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## O Gracious Lord, with Love Draw Near

Sunday at 8:00 & 10:45 | Monday at 7 PM The Baptism of Our Lord – 2019

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: We have this major problem ➡ God is holy, but we are not! Since we have all sinned, we have separated ourselves from God and are helpless to restore the broken relationship! <u>Nevertheless</u>, <u>God still loves us</u>! Therefore, He took action through His Son to remove all sins; then, He took further action through Holy Baptism to personally give us the benefits of Jesus' work! Today, on this Sunday we call <u>The Baptism of Our Lord</u>, we remember these unique realities of Jesus' baptism:

- ✓ He had no sin, so, through His baptism, He willingly identified Himself with our sins!
- ✓ Jesus is the Christ the anointed one; He was anointed with the Holy Spirit right after His baptism!
- ✓ God is ONE, and yet three Persons; when Jesus God the Son – was baptized, God the Holy Spirit came down upon Him, and God the Father spoke from heaven!

When I think about my baptism, I remember that *I AM* baptized! In other words, by God's grace, I am still trusting in Jesus as my Savior, I am still clothed in the sinless life of Christ, and I am still in possession of God's gift of eternal life! I encourage YOU to believe and say all of the same!

Our focus today is on a hymn in the baptism section of our hymnal; it's called: *O Gracious Lord, with Love Draw Near*.

The words were written by Rev. Stephen P. Starke<sup>1</sup> for people being confirmed; so, as you hear the words, *think about a pastor praying for God's blessing upon your life in Christ!* 

- Let us pray: O gracious Lord, with love draw near To these, Your children gathered here; The Spirit's gift in them renew: The gift of faith that clings to You.
  - a. <u>With love draw near</u>: Because God loves us, *He supplies all that we need* (Philippians 4:19)!
  - b. <u>Children</u>: God is our Father because He made us, but especially because He has brought us back into His family through Jesus (Matthew 6:9-13)!
  - c. <u>Faith</u>: That is *God's gift to us* by which we trust in Jesus (1 Corinthians 1:30a). Since our faith is so important, let us feed our faith – *by studying the Bible* (Psalm 1:1-3) and exercise our faith – *by living the Bible* (James 1:22)!
- Let us pray: Sustain the work You have begun In these united to Your Son, For in that pure baptismal flood They have been cleansed by Jesus' blood.
  - a. <u>The work God has begun</u>: When we were dead in our sins, *God made us alive in Christ* (Ephesians 2:4-5), and He is continuing to work in our lives by *His Spirit through His Word* (Philippians 1:6)!
  - b. <u>Cleansed by Jesus' blood</u>: Jesus did the work on Good Friday (John 19:30; 1 John 1:7); then God gave us the benefits of that work *through baptism* (Titus 3:5) and *through the Bible* (1 Peter 1:23)!

- 3. Let us pray: Deliver them from ev'ry wile [scam], From all that would their hearts beguile [entice], From worldly ways and Satan's lies, That they may not Your Word despise.
  - a. <u>Deliver them</u>: We live in a world full of schemes and scams, which seek to draw us into sin and away from Jesus (1 Corinthians 15:33); so we stand in constant need of spiritual discernment and spiritual strength (Matthew 26:41)!
  - b. <u>The Word</u>: As the devil tempted Adam and Eve to doubt what God said, so he is still using that method today (1 Peter 5:8)! We break the third commandment when we despise preaching and God's Word; in other words, when we choose other things OVER preaching and God's Word (Luther's Small Catechism, Third Commandment Explanation)!
- 4. Let us pray: Lord, keep them firm in their intent To You, Your Word and Sacrament.

## O make them bold, their faith to share And make them strong, each cross to bear.

- a. <u>Word and Sacrament</u>: As we look into a mirror to check our physical appearance, *so we are called to look into God's Word to check our spiritual appearance* (James 1:23-25); we do that here each week through Word and Sacrament!
- <u>Share and Bear</u>: When we truly know the punishment we deserve, and the joy of forgiveness in Christ; *then we will be equipped to tell others* (1 Peter 3:15)! As we do so, some will rejoice *but others will persecute us* (2 Timothy 3:12)!

- Let us pray: O Father, grant that by Your grace They may Your will each day embrace; With fruits of faith their lives now bless, Till they at death Your name confess.
  - a. <u>God's will</u>: It's laid out in His Word, so may the Bible be a lamp to our feet and a light to our path (Psalm 119:105)!
  - b. <u>Confessing</u>: It's good that *today* we are confessing Jesus as Lord (Matthew 10:32-33); now, by God's powerful and ongoing work in our lives, may we continue confessing Him in word and deed all the way to the end (Matthew 10:22)!
- Let us pray: Then robed in white before Your throne, Your holy saints, by You foreknown— Predestined, called, and justified, Shall, crowned in light, be glorified.
  - a. <u>Foreknown</u>: God is so awesome that He chose us *before creation* to be His own; then, *in time*, He made us His own *in Christ* (Ephesians 1:3-6)!
  - <u>Glorified</u>: That is coming for all who *die in Christ!* Another word for "glorified" is "overvalued"; think about that, we are poor sinners and yet God values us in Christ to be rich saints – whom He will greatly love forevermore (Romans 8:30)!

**This Week's Challenge:** Look up, think about, and pray about the 22 Scripture references included in this sermon!

**Let Us Pray**: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, *cause us to rejoice in Your goodness*, and *be ever-near us* – until we are finally in Your most blessed presence forevermore! *In Jesus' name*!

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
