Text: Mark 1:21-28 NAU (New American Standard, 1995 Version)



Fourth Sunday after the Epiphany – 2021

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: Sometimes it's important to be **ABSOLUTELY SURE**; for example:

- You're a government spy with a thyroid problem; when you take a pill, is it Levoxyl or is it cyanide?
- You're ready to walk on the glass-bottomed Grand Canyon Skywalk; will the glass hold my weight?
- You believe in heaven and hell, and want to go to heaven; is Jesus, God's Son, the only way to heaven?

We know that life and death issues are serious; *how much MORE SERIOUS are the issues of eternity!*

Before we dive into today's sermon text, let's do a quick overview of Mark 1:1-20...

✓ Vv. 1-8: John the Baptizer prepared the way for Jesus by preaching and baptizing.

- Vv. 9-11: Jesus was baptized by John; then God the Father anointed Jesus with the Holy Spirit to officially make Him the Christ.
- Vv. 12-13: Jesus was severely tempted by the devil, yet He never fell into sin. Even though the first Adam failed, Jesus, the second Adam, prevailed!
- Vv. 14-15: After John was arrested, Jesus began preaching and called everyone to Dbe sorry for his sins and Dbelieve in Him as their Savior.
- Vv. 16-20: Jesus called His first four disciples, who were two pairs of brothers. First, He called Peter and Andrew; then, James and John.

Now, continuing in Mark 1:21, let us be ABSOLUTELY SURE that <u>Jesus is God's Son, the only way to heaven</u>!

- 1. Jesus' Teaching Points to His Identity: ²¹ They went into Capernaum; and immediately on the Sabbath He entered the synagogue and *began* to teach. ²² They were amazed at His teaching; for He was teaching them as *one* having authority, and not as the scribes.
 - a. <u>Where is Capernaum</u>? On the northern shore of the Sea of Galilee.
 - b. <u>Who lived in Capernaum</u>? Jesus had moved there from Nazareth; also, Peter, Andrew, James, and John.
 - c. <u>What was their occupation</u>? Before Jesus called them, Peter, Andrew, James, and John were fishermen.
 - d. <u>What day is the Sabbath</u>? Saturday. God commanded the people to rest (not work) and focus on Him.
 - e. <u>Who were amazed at Jesus' teaching</u>? The people who had gathered in the synagogue. And <u>what does it</u> <u>mean that they were amazed</u>? They were astonished,

overwhelmed; Lenski wrote: "...as long as Jesus spoke, every eye and every ear were fixed on him in rapt attention, dreading to miss a single word" (73).

- f. Why were they amazed? Because Jesus' taught with authority! And what does that mean? Authority is POWER, unlike the powerless words of the scribes. That POWER showed whenever Jesus taught! Lenski wrote that "the deity of Jesus [the fact that He is God] revealed itself in all that he said... [then Lenski used these words to contrast the teaching of the scribes:] ...foolish... mean... intricate with legal pettiness... concerned only about priests and Pharisees... and mostly occupied with things infinitely little" (74).
- 2. Jesus' Power Over a Demon Points to His Identity: ²³ Just then there was a man in their synagogue with an unclean spirit; and he cried out, ²⁴ saying, "What business do we have with each other, Jesus of Nazareth? Have You come to <u>destroy us [ruin us]</u>? I know who You are-- the Holy One of God!" ²⁵ And Jesus rebuked him, saying, "Be quiet, and come out of him!" ²⁶ Throwing him into convulsions, the unclean spirit cried out with a loud voice and came out of him.
 - a. <u>What is an unclean spirit</u>? A fallen angel, a demon.
 - b. <u>Will Jesus eventually ruin or destroy the demons</u>? Yes, when He returns; *He will cast them into the lake of fire*!
 - c. <u>Should we believe that Jesus is "the Holy One of God"</u> <u>because of what the demon said</u>? No; *demons are liars*!
 - d. <u>Did the demon obey Jesus</u>? Yes, but he made it known to everyone that he was *very powerful* and *very angry!*
 - e. <u>Why did the demon obey Jesus</u>? **Jesus is the almighty Son of God**, so the demon had no choice.

- Jesus' Eyewitnesses Confirm His Identify: ²⁷ They were all amazed, so that they debated among themselves, saying, "What is this? A new teaching with authority! He commands even the unclean spirits, and they obey Him."
 ²⁸ Immediately the news about Him spread everywhere into all the surrounding district of Galilee.
 - a. Jesus awesome teachings were followed by awesome actions; therefore, what should we conclude? Think about today's OT reading... A prophet is known to be true when his words actually happen. When Jesus – the Son of God in human flesh, spoke things happened!
 - <u>Evil angels are super-powerful, but who is MORE</u> <u>powerful</u>? God – *F, S, and HS*! James wrote: "Submit therefore to God. Resist the devil and he will flee from you" (4:7 NAS).
 - c. <u>When we witness something that is *real* and *powerful,* <u>what is a natural reaction</u>? We are excited and tell others! *That is what happened in Capernaum!*</u>

Conclusion: Truth—be sure, Jesus is the one way to heaven! Relevance—be sure to benefit from Jesus' work through repentance (sorrow and faith)! Inspiration—the past is forgiven, so today is the first day of the rest of our lives! Encouragement—God is in control, so let us trust and not fear regarding our nation, our health, and everything else!

Let Us Pray: Father in heaven, in the midst of being unsure about many things, <u>make us sure about</u> \checkmark the Bible being Your Word, \checkmark Jesus being Your Son, \checkmark <u>us</u> being forgiven through Jesus, and \checkmark <u>You</u> being in control of all things!
