Text: Mark 8:27-38 NAU (New American Standard, 1995 Version)



Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: When something in life is difficult, people try to make things easier; for example: indoor plumbing, washing machines, and <u>cars</u>; try to imagine life without such things...

In this sermon we will discover that following Jesus IS difficult. Even though our natural reaction is to *try to make our following easier*, \bigcirc <u>does that agree with what Jesus said</u> and \bigcirc <u>is that truly best for us</u>?

Earlier in Mark 8, Jesus *fed the 5,000, *was approached by the Pharisees, and *healed a blind man; we now come to today's sermon text.

1. The Setting? ²⁷ Jesus went out [of Bethsaida,] [where He had healed the blind man], along with His disciples, to the villages of Caesarea Philippi... [which were about 25 miles to the north]. // Somewhere between Bethsaida and Caesarea Philippi, Jesus asked His disciples two questions.

- 2. Who Is Jesus? ...and on the way He questioned His disciples, saying to them, "Who do people say that I am?" ²⁸ They told Him, saying, "John the Baptist; and others say Elijah; but others, one of the prophets." ²⁹ And He continued by questioning them, "But who do you say that I am?" Peter answered and said to Him, "You are the Christ." ³⁰ And He warned them to tell no one about Him.
 - a. <u>Why keep it to themselves</u>? Since many expected the Christ to be an earthly king, *it was better to keep silent*!
 - b. What is the Christ?
 - i. The Champion promised to Adam and Eve!
 - ii. Abraham's descendant who would bless all families!
 - iii. David's Son and Lord!
 - iv. The One born of a virgin in Bethlehem!
 - v. The One anointed by God the Father with the HS!
 - vi. The One who took away the sin of the world!
- What Was Coming? ³¹ And [Jesus] began to teach them that the Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders and the chief priests and the scribes,¹ and be killed, and after three days rise again. // Jesus is the Son of God, so He knew about His upcoming *rejection, *suffering, *death, and *resurrection!

¹ **The elders** "were the old, experienced men of the nation who had served as judges in the local courts and... risen to membership in the highest court." **The chief priests** "were members of the ruling high priest's family..." **The scribes** "were the experts in the interpretation of the Old Testament..." (Lenski, 339-340).

- <u>Rejection</u>: Jesus' rejection was formal by the 71 judges of the Sanhedrin, and informal as the crowd in front of Pilate should, "Crucify Him, crucify Him!"
- b. <u>Suffering</u>: Jesus greatly suffered as He +<u>was beaten</u> by the Roman soldiers, +<u>was nailed</u> to His cross, +<u>bore</u> <u>our sins</u>, and +<u>bore God's punishment</u> for our sins!
- c. <u>Death</u>: In a sense, Jesus was killed, but He actually laid down His life to seal His victory!
- d. <u>Resurrection</u>: Jesus was raised by God the Father to
 ♦ show His acceptance of Jesus' payment and ♦ prove Jesus' victory over sin, death, and the devil!
- 4. How Did Peter Become Satan? ³² And [Jesus] was stating the matter plainly. And Peter took Him aside and began to rebuke Him [to strongly tell Jesus that such things would NOT happen]. ³³ But turning around and seeing His disciples, He rebuked [thus strongly spoke to] Peter and said, "Get behind Me, Satan; for you are not setting your mind on God's interests, but man's." // God sent His Son to redeem us, but Peter opposed Jesus' work because it included rejection, suffering, and death! Peter's opposition to God's will put him into the role of Satan. What about us, are we somehow opposing God's will? If so, let us repent!
- 5. What Are the Follower Requirements? ³⁴ And [Jesus] summoned the crowd with His disciples, and said to them, "If anyone wishes to come after Me, he must deny himself, and take up his cross and follow Me. // Three requirements: Deny your self say no to your sinful desires; take up your cross willingly suffer for Jesus' sake (as He did for our sake); and follow Jesus by honoring Him as Lord and following His will.

- 6. Who Is Lost and Who Is Saved? ³⁵ For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for My sake and the gospel's will save it." // For those who refuse to deny, take, and follow, this life might be better, but eternal life will be lost! But for those who do deny, take, and follow, they will be with God forever!
- 7. What Is More Valuable? ³⁶ "For what does it profit a man to gain the whole world, and forfeit his soul? ³⁷ For what will a man give in exchange for his soul?" // You can have the whole world now or your soul with God forever!
- 8. Are You Ashamed? Jesus said: ³⁸ "For whoever is ashamed of Me and My words in this <u>adulterous</u> [unfaithful] and sinful generation, the Son of Man will also be ashamed of him when He comes in the glory of His Father with the holy angels." // When we identify with Jesus, we will be persecuted. Many are tempted to be "secret Christians," but that won't work; if we are ashamed of Him, then He will be ashamed of us.

Conclusion<mark>:</mark>

- Truth The path to heaven deny, take, follow!
- Relevance As it is good for a chick to struggle to get out of its egg, so it is good for a Christian to struggle!
- Inspiration The end is heaven and everlasting happiness!
