John 17:1-11 ESV

We Have All Fallen, But the Father Has Picked Us Up through Jesus!

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: Picture a very elderly person who has fallen, but has no ability to get up; the person requires outside intervention! The same is true for us in a spiritual sense, but we have done more than fall, we have dropped dead! Therefore, God the Father has taken action to pick us up – to make us spiritually alive – through Jesus!

As we return to the gospel of John, Jesus is still in the upper room with His disciples; He has washed their feet, they have eaten the Passover Meal, and Jesus has told them many important things. Now, *in chapter 17*, Jesus will pray an important prayer; then He and His disciples will go to the Garden of Gethsemane.

- 1. Jesus Prayed to His Father: ¹ When Jesus had spoken <u>these words</u>, he lifted up his eyes to heaven, and said, "Father, <u>the hour</u> has come; <u>glorify your Son</u> that the Son may glorify you, ² since you have given him authority over all flesh, to give eternal life to all whom you have given him."
 - a. <u>What words</u>? That phrase could include what Jesus said in chapters 13-16; some bad news in 13, encouragement in 14, regarding their close relationship in 15, and the Holy Spirit in 16.

- b. <u>What hour</u>? Not necessarily a single hour *but a period of time*; a reference to Jesus' death, *which would take place within hours!*
- c. <u>What glory</u>? How was Jesus asking His Father to glorify Him? Lenski put it this way: "The Father is to exalt Jesus by investing his human nature with the unlimited use of the divine attributes in the glory of heaven; ...[so] the Son may make the glorious attributes of the Father shine out in all the world through the work of the Spirit in the gospel and in the church" (1116). Remember, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are working together to bless us *both now and forevermore!*
- The Essence of Eternal Life: ³ "And this is eternal life, that they [may] know you the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent." // Being saved is not on the basis of what we do, <u>but it's who we know</u>! Since our sin destroyed our relationship with God, *He* took action to build a bridge to us in the Person of His Son, our Lord Jesus Christ! Then, in Holy Baptism, He clothed us in Christ and made us holy in His sight! Now, by God's grace, ⇒we know the Father and His Son,
 we have eternal life, and ⇒we are richly blessed!
- 3. We Have Fallen Short, But Not Jesus: ⁴ "I glorified you on earth, having accomplished the work that you gave me to do. ⁵ And now, Father, glorify me in your own presence with the glory that I had with you before the world existed."
 - a. <u>The Bible says that "all have sinned and fall short</u> <u>of the glory of God"</u> (Rom. 3:23): Well, *everyone except Jesus!* Since "the glory of God" is to

perfectly do His will, *we have all fallen short*, but Jesus has been flawless FOR US – *by perfectly accomplishing all that the Father requested!*

- b. Jesus asked the Father to glorify Him by bringing <u>Him to heaven</u>: *He was referring to His ascension*, and, *according to Lenski*, "to be glorified according to his human nature with the glory that was his before the world began" (1127).
- 4. Jesus Identified His Disciples: ⁶ "I have manifested [made known] your name to the people whom you gave me out of the world. Yours they were, and you gave them to me, and they have kept your word. ⁷ Now they know that everything that you have given me is from you. ⁸ For I have given them the words that you gave me, and they have received them and have come to know in truth that I came from you; and they have believed that you sent me."
 - a. <u>The Father gave certain ones to Jesus</u>: The ones whom "he chose… in [Christ] before the foundation of the world" (Eph. 1:4 ESV). Those are the ones who by God's power *keep God's Word*; that means they do not twist it or reject it but *by God's grace* they believe it!
 - b. <u>The disciples were different</u>: They were *not* like others who said, "We believe in God and Moses, *but not in Jesus.*" Instead, they were ones who had their eyes opened *to see the true and close relationship between the Father and the Son!*
- 5. Jesus Prayed for His Disciples: ⁹ "I am praying for them. I am not praying for the world but for those whom you have given me, for they are yours. ¹⁰ All

mine are yours, and yours are mine, and I am glorified in them. ¹¹ And I am no longer in the world, but they are in the world, and I am coming to you. Holy Father, keep them in your name, which you have given me, that they may be one, even as we are one."

- a. <u>Jesus deeply cared about His disciples</u>: They were chosen by the Father and given to Him, so they belonged to both as we belong to both!
- b. Jesus said, "I am glorified" in my disciples: What does that mean? Jesus' disciples honored Him as the Messiah; they believed that He is the Promised One sent by the Father to take away the sins of the world! By God's work in our lives, by His Spirit through Baptism and through His Holy Word, we believe the same!
- c. Jesus would soon die, rise, and ascend, so He asked the Father to keep His disciples in the Father's name that they may be one: Lenski noted that "the world... is full of delusion and spurns [God's] name, [so] the disciples [needed] divine care lest they lose their connection with the saving 'name'" (1136). We also need the same, God's powerful intervention in our lives!

Conclusion: <u>Let us pray</u>: Father in heaven, we are so blessed to know You and Your Son, and have the Spirit living within us; *please powerfully work through Word and Sacrament to keep us in Your name, in Your holy family*. Amen!
