Series Theme: Confession and Absolution – Part 2 of 6

"Divine Service 3"

Based on Various Passages

3rd Wednesday of Lent – 2011 March 23 → 11:00 & 7:00

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ, we return again to the topic of confession and absolution:

- To confess our sins is to <u>SAY</u> they are true, be <u>SORRY</u> that we have done them, and desire to <u>STOP</u> them.
- Absolution is God's gift of forgiveness!

Here at Bethlehem, we try to have both *variety* and *consistency* in our Divine Services; therefore, we use at least five different forms of confession and absolution – *some* on a regular basis, *others* once in a while.

Today, we focus on the words of confession and absolution from Divine Service 3 in the Lutheran Service Book. <u>Can</u> <u>anyone identify the Sunday of each month on which we</u> <u>typically follow Divine Service 3</u>? Your choices are: first, second, third, fourth, or fifth.

Here at Bethlehem we use the Divine Service 3 confession and absolution in two ways: *Sometimes using the standard words from the hymnal, *other times putting the standard words into the form of questions and answers. The focus of this sermon will be on the **questions** and **answers**.

 Pre-Confession Statements: These preliminary statements – when we actually THINK about what we are saying – are intended to encourage us to confess:

- a. (Based on Hebrews 10:22) Beloved in the Lord! Let us draw near with a true heart and confess our sins unto God, our Father, beseeching (begging) Him in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to grant us forgiveness. So how does the Lord look upon us? We are beloved or much-loved by Him – just look at a crucifix! Since we are so loved by Him, it should be easy to draw close to Him – with complete honesty – and confess to Him, our very Father, begging Him to forgive us for Jesus' sake!
- b. (Psalm 124:8) Our help is in the name of the Lord.
 Who made heaven and earth. Think about it; asking for forgiveness to be washed clean from every sin is a HUGE request, but our Father is able to answer because He made heaven and earth!
- c. (Psalm 32:5) I said, I will confess my transgressions (sins) unto the Lord. And You forgave the iniquity (wickedness) of my sin. As David confessed and was forgiven, so we are encouraged to do the same!

2. Confession: We <u>say</u>, we are <u>sorry</u>, and we desire to <u>stop</u>!

- a. To whom do you confess your sins? To the almighty
 God, my merciful Father. He is almighty able to
 crush us, but also our merciful Father who loves us!
- b. How do you look upon yourself? I am a poor miserable sinner. Yes, we are! But Jesus said: NAU Mt. 5:3 "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." By the Spirit working through the Word, we know •we are sinners and •we are helpless to save ourselves. Therefore, we

are *beggarly poor*, thus *fully dependant* on God for ♥ forgiveness, ♥ spiritual life, ♥ eternal salvation!

- a. What sins do you confess? I confess all my sins and iniquities. Since → we cannot hide anything from God AND → we want His forgiveness for all of our sins, we are moved to confess ◆all the times when we have fallen short of His will AND ◆all the wickedness in our hearts and minds!
- b. What have you justly deserved? I have justly deserved temporal death and eternal punishment. The Almighty God said: Don't eat from that tree or "you will surely die!" (Genesis 2:17 NAU) He also said: NAU Leviticus 19:2 "You shall be holy, for I the LORD your God am holy." So they ate and we inherited their sin; God commanded but we have all fallen far short of being holy; therefore, we truly deserve ©physical death and ©punishment forevermore!
- c. What is your attitude toward your sins? I am heartily sorry for them and sincerely repent of them. Heartily sorry; that means to be sorry with our entire being! Sincerely repent; that includes a *true desire to stop and *true faith in Jesus for forgiveness!
- d. What is the basis of your request? The boundless mercy of my Heavenly Father and the holy, innocent, bitter sufferings and death of His beloved Son, Jesus Christ. Notice God's mercy; it is boundless without any boundaries! We tend to think: Some sins are forgivable, others are not! But God's forgiveness based on Jesus' finished work is sufficient to remove every sin: big, small, in between!

- e. What do you request from your merciful Father? Dear Father, be gracious and merciful to me, a poor, sinful being. In other words, we say: Love me – even though I am UNDESERVING and hold back Your punishment – even though I AM DESERVING!
- 3. Absolution: God's gift of forgiveness!
 - a. Upon this your confession Thus based on what you have just said.
 - b. I, by virtue of my office, as a called and ordained servant of the Word – Thus I speak as a Christian pastor of this congregation.
 - c. I announce the grace of God unto all of you Thus it is my privilege to announce that – though you are sinners deserving the worst – you have God's undeserved love in Jesus!
 - d. In the stead and by the command of my Lord Jesus Christ – Thus I stand here in Jesus' place and speak according to His command.
 - e. I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit – Jesus said: NAU John 20:23 "If you forgive the sins of any, their sins have been forgiven them..."

Introduction: Now, having a better understanding of the Divine Service 3 Confession and Absolution, let us **†** confess our sins and **†**be certain of God's forgiveness! Amen!
