## **Come to Us to Change Our Behavior**

It is vital to be familiar with our lost condition and God's saving work; then the joy will inspire us to change our behavior!

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: This is the final part our three-week Advent series called **Come, Lord Jesus**.

- First, we emphasized HOW He comes through the Word, and WHAT He does – \*making us spiritually alive, \*setting us free from the condemnation of our sins, \*building us up, and \*giving us eternal blessings!
- Second, we emphasized ▶TO WHOM He comes to those who know of their need for God's forgiveness,
   ▶THAT HEARING IS NOT ENOUGH – since many hear but do not benefit, and ▶A METHOD – of ✓ hear,
   ✓ read, ✓ mark, ✓ learn, and ✓ inwardly digest, by which the Holy Spirit will work through the Word of God to transform our lives from the inside out!
- <u>Third</u>, today, we will emphasize THE RESULTS THAT
   GOD WORKS both in our hearts AND in our daily lives when we do inwardly digest His Word!

## 1. God's Work in our Hearts:

 a. Love: We can better understand our need for God's work in our hearts as we think about love
 – BEFORE and AFTER the fall into sin:

- i. <u>Before the fall</u>: God loved Adam and Eve, they loved God, and they loved each other! *Sounds like paradise* : )
- ii. <u>After the fall</u>: God still loved Adam and Eve, but they no longer loved God or each other.
- b. <u>Change of behavior</u>: It comes from God working on the inside – *in the heart*; then, when God has done His work, *it shows in how we take action for others*. Let's look back at some key parts of today's Scripture reading:
  - What is needed for a person to show true love? <sup>1</sup>...everyone who loves is born of God and knows God (NAU).
  - ii. How did God show true love for us?
     <sup>9</sup> ...God has sent His only begotten Son into the world so that we might live through Him.
  - iii. How did God's love save us? <sup>10</sup> ...God...
     sent His Son to be the propitiation [atoning sacrifice] for our sins. // That means Jesus received OUR sins and OUR punishment.
  - iv. Why should we love each other? <sup>11</sup> if <u>God</u> <u>so loved us [to save us through Jesus]</u>, we also ought to love one another.
  - <u>What does it mean to love each other</u>?
     We love when we take *sacrificial action* to *fulfill the need* of another person.
  - vi. <u>In summary, why do we love others</u>? <sup>19</sup> We love, because [God] first loved us.

- 2. God's Powerful Example of Zacchaeus (Luke 19:1-10): These are the key parts of the story:
  - a. Why was Zaccheus not liked by the people?
     <sup>2</sup> ...he was a chief tax collector and he was rich (NAU).
  - b. How did Jesus show His love for Zaccheus?
     <sup>5</sup> When Jesus came to the place [where Zaccheus had climbed up into a tree to get a glimpse of Jesus], [Jesus] looked up and said to him, "Zaccheus, hurry and come down, for today I must stay at your house."
  - c. <u>Why were others in the town upset</u>? <sup>7</sup> ...they all *began* to grumble, saying, "He has gone to be the guest of a man who is a sinner."
  - d. How did Zaccheus show that his heart had been changed? <sup>8</sup> Zaccheus stopped and said to the Lord, "Behold, Lord, half of my possessions I will give to the poor, and if I have defrauded anyone of anything, I will give back four times as much." // Words are easy, actions are harder, and giving away much money can be the hardest. That giving pointed to his genuine change! In an opposite way, some people know
    what tithing means and \*what the Bible says about tithing, but they keep refusing to do it.
- 3. God's Instructions to those who Know Him: Even though the devil, the world, and our flesh keep trying to pull us in the wrong directions, *God is calling and*

*empowering us remember His love* and *do His will*. Let's note some key things in these key passages:

- a. <u>Regarding the Bible</u>, when and why? "...you shall meditate on it <u>day and night</u>, so that you may <u>be careful to do according to all that is</u> written in it; [then God encourages us to do such things, because the rest of the verse says:] for then you will make your way prosperous, and then you will have success" (Joshua 1:8 NAS).
- b. <u>Regarding the Bible</u>, what order? "...Ezra had <u>set his heart to study</u> the law of the LORD, and to practice *it*, and to teach *His* statutes and ordinances in Israel" (Ezra 7:10 NAS). // <u>Set</u> > <u>study</u>
  <u>practice</u> > <u>teach</u>. That applies to Bible teachers AND all believers – *since all believers are teaching others with their words and actions*.
- c. <u>Since God is not needy, how do we love Him</u>? Jesus said, "If you love Me, you will keep My commandments" (John 14:15 NAS).
- d. Since many are only actors or hypocrites, how do we show the reality of God's work in our hearts?
   "...putting aside all filthiness and all that remains of wickedness... prove yourselves doers of the word, and not merely hearers who delude themselves" (James 1:21-22 NAU).

Let Us Pray: Dear Father, we have all sinned, so we TY again for working in our hearts and giving us Jesus! Guide us and empower us so that our behavior reflects the light of Jesus!

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
