Jesus Got Answers!

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: God's Word is Truth – important Truth, saving Truth! The Bible says that people "perish because they refused to love the truth" (2 Thess. 2:10 NIV). So let us ⇒dig into God's Word, ⇒hear an important conversation, and ⇒rejoice in Jesus' answers!

1. The Setting: ¹ Now there was a man of the Pharisees named Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews. ² This man came to Jesus by night and said to him, "Rabbi [teacher], we [I and the other rulers] know that you are a teacher come from God, for no one can do these signs [these miracles of divine origin] that you do unless God is with him." // So Nicodemus ✓ was a representative of the other Jewish rulers and ✓ came by night – under the cover of darkness, probably to keep his conversation with Jesus secret from the regular people.

2. You Must Be Born Again:

 a. ³ Jesus answered him, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born again [anew, from above] he cannot [literally, he is not able to] see the kingdom of God." // Everyone has been born physically, but, *to see the kingdom of God*, you must be born <u>spiritually</u> – thus, "born...of God" (John 1:12).

- b. ⁴ Nicodemus said to him, "How can a man be born when he is old? Can he enter a second time into his mother's womb and be born?" // Even though Jesus was talking *spiritually*, Nicodemus was still thinking *physically*.
- c. Then Jesus told Nicodemus the answer to his question: ⁵ Jesus answered, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit [thus, a reference to the water of holy baptism and the Spirit working in conjunction with that water and the Word of God], he cannot enter [into] the kingdom of God." // In other words, as only a woman can give physical birth, so only God can give spiritual birth!
- d. ⁶ "That which is born of the flesh is flesh [physical], and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit [spiritual]. ⁷ Do not marvel that I said to you [Nicodemus, singular], 'You [y'all, plural] <u>must</u> be born again [anew, from above].''' // Since sin brings death, our current physical lives are temporary – we live and we die, then we will be raised physically. <u>But spiritually</u>, +God makes us alive through baptism and +God keeps us alive through His Word (Acts 20:32); even when we die physically, God takes us to paradise where we continue to live spiritually – as we await Jesus' return and the resurrection of our bodies.
- e. ⁸ "The wind blows where it wishes, and you hear its sound, but you do not know where it

comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit." // With <u>the</u> wind we can see what it does – as the trees move; with <u>the Spirit</u> we can see what He does – as people are made new in Christ (2 Cor. 5:17)!

3. Bible Knowledge Is Important:

- a. ⁹ Nicodemus said to him, "How can these things be [come about]?" ¹⁰ Jesus answered him, "Are you the teacher of Israel and yet you do not understand these things?" // Not a good situation for Nicodemus or any Bible teacher.
 Ezra 7:10 has four critical steps for a teacher:
 (1) set his heart [his focus, his mind], (2) study God's Word, (3) practice GW, and (4) teach GW!
- b. ¹¹ "Truly, truly, I say to you, we <u>speak of what</u> we know, and <u>bear witness to what we have</u> <u>seen</u>, but you [y'all, plural] do not receive our testimony." // Even though Jesus <u>demonstrated</u> His connection with God and <u>saw</u> with His own eyes, sadly, Nicodemus and the other rulers did not receive, thus did not believe, such things.
- c. ¹² "If I have told you earthly things and you [y'all, plural] do not believe, how can you [y'all, plural] believe if I tell you [y'all, plural] heavenly things? ¹³ No one has ascended into heaven except he who descended from heaven, the Son of Man." // Since Jesus is the Son of Man, who came down from heaven, we should certainly and completely believe Him even all of God's Holy Word!

4. Believe In Jesus for Eternal Life: ¹⁴ "And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, ¹⁵ that whoever believes in him may have eternal life." // A powerful parallel: In Numbers 21:4-9 the people spoke against God, so He sent serpents to bite the people so that many of them died. Then, when the





people repented, Moses – following the LORD's command – put a bronze serpent on a pole; whoever looked upon it with faith did not physically die but lived. That pointed ahead to Jesus being lifted up on the cross! Now, whoever is sorry

and looks upon Jesus with faith has eternal life!

5. This Is God's Primary Will: ¹⁶ "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son [so God's love moved Him to give His Son; why?], that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. ¹⁷ For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him." // Don't be deceived, Jesus did not come to search out our sins so that He could condemn us; instead, He came to live in our place and suffer for our sins, so that we – through believing in Him – will be rescued from our sins and be members of God's family!

Conclusion: Let us pray: Thank You, dear Father, for spiritual birth, Bible knowledge, and faith in Jesus! Amen!
