Matthew 10:5a, 21-33 ESV

Important Instructions from Jesus

 Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: What is really important? Not me, not this building, and not even this congregation; instead, these things are really important:
 God – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, ⇒God's Word, ⇒the finished work of Jesus, and ⇒God's work – by the Spirit – through Word and Sacrament to bring us to Christ and keep us in Christ!

In this sermon we are going to hear important instructions that Jesus gave to His twelve disciples (apostles) *just before He sent them out* (⁵ **These twelve Jesus sent out, instructing them...**); some of those instructions we heard last week, now we jump ahead to Matthew 10:21:

- Regarding Persecution: Jesus knew the goal of persecution – to destroy the mission of His disciples; therefore, He told them What to expect, How to proceed, and How to remain encouraged!
 - a. ²¹ "Brother will deliver brother over to death, and the father his child, and children will rise against parents and have them put to death,
 ²² and you will be hated by all for my name's sake. But the one who endures to the end will be saved." // We tend to trust those who are closest to us; for Jesus, the closest was John who cared for Jesus' mother; then, Peter, James,

and John – the inner circle; then, the twelve – one of which betrayed Jesus! With Jesus' words, He described close blood relationships: *International States and International States and International States and International States and International States and St*

- ²³ "When they persecute you in one town b. [literally, in this city], flee to the next [literally, to another, a different one], for truly, I say to you, you will not have gone through all the towns [literally, cities] of Israel before the Son of Man **comes.**" // Jesus just communicated two things: (1) It's okay to flee! If we are killed, then we are silenced; therefore, it's okay to flee to another place in order to keep proclaiming the good news that Christ has come and heaven is open through Him! (2) You have time, so get going, but, before you are done, I will come! In other words, I will bring judgment upon Jerusalem and the nation; Jesus did so, starting in AD 66, which led to the areat destruction in AD 70.
- 2. Regarding Disciples: Disciples are people who learn from Jesus, so let us absorb all of His teachings!
 - a. ²⁴ "A disciple is not above his teacher, nor a servant above his master. ²⁵ It is enough for the disciple to be like his teacher, and the servant like his master." // Since Jesus is THE CHRIST, let us, as faithful learners, grow more and more to

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become *like Him* in what we know, what we believe, what we say, and how we show love to God and others!

- b. "If they have called the master of the house Beelzebul, how much more will they malign those of his household." // Beelzebul in the OT means "Baal is prince" (2 Kings 1:2, TLSB note). In the NT Jesus' opponents called Him that name to associate Him with Satan. Since Jesus was so mistreated, we should expect even more as ones who are saved through Jesus' finished work!
- Regarding Confession: Confession is to say what we believe! Since fear can silence us, Jesus addressed it!
 - ²⁶ "So have no fear of them [of those who call you а. Beelzebul], for nothing is covered that will not be revealed, or hidden that will not be known. ²⁷ What I tell you in the dark, say in the light, and what you hear whispered [literally, in the ear], proclaim on the housetops. ²⁸ And do not fear those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul. Rather fear him who can destroy both soul and **body in hell** [a place for the punishment of the wicked]." // None of us want to be \$called names, harmed physically, or killed; since fear of such things tries to quiet us, Jesus told us to "have no fear." Jesus also talked of two fears: (1) people destroying what is temporary and (2) God destroying what is eternal. Lenski put it this way: "To lose the body is to lose little, to lose the soul is to lose all" (410).

- i. ²⁹ "Are not two sparrows sold for a penny? And not one of them will fall to the ground apart from your Father." // Though sparrows seem unimportant, God knows them; even more, God knows us!
- ii. ³⁰ "But even the hairs of your head are all numbered [literally, all having been numbered]." // God not only knows how many, but has given each one a number; certainly He deeply cares about us!
- iii. ³¹ "Fear not, therefore; you are of more value than many sparrows." // Sparrows are of value to God; we, *His holy children in Christ*, are much more valuable!
- b. ³² "So everyone who acknowledges [literally, confesses, professes] me before men, I also will acknowledge [confess, profess] before my Father who is in heaven, ³³ but whoever denies me before men, I also will deny before my Father who is in heaven." // To confess "before men" is to publicly associate ourselves with the Christ regarding ✓ what we say and ✓ what we do! Since we are eternally blessed through Jesus' \$living, \$suffering, and \$dying, let us fearlessly confess Him before others!

Conclusion: Let us pray: Dear Holy Spirit, keep *filling us,
 causing us to rejoice in Jesus, and *moving us to confess
 Him in word and deed! In Jesus' name, we pray!

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
