

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: It's the eve of our national day of Thanksgiving; therefore, tonight, I want to address a number of *key aspects of Thanksgiving*:

- American Thanksgiving History: The roots of our American Thanksgiving date back to 1621, when the pilgrims, after their first harvest, celebrated the first Thanksgiving. At that time and in the years to follow, "the New England colonists were accustomed to regular 'thanksgiving,' celebrations [meaning] days of feasting and of prayer thanking God for blessings such as military victory or the end of a drought."¹
- American Thanksgiving Today: Wikipedia notes that "the centerpiece of Thanksgiving celebrations remains Thanksgiving dinner. The dinner traditionally consists of foods and dishes indigenous to the Americas [thus homegrown], namely turkey, potatoes, stuffing, squash,

corn, green beans, cranberry sauce, and pumpkin pie. Thanksgiving is regarded as the beginning of the fall– winter holiday season..."²

- 3. The Term: Thanksgiving: The term, thanksgiving, is basically taking the phrase, giving thanks, and making it into a single word: thanksgiving. Therefore, right now, rather than talk about thanksgiving, let's talk about giving thanks! What can be said about giving thanks? Here are three essential elements included in giving thanks:
 - a. <u>First</u>, we **must** <u>identify</u> something good that we have been given *like food or Jesus!*
 - b. <u>Second</u>, we **must** <u>figure out</u> who gave us that thing – *like our Father in heaven!*
 - c. <u>Third</u>, we **must** <u>express</u> our thanks to the giver by trusting, praising, serving, and obeying God!

4. American Thanksgiving – Analysis:

- a. If we ♦fail to identify the good, or ♦fail to figure out who gave it, or ♦fail to express our thanks; then our thanksgiving or giving thanks has been unsuccessful[®].
- b. Let's go back to what I noted above about an American Thanksgiving today: According to Wikipedia, the center piece is the meal; the day also marks the beginning of the fall-winter holiday season. However, <u>what is missing</u>? *All three of the essential elements*! <u>Isn't that so</u> <u>sad</u>? Even though many in America on Thanksgiving Day will √ gather with others, √ eat

food, and ✓ watch football or go shopping, *many* will do so WITHOUT GIVING THANKS! Let's see what the Bible says; then let us ⊃give thanks and ⊃encourage others to do the same!

- 5. Our Thanksgiving Text 1 Timothy 2:1-4: ¹ First of all, then, I urge that <u>supplications</u>, <u>prayers</u>, <u>intercessions</u>, and <u>thanksgivings</u> be made for all people, ² for kings and all who are in high positions, that we may lead a peaceful and quiet life, godly and dignified in every way. ³ This is good, and it is pleasing in the sight of God our Savior, ⁴ who desires all people to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth.
 - a. How is calling us to pray for others?
 - Supplications (δεήσεις): That is how we speak to God when the need is serious or urgent. For example, the angel said to Zechariah, "...your prayer [supplication] has been heard, and your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you shall call his name John" (Luke 1:13 ESV).
 - ii. Prayers (προσευχὰς): That is the standard word for requesting help from God. We ask things of God because we trust in Him as our LORD and Savior! Jesus said: "...whatever you ask in prayer [προσευχῆ], you will receive, if you have faith" (Matt. 21:22 ESV).
 - iii. Intercessions (ἐντεύξεις): That is when we go to God on behalf of another person. Paul wrote: "...everything created by God is good... for it is made holy by the word of God and prayer [ἐντεύξεως]" (1 Tim. 4:4-5 ESV).

- iv. Thanksgivings (εὐχαριστίας): That is the attitude of gratitude and the action of expressing thanks. Jesus gave thanks to the Father: "...he took a cup, and when he had given thanks [εὐχαριστήσας] [to the Father] he gave it to them..." (Mk. 14:23 ESV).
- b. <u>Who should be included in our prayers</u>? All people, *including federal, state, and local leaders*. <u>Prayer</u>: Lutheran Book of Prayer, For All Leaders of Nations (1970 edition, page 95).
- c. What is the purpose of our prayers? Asking God for a nation and a world in which Christians can live peaceful, quiet, godly, and dignified lives so that ✓God is honored, ✓ the gospel may freely go forth, and ✓ all people might be saved and grow up in God's Word of truth!

Conclusion: God is good, we all have our basic temporal needs and more – *SO LET US GIVE HIM THANKS*! But our greatest blessings are eternal; God desired for us to be saved from our sins – *THEN HE DID IT THROUGH JESUS*! Even now many are ignoring God; **NEVERTHELESS**, God still provides for them and desires for them to be saved!
