

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: Today we are focusing on three topics:

- + The upcoming season of Lent.
- The Season of Epiphany: It ⇒began with the baby Jesus receiving special gifts from the wise men – *pointing to His kingship, priesthood, and sacrifice,* ⇒continued with Jesus' baptism, teaching, and miracles, and ⇒ends with Jesus' transfiguration. <u>What</u> is the overall message of the season? JESUS IS GOD – the One ♦promised to Adam and Eve, ♦written about by the prophets, and ♦praised by the angels. *So let us be sure that <u>His sacrifice opened heaven for all</u> who – <i>by God's grace* – *keep repenting and believing*!

- The Word "Love" in the Bible: In the NAS version, "love" appears 348 times – 133 in the OT and 215 in the NT. There are four *Greek* words in the love category – agape, philia, storge, and eros; sometimes they are translated *love* and they all include some type of action. Let's find out more about each of the four:
 - Agape (ἀγάπη) It's the most common of the four Greek words found in the Bible. The simplest translation is love, and it does include action. The Bible says: "...let us not love in word or talk but in deed and in truth" (1 Jn. 3:18 ESV). In most cases, we could say that Agape love is taking sacrificial action to supply someone else's need!
 - Love toward persons: NAU Ephesians 5:25 "Husbands, <u>love</u> your wives, just as Christ also <u>loved</u> the church and gave Himself up for her..."
 - ii. Love toward God: NAS Matthew 22:37
 [Jesus] said..., "You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind."
 - iii. Love from God: NAU John 3:16 "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life."
 - iv. Love toward things: NAU 1 John 2:15 Do not love the world nor the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him."

- b. Philia (φιλία) Think about Philadelphia, the city of brotherly love. The word means friendship. The Bible includes a similar Greek word (φίλος), which means friend or designates a close relationship, but philia means the action of friendship, which is only used once in the Bible and in a negative way. NAU James 4:4 "You adulteresses [unfaithful people], do you not know that friendship [φιλία; the action of gladly sinning] with the world is hostility toward God?
- c. <u>Storge</u> (στόργή) The meaning is affection.
 However, *in the Bible*, the word is used *only in a negative sense*, meaning *without affection*.
 - Romans 1 has a list of sad realities which describe unbelievers; the list includes people are who are "...without understanding, untrustworthy, unloving [ἄστοργος], unmerciful" (Rom. 1:31 NAU).
 - ii. 2 Timothy 3 has another list of the sad realities which describe unbelievers; the list includes people who are "...unloving [ἄστοργοι], irreconcilable, malicious gossips, without self-control, brutal, haters of good [and so on]" (2 Tim. 3:3 NAU).
- d. Eros (ἐρος) This fourth Greek word can be defined as passion, but it is NOT found in the Greek NT.

The Bible says: "...as you have received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk in Him, having been firmly rooted and now being built up in Him and established in your faith, just as you were instructed, and overflowing with gratitude" (Col. 2:6-7 NAU). This insert includes **3 easy steps** that I am asking ALL OF YOU TO TAKE EACH WEEK and through which God the Holy Spirit will work to further ♦root you, ♦build you up, ♦establish you, and ♦make you thankful!
