### What Did Jesus Do to Redeem Us?

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: In the *NEW version* of Luther's Small Catechism, we focus today on the Apostles' Creed, the second article, part 2; **part 1** addressed **who He is**; **part 2** addresses **what He did**.

Going to page 176, we are focusing on this part of the explanation: "...who has redeemed me, a lost and condemned person, purchased and won me from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil; not with gold or silver, but with His holy, precious blood and with His innocent suffering and death..." Today's section includes 14 questions: 162-175

- 162. What are we saying when we confess that Jesus has <u>redeemed</u> us? // Think about someone being kidnapped with a ransom being demanded; when we were all being held captive, Jesus paid our ransom!
- 163. Why did we need to be redeemed? What was our situation?
  - a. The entire human race lived under the tyranny of sin, death, and the devil. // Before God saved us:
    Sin characterized our lives, \*death made us fearful, and \*the devil controlled us.
  - b. The entire human race stood under the judgment of God. // As the Bible says, we "were by nature children of wrath" (Eph. 2:3), thus under God's guilty verdict and deserving His punishment!

164. How did we come to be lost and condemned? // We inherited sin from our parents, so, *from conception*, we were *in sin*, *spiritually blind*, and *spiritually dead*.

<u>A statement to think about</u>: "Read Genesis 3. Note how **doubt** about God's Word leads to the **denial** of God's Word, which leads to **disbelief**, which leads to **disobedience**, which results in **death**" (178).

165. Why did God send His Son to rescue us? // He loved us! Love sees the need; then acts to supply the need! Since we were helpless, God took action through Jesus!

#### 166. How did Jesus rescue me from sin?

- a. By His death on the cross, He paid the entire penalty of my sin and guilt. // God the Father put our sins on Jesus; *He became sin for us and for all!*
- b. By His death on the cross, He fully endured and appeased the wrath of God toward all people, thereby reconciling us to God. // Since sin requires punishment, *Jesus endured our punishment*; then He laid down His life!
- c. By His death on the cross, He destroyed the power of sin to enslave me. // Jesus' death sealed His victory; now, *since we are united to Him in baptism*, sin should no longer control us!
- 167. How did Jesus rescue me from the devil? // He the God-Man – became our perfect substitute; first with His sinless life – He was actively obedient to the Father; then, second with His suffering and death – He was passively obedient as He received our sins and our punishment!
- 168. **How did Jesus rescue me from death?** // Since sin brings death, Jesus had to remove sin; *He did that through His living, suffering, and dying for us!*
- 169. What does the Bible teach about Jesus' resurrection? Why is it so comforting to us?

- a. He is the Son of God. // How do we know? He said He would rise; *then He did*!
- b. His teaching is true. // Sin, forgiveness, heaven; hard to believe, *but proven by His resurrection*!
- c. The Father has accepted Christ's sacrifice for the reconciliation of the world. // How do we know? *He raised Him from the dead!*
- d. All who believe in Christ will rise to eternal life. // The Bible tells us the order: "Christ the firstfruits, then at His coming those who belong to Christ" (1 Corinthians 15:23).
- 170. Why was Jesus' divine majesty not always evident during His earthly life? // From His birth to His death, He usually functioned in ordinary ways because He limited the use of His divine powers! We call that His state of humiliation.

## 171. What does this state of humiliation mean for our understanding of Jesus' life? Jesus...

- a. ...was born in humble circumstances. // With animals; *then laid in an animal feeding crib*.
- b. ...chose not to know everything. // For example, *He didn't know when He would return*.
- c. ...experienced sadness and loss. // When Lazarus died, and others were very sad, *Jesus wept*.
- d. ...faced human dilemmas and temptations. // Not wanting to suffer the agony of the cross, yet wanting to do the will of His Father.
- e. ...suffered the agony of death and hell. // He endured excruciating pain and was forsaken by God, *all because of our sins!*
- f. ...was so poor that He was buried in a borrowed tomb. // Jesus became poor, so that we could become eternally rich in Him!

- 172. What comfort does the state of humiliation bring to us? // Jesus has been there, so He understands us!
- 173. When does Jesus, as our Brother, manifest the divine majesty that is His as the Son of God?
  - a. ...with miracles and especially at the transfiguration.
     // Others also did miracles, but only Jesus shone as bright as the sun!
  - b. In His state of exaltation, including ... His ... descent into hell, His resurrection..., His ascension..., His present reign..., and His future return... // Ponder those things; so amazing, so powerful, so wonderful!

# 174. What does the state of exaltation mean for our understanding of who Jesus is and what He has done?

- a. Jesus descended into hell and declared victory over Satan for us. // *He is truly the winner!*
- b. Jesus rose triumphantly over death and the grave for us. // So death is truly defeated!
- c. Jesus ascended to the right hand of God and now rules for our benefit. // Even though evil seems to reign, Jesus is almighty and ruling!
- d. Jesus will return in glory as judge on the Last Day and bring us into His new creation. // The One who lived and died for us will find us innocent when He comes because, by God's grace, we know Him!

# 175. What comfort does the state of exaltation bring us? // Jesus is ruling for the benefit of believers!

Conclusion: Now, ♦more aware of our need for Jesus and
♦knowing what He has done for us, let us ✓ greatly rejoice in our
Savior and ✓ tell others that Jesus is the reason for the season!
