LORD'S SUPPER PREPARATION:

Self-Examination Questions:

- 1. Have I been baptized into Christ? "...all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ" (Galatians 3:27).
- 2. Am I sorry for my sins? "Godly sorrow brings repentance that leads to salvation" (2 Cor. 7:10).
- Do I believe in Jesus as my Savior?
 "...whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life" (John 3:16).
- Do I desire to follow God's Word? "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light for my path" (Psalm 119:105).
- 5. Do I believe I will receive bread and Body, wine and Blood, for the forgiveness of my sins? "Is not the cup of thanksgiving for which we give thanks a participation in the blood of Christ? And is not the bread that we break a participation in the body of Christ? (1 Cor. 10:16).

Who Can Receive Today? Those who answered "yes" to the five questions noted above. For others who want to receive, talk to the pastor.

Confession and Absolution

↑ Years ago – before each Divine Service – Lutherans practiced private confession, but most today practice corporate (pre-service) confession.

- L: In the name of the Father and of the **+** Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Amen.
- L: We are gathered on a day of great joy to remember our Savior's birth, yet we also remember why the Son of God came into the world: *to live without sin—for us, *to be punished—for us, and *to lay down His life—for us; so let us confess our sins.
- A: Almighty God, our heavenly Father: *Your love for us is so great* and yet, all too often, our response to You is so little.

You have laid out a wonderful plan for us in Your Word and yet, all too often, we have gone our own way.

We know we do not deserve Your forgiveness, yet we ask You to grant that precious gift to us, on the basis of **Jesus'* finished work and ***the faith You have given to us by which we trust in Him.

- L: On the basis of your confession and on behalf of my Lord Jesus Christ, I announce to you God's forgiveness, in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Amen.

The Christ Is the Winner!

OLD TESTAMENT: Isaiah 52:7-10 ESV

L: Try to imagine this situation: Your army is at war, while you are back at home anxiously awaiting news of <u>victory **or** defeat</u>

- of <u>celebration or bondage</u>; then a messenger arrives with good news!

⁷ How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of him who brings good news, who publishes peace, who brings good news of happiness, who publishes salvation, who says to Zion, "Your God reigns."

⁸ The voice of your watchmen-- they lift up their voice; together they sing for joy; for eye to eye they see the return of the LORD to Zion.

⁹ Break forth together into singing, you waste places of Jerusalem, for the LORD has

comforted his people; he has redeemed Jerusalem.

¹⁰ The LORD has bared his holy arm before the eyes of all the nations, and all the ends of the earth shall see the salvation of our God.

L: The Word of the LORD.

C: Thanks be to God!

L: In the OT the Son of God – as the Angel of the LORD – kept rescuing the nation of Israel so that, in the fullness of time, He could be born into that nation in order to win the ultimate victory over sin, death, and the devil. Jesus' victory is the very best news of all; now, by God's grace, let us believe it, receive it, and celebrate our Savior – the Christ of Christmas!

PSALM 2 ESV:

L: As nations opposed the LORD-supported David in vain, so all who opposed the Christ of Christmas did so in vain!

The Nations Oppose the Lord

- L: Why do the nations rage
- C: and the peoples plot in vain?
- L: The kings of the earth set themselves, and the rulers take counsel together,

- C: against the LORD and against his anointed, saying,
- L: "Let us burst their bonds apart
- C: and cast away their cords from us."

The Lord Establishes His King

- L: He who sits in the heavens laughs;
- **C:** the Lord holds them in derision.
- L: Then he will speak to them in his wrath,
- C: and terrify them in his fury, saying,
- L: "As for me, I have set my King
- C: on Zion, my holy hill."

The Son's Rule

- L: I will tell of the decree:
- C: The LORD said to me, "You are my Son; today I have begotten you.
- L: Ask of me, and I will make the nations your heritage,
- **C:** and the ends of the earth your possession.
- L: You shall break them with a rod of iron
- C: and dash them in pieces like a potter's vessel."

<u>A Warning</u>

- L: Now therefore, O kings, be wise;
- **C:** be warned, O rulers of the earth.
- L: Serve the LORD with fear,
- **C:** and rejoice with trembling.
- L: Kiss the Son, lest he be angry, and you perish in the way, for his wrath is quickly kindled.
- C: Blessèd are all who take refuge in him.
- A: Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit; as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be forever. Amen.

EPISTLE: Hebrews 1:1-6 ESV

L: Notice in this reading some of the many amazing things that are true of the Christ of Christmas!

¹ Long ago, at many times and in many ways, God spoke to our fathers by the prophets, ² but in these last days he has <u>spoken to us by</u> <u>his Son</u>, whom he appointed <u>the heir of all</u> <u>things</u>, through whom also he <u>created the</u> world. ³ He is <u>the radiance of the glory of God</u> and <u>the exact imprint of his nature</u>, and he <u>upholds the universe</u> by the word of his power. After <u>making purification for sins</u>, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high, ⁴ having become as much <u>superior to angels</u> as the name he has inherited is more excellent than theirs.

⁵ For to which of the angels did God ever say, "You are my Son, today I have begotten you"? Or again, "I will be to him a father, and he shall be to me a son"? ⁶ And again, when he brings the firstborn into the world, he says, "Let all God's angels worship him."

L: The Word of the LORD.

C: Thanks be to God!

L: God created through His Son, and then He spoke through His Son; furthermore, it is through God the Son that we know much about God the Father.

Since we have all sinned, we are so blessed to be purified from our sins through the Christ, God's Holy Son – the One worshiped by angels, and the One who is worthy of our full trust and devotion!

↑ HOLY GOSPEL: John 1:1-14 ESV

- L: The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the first chapter.
- C: Glory to You, O LORD.
- L: Notice how the Son of God was with the Father in the beginning; then, in time, He came into the world to be our life and our light!

¹ In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ² He was in the beginning with God. ³ All things were made through him, and without him was not any thing made that was made. ⁴ In him was life, and the life was the light of men. ⁵ The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it. ⁶ There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. ⁷ He came as a witness, to bear witness about the light, that all might believe through him. ⁸ He was not the light, but came to bear witness about the light.

⁹ The true light, which gives light to everyone, was coming into the world. ¹⁰ He was in the world, and the world was made through him, yet the world did not know him. ¹¹ He came to his own, and his own people did not receive him. ¹² But to all who did receive him, who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God, ¹³ who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God. ¹⁴ And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth.

- L: The Gospel of the Lord.
- C: Praise to You, O Christ. ♥
- L: The very Son of God came for everyone, but most did not receive Him; however, for all who did receive Him then **and** for all who receive Him now, they are the very children of God – thus forgiven in God's sight and gifted with eternal life! Therefore, we have every reason to celebrate a Christ-centered Christmas, live with peace and joy, and tell others about the open path to paradise!
