Dear Friends in Christ: This service will not include a normal sermon, *but some additional information about each reading*.

Whenever we hear or read the Bible, let us keep asking two key questions: (1) <u>What does</u> <u>this mean</u>? (2) <u>How does this apply to me</u>? *May God bless our understanding and applying!*

OLD TESTAMENT: Isaiah 35:1-10 ESV See Below / Pew Bible Page 1111 / Own Bible

This is a brief summary of what Dr. Luther wrote about the BOOK of Isaiah: "...you must divide the prophet Isaiah into three parts.

In the first part, like the other prophets, he handles two things. <u>First</u> he preaches a good deal to his people and rebukes their many sins... [He also] keeps the people in check with threats of punishment and promises of good. <u>Second</u> he prepares... them to expect the coming kingdom of Christ, of which he prophesies more clearly and in more ways than any other prophet.

In the second part Isaiah has to do especially with the empire of Assyria and the Emperor Sennacherib.... [BTW: Assyria was the world power at that time, and defeated the northern kingdom of Israel during the lifetime of Isaiah.]

In the third part Isaiah has to do with the empire at Babylon. Here he prophesies of the Babylonian captivity, whereby the people were

to be punished and Jerusalem destroyed by the emperor at Babylon" (TLSB).

What does today's OT reading mean? Isaiah wrote about the first coming of the Messiah – when He would confirm His identify with many miracles, and remove the sins of the world. Today's reading is also pointing ahead to Jesus' second coming – when those who trust in Him will experience the FULLNESS of His victory over sin, death, and the devil.

How do those things apply to us? Let us *be sure that Jesus IS the Messiah, *trust in Him alone for heaven, *tell others the good news about Jesus, and *look forward to the much greater blessings which are yet to come!

¹The wilderness and the dry land shall be glad; the desert shall rejoice and blossom like the crocus; ² it shall blossom abundantly and rejoice with joy and singing. The glory of Lebanon shall be given to it, the majesty of Carmel and Sharon. They shall see the glory of the LORD, the majesty of our God.

³ Strengthen the weak hands, and make firm the feeble knees [stop being afraid].

⁴ Say to those who have an anxious heart, "Be strong; fear not! Behold, your God will come with vengeance, with the recompense of God. He will come and save you."

⁵ Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, and the ears of the deaf unstopped; ⁶ then shall the lame man leap like a deer, and the tongue of the mute sing for joy. For waters break forth in the wilderness, and streams in the desert; ⁷ the burning sand shall become a pool, and the thirsty ground springs of water; in the haunt of jackals, where they lie down, the grass shall become reeds and rushes.

⁸ And a highway shall be there, and it shall be called the Way of Holiness; the unclean shall not pass over it. It shall belong to those who walk on the way; even if they are fools *[immature in the Scriptures]*, they shall not go astray. ⁹ No lion shall be there, nor shall any ravenous beast come up on it; they shall not be found there, but the redeemed shall walk there.

¹⁰ And the ransomed of the LORD shall return and come to Zion with singing; everlasting joy shall be upon their heads; they shall obtain gladness and joy, and sorrow and sighing shall flee away.

<u>What does today's psalm mean</u>? It instructs us to NOT trust in any man, because he is limited and will die; *then we are called to trust in the LORD who is unlimited and able to bless us now and always*! <u>Apply by doing such things</u>!

EPISTLE: James 5:7-11 ESV

See Below / Pew Bible Page 1885 / Own Bible

In the first part of James chapter 5, James condemned the wealthy – *people like us* – for living as if this life is all there is and Christ will not return. *Are we living in those ways too?*

<u>What does today's epistle reading mean</u>? James is calling us to be patient, suffer long, and not give up no matter what – BECAUSE *Jesus' coming is near, *Jesus could return at any moment, and *the Lord is compassionate caring about us, and merciful—holding back from us the punishment our sins deserve.

