God Did What???

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: You have heard of stories like this: A man murders a woman; then the woman's family says to him, "We forgive you!" Such things are extraordinary! Now – knowing full well that **we** have sinned and deserve nothing good, let us ♦marvel at and ♦be thankful for God's amazing *plan* and *work* as recorded in Ephesians chapter 1.

- GOD Chose Us: ³ Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, ⁴ ...as <u>he [God the Father]</u> chose us in <u>him [His Son]</u> before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and blameless before him.
 - a. When the Holy Spirit opened our spiritual eyes to see *where we were <u>condemned</u>*, and, now, *where we are in Christ <u>saved</u>*, then we must agree with Paul that the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ is most worthy of our praise!
 - b. Even before creation, God knew Adam and Eve would fall, we would inherit their nature to sin, and we would commit our own sins; therefore, God chose us in Christ to be holy in His sight!

- GOD Adopted Us: In love ⁵ <u>he</u> [God the Father] predestined us for adoption to himself as sons through Jesus Christ, according to the purpose [good pleasure] of his will, ⁶ to the praise of his glorious grace, with which he has <u>blessed</u> [highly favored] us in the Beloved.
 - a. Imagine seeing a very sad video of an orphaned child in a third-world country. Then deciding out of pure love to do whatever was necessary regarding time, money, and sacrifice to adopt that child into your family! You decided to do it, then you did it; that is similar to predestination.
 - b. For you and me when God knew we were
 dead in our sins, separated from Him, and
 thoroughly unworthy to be members of His family, THAT is when God decided to do
 whatever was necessary to make us His own; then He did it through our Lord Jesus Christ!
- 3. GOD Bought Us Back: ⁷ In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace, ⁸ which he lavished upon us, in all wisdom and insight ⁹ making known to us the mystery of his will, according to his purpose [good pleasure], which he set forth in Christ ¹⁰ as a plan for the fullness of time, to unite all things in him, things in heaven and things on earth.
 - a. The average cost to adopt a child from Ethiopia is \$30,000. The cost for God to adopt us into His family is the shed blood of His only begotten Son!
 But why? To be with God we must be holy;

therefore, God demonstrated *the great depth of His love for us* by giving His Son to be our substitute! <u>First</u>, by living without sin; <u>second</u>, by receiving our sins and our eternal punishment!

- b. When we think about God redeeming us thus, buying us back, making us His very own it's not because of a quality in us; instead, it's because of the riches of God's grace God's love for us!
 When it comes to our salvation, we contributed only one thing: Our sin, our need to be saved.
- c. God has not only purchased us to be His own in Christ, but He has also made that known to us.
 So, yes, we have sin, but we also have God's gifts of forgiveness and peace through Jesus!
- d. As an Ethiopian orphan may be happy to know he has been adopted, *he will be much happier when he is finally settled in his new home*. In a similar way, we are thrilled to be God's children, *but we also long to finally be in His presence!*
- 4. Through Jesus We Have an Inheritance: ¹¹ In him we have obtained an inheritance, having been predestined according to the purpose of him who works all things according to the counsel of his will, ¹² so that we who were the first to hope in Christ might be to the praise of his glory.
 - a. Have you ever inherited something? If so, it was probably from a family member or a very dear friend – someone with whom you were in a close relationship! Also, you may have heard about your inheritance but had to wait to receive it.

- b. Since God has worked by the Spirit through Baptism to clothe us in Christ, we ♦know we have an eternal inheritance and ♦look forward to actually receiving it when Jesus returns!
- 5. The Holy Spirit Is the Guarantee of Our Inheritance: ¹³ In him you also, when you heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and believed in him, were sealed with the promised Holy Spirit, ¹⁴ who is the guarantee of our inheritance until we acquire possession of it, to the praise of his glory.
 - a. For people who *are baptized into Christ* or *hear God's Word of truth and believe*, they are sealed or marked with the Holy Spirit. That is God's way of identifying who belongs to Him!
 - b. Also, *regarding the Holy Spirit*, He is God's *guarantee* or *promise* that we will eventually receive His promised inheritance.
 - c. The Holy Spirit is also with us to ♦help us understand the Bible, ♦convict us of our sins,
 ♦assure us of God's forgiveness through Jesus,
 ♦power us to tell others about Jesus, and ♦keep us trusting in Jesus to the very end of our lives!

We are SO BLESSED now and forever!
