Mark 1:4-11 NAU and Other Passages



Baptism and Money

Saturday, 1/9 at 4:00 | Sunday, 1/10 at 9:00 The Baptism of Our Lord – 2021

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: Here at Bethlehem we follow the church year; therefore, *about SIX MONTHS each year*, we focus on Jesus' <u>coming</u>, <u>birth</u>, <u>ministry</u>, and <u>sacrifice</u>! However, *things are a bit lopsided in our approach*. In other words, *over the past SIX WEEKS*, Jesus was <u>anticipated</u>, <u>born</u>, <u>named</u>, and <u>baptized</u>, *so Jesus is already 30 years old*! Today we will skim over Jesus' baptism; then, *at the end*, we will turn our attention to the topic of money.

- 1. Baptism: We now focus on John, who baptized Jesus:
 - a. John Preached and Baptized: ⁴ John the Baptist [baptizer] appeared in the wilderness [about 40 miles east of Jerusalem] preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. ⁵ And all the country of Judea was

going out to him, and all the people of Jerusalem; and

they were being baptized by him in the Jordan River, confessing their sins. // What happened? Many *went out to John, *heard him preach, *confessed their sins, and *were baptized for the forgiveness of their sins.



- b. John was Different: ⁶ John was clothed with camel's hair and wore a leather belt around his waist, and his diet was locusts and wild honey. // John didn't waste his time with clothes and food. What about us, are we wasting our time with temporal things? Let us *think, *identify such things, and *repent / change!
- c. John Pointed People to Jesus: ⁷ And he was preaching, and saying, "After me One is coming who is mightier than I, and I am not fit to stoop down and untie the thong of His sandals [which was the task of the lowest servant]. ⁸ "I baptized you with water; but <u>He</u> [Jesus] will baptize you with the Holy Spirit." // John used water, and God forgave sins! Then, 50 days after Jesus was raised, He poured out the HS. The HS works through the Bible to *teach us, *guide us, and *strengthen us!
- d. John Baptized Jesus: ⁹ In <u>those days</u> [when John was baptizing] Jesus came from Nazareth in Galilee and was <u>baptized by John in the Jordan</u> [not for forgiveness, but to

accept His mission to be the Christ]. ¹⁰ Immediately coming up out of the water [after He was baptized], <u>He</u> [God the Son] saw the heavens opening, and <u>the Spirit</u> [God the HS] like a dove descending upon Him; ¹¹ and <u>a voice</u> came out of the heavens [the voice of God the Father]: "You are My beloved Son, in You I am well-pleased." // That is one of the rare times when the F, the S, and the HS were all individually present at the same time! Regarding the Father being pleased: Adam fell, and all of us have also fallen, yet Jesus did NOT fall; instead, He •did not sin and •perfectly followed the will of His Father. As the Father was pleased with His Son, so He is pleased with us through our faith in Jesus! We now turn to the topic of money...

- 2. Money: We need it and God has given it; now what?
 - a. Some Bible basics:
 - i. God has given us all we have (1Co. 4:7).
 - ii. We are called to return 10% for the work of His kingdom from the **first** of **all** we receive (Pro. 3:9).
 - iii. GIVING should be based on RECEIVING.
 - iv. A tithe is 10%; here are some examples:
 - 1. \$10/week (allowance) = \$1 tithe
 - 2. \$100/week (after school job) = \$10 tithe
 - 3. \$1,000/week (full-time job) = \$100 tithe
 - 4. \$1,500/month (social security) = \$150 tithe
 - v. When we give faithfully (weekly/biweekly/monthly) and generously (10%), *God will abundantly give to us* (Luke 6:38). For all who are giving <u>first</u>, <u>faithfully</u>, and <u>generously</u>, <u>THANK YOU SO VERY MUCH</u>! You are blessed because God's promises NEVER FAIL!

b. Robbing God: What does that mean?

- i. Sin: "Will a man rob God? Yet you are robbing Me! [That is what the LORD said to the people who were not tithing.] But you say, 'How have we robbed You?' [Then the LORD answered:] In tithes and offerings."
- ii. **Consequence**: "You are cursed with a curse, for you are robbing Me... [then the LORD stated the remedy]
- iii. Remedy: "Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse... test Me now in this... if I will not open for you the windows of heaven and pour out for you a blessing until it overflows" (Malachi 3:8-10 NAU). If you are robbing, repent and He will bless you!
- c. Our 2021 offering envelopes:
 - i. <u>Statement</u>: Let Us Be Faithful Managers: God has given us our part and His part; let us gladly give Him His part (10%) for the work of His kingdom! // When we do, God will bless us!
 - ii. <u>Verse</u>: "Honor the LORD with your wealth... then your barns will be filled with plenty..." (Proverbs 3:9-10 ESV). // That is one of many verses in which God promises to bless those who give to Him first! *Firstfruits giving demonstrates faith in the Almighty*!

This Week's Challenge: Rejoice in Jesus, your Savior; give thanks for God's countless gifts; and honor the LORD with Biblical giving!

Let Us Pray: Father in heaven, TY for sending Your Son for our eternal benefit; *then clothing us in Him through Holy Baptism!* Now, *knowing we are forgiven in Christ*, help us to fully believe and actually do Your Holy Word!