How do those things apply to us? Knowing the Lord *is* aware of our circumstances, *idoes* care about us, and *ideal* come at the right time to take us home, let us keep *itrusting* in Him, *ibenefitting* from the Bible every day, and *ideal* waiting patiently for the FULLNESS of eternal life!

⁷ Be patient, therefore, brothers, until the coming of the Lord. See how the farmer waits for the precious fruit of the earth, being patient about it, until it receives the early and the late rains. ⁸ You also, be patient. Establish your hearts, for the coming of the Lord is at hand. ⁹ Do not grumble against one another, brothers, so that you may not be judged; behold, the

Judge is standing at the door. ¹⁰ As an example of suffering and patience, brothers, take the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord.

¹¹ Behold, we consider those blessed who remained steadfast. You have heard of the steadfastness of Job, and you have seen the purpose of the Lord, how the Lord is compassionate and merciful.

HOLY GOSPEL: Matthew 11:2-15 ESV See Below / Pew Bible Page 1512 / Own Bible Last week we focused on John the Baptizer preparing the way for Jesus *by calling the people to repent [be sorry and trust in Jesus]*. In today's gospel reading, *Jesus has begun his ministry and John has been locked up in prison*.

<u>What does today's GO reading mean</u>? In the <u>first part</u>, John sent his disciples to Jesus to *make sure He is the Promised Savior*. As I read, take note that Jesus did not answer by saying "Yes," but by telling of His many miracles.

Jesus also spoke a word of encouragement: "Blessed is he who does not fall away on account of me" (23). <u>Apply</u>: When our lives become difficult, *even very difficult – like prison*, because of our connection to Jesus, He is saying to us, *don't fall away*, *don't give up*, and, in time, *you will be blessed forever and ever!*

Messengers from John the Baptizer:

² Now when John heard in prison about the deeds of the Christ, he sent word by his disciples ³ and said to him, "Are you the one who is to come, or shall we look for another?" ⁴ And Jesus answered them, "Go and tell John what you hear and see: ⁵ the blind receive their sight and the lame walk, lepers are cleansed and the deaf hear, and the dead are raised up, and the poor have good news preached to them. ⁶ And blessed is the one who is not offended by me."

In the <u>second</u> part of the reading, Jesus spoke to the crowd about John:

•John was not like a reed blowing this way, and then that way by the wind; instead, John stood firmly on the unchangeable Word of God! Apply: Let us also stand firmly on God's Word!

*John was not a man who had the finer things and pleasures of this world; instead, he was THE prophet that was sent by God to prepare the way for the Promised Messiah!

Jesus Spoke About John the Baptizer:

⁷ As they went away, Jesus began to speak to the crowds concerning John: "What did you go out into the wilderness to see? A reed shaken by the wind? ⁸ What then did you go out to see? A man dressed in soft clothing? Behold, those who wear soft clothing are in king's houses. ⁹ What then did you go out to see? A prophet? Yes, I tell you, and more than a prophet. ¹⁰ This is he of whom it is written, "Behold, I send my messenger before your face, who will prepare your way before you.'

In the <u>third</u> part of the reading, Jesus will mention some difficult things:

First, how John is the greatest AND the least – greatest as he prepared the way for the Christ, but least in comparison to those who know of Jesus' suffering, dying, and rising (people like you and me who know and believe such things).

Second, Jesus made a difficult statement about violence and force: It means that those who are brought to the knowledge of the truth about *sin, *Jesus' saving work, and *Jesus' return, are both *enabled* and *moved* to grasp the kingdom of heaven! Think about us: We don't simply believe something. Instead, what we believe on the inside is constantly at work to change our minds, hearts, and lives!

Jesus Spoke Some Difficult Things:

¹¹ Truly, I say to you, among those born of women there has arisen no one greater than John the Baptist. Yet the one who is least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he. ¹² From the days of John the Baptist until now the kingdom of heaven has suffered violence, and the violent take it by force. ¹³ For all the Prophets and the Law prophesied until John, ¹⁴ and if you are willing to accept it, he is Elijah who is to come. ¹⁵ He who has ears to hear, let him hear.
