus ultimate sacrifice; therefore, we continue to ♦fill our minds with God's truth (Rom. 12:2; Psalm 119:9, 11; 119:105; 119:160) and ♦rest in Jesus' total victory (John 19:30)!
- c. Now that to the font I've traveled, all your might has come unraveled, and, against your tyranny, God, my Lord, unites with me! // The Bible declares: "If God is for us, who can be against us? (Rom. 8:31 ESV). So is He for us? Yes, just look at the cross; then, by God's grace and God's power, let us ever continue in Jesus Christ! Sing Stanza 3
- 4. Stanza 4 (Rom. 6:1-10; Tit. 3:4-7; Col. 2:12; Gen. 18:27; Job 30:19; Job 42:6; Luke 23:43)
 - a. <u>Death</u>, you cannot end my gladness: I am baptized into Christ! // Since people who are †baptized into Christ and †continue in Christ still die, <u>where are the eternal</u> <u>blessings</u>? God wants us to know that *death is a door* through which He "takes us <u>from this valley of sorrow to</u> <u>Himself in heaven</u>" (L.P., 7th Petition Explanation).
 - b. When I die, I leave all sadness, to inherit paradise! // For us who live on earth, we have a sad view of death; but consider God's view of death for those who die in Jesus:
 "...the righteous are taken away to be spared from evil.
 Those who walk uprightly enter into peace; they find rest as they lie in death" (Isaiah 57:1-2 NIV).

c. Though I lie in dust and ashes, faith's assurance brightly flashes: Baptism has the strength divine, to make life immortal mine. // You've died, your dead, and your body is lying in a casket under six feet of dirt; pleasant – NO, but okay – YES! <u>Why</u>? Because Jesus will return (Mt. 24:37-39), raise every person (John 5:28-29), and forever bless all who were baptized into Christ and, finally, died in Christ (Rev. 21:1-4)! Sing Stanza 4

5. Stanza 5 (Rom. 6:1-10; Tit. 3:4-7; Rom. 5:5; Eph. 2:6-7; Luke 13:18; Rom. 8:18)

- a. There is nothing worth comparing, to this lifelong comfort sure! // What is valuable to YOU? Gold, good health, earthly possessions; if you value such things over your baptism into Christ, you and all you have will perish. Jesus said, "For what does it profit a man to gain the whole world, and forfeit his soul?" (Mark 8:36 NAS).
- b. Open-eyed my grave is staring: Even there I'll sleep secure. // <u>Are YOU afraid to die</u>? Is YOUR grave a scary thought? For all who die in Christ, we don't fear the grave, we know the rest will be good, and we know Jesus will wake us up someday!
- c. Though my flesh awaits its raising, still my soul continues praising: I am baptized into Christ; I'm a child of paradise! // Being baptized into Christ, then continuing to know Christ, we are so blessed: Our sins are forgiven, We are members of God's holy family, Our sins are forgiven, We are members of God's holy family, Our sins are follow Jesus as Lord, We rejoice in Jesus as Savior, We follow Jesus as Lord, We know all of God's promises are true, and We are certain that one day we will be with God in paradise! And all God's people said: Amen! Sing Stanza 5
