

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: It is AD 2021 and we are remembering the <u>first Palm Sunday</u>, when Jesus – *the Son of God, the Son of David, the Messiah, the Christ* – entered Jerusalem on a donkey. He was Inot proud, *but humble*; Inot weak, *but meek*; Inot an earthly king, *but the King of kings*; Inot here to conquer the Romans, *but to conquer sin, death, and the devil!* Jesus entering Jerusalem on Palm Sunday was part of GOD'S MONUMENTAL PLAN to Iremove our sins and I open the way to heaven!

These KEY EVENTS lead up to Zechariah's Palm Sunday prophecy, which he wrote down 520 years before Jesus' birth:

- **587 BC:** The temple was destroyed by the Babylonians.
- **538 BC:** Cyrus, the king of Persia, released about 50,000 Jews from Babylon to return to rebuild the temple.
- 520 BC: Since many turned from God's work to their work, the LORD sent Haggai to call them to repent.

- 520 BC: God began to speak to the people through Zechariah: <u>chapters 1-5</u>, *encouragement*; <u>chapter 6</u>, *the gospel of Christ*; <u>chapters 7 & 8</u>, *urging the people to keep building*; <u>chapter 9</u>, *prophesying about*:
 - Alexander the Great (356-323 BC) who conquered
 Tyre, *Sidon, and *the Philistines to open the world to the coming Christ!
 - The Christ Himself who came into Jerusalem on a donkey to bring †peace, †freedom, and †blessing!
- A Palm Sunday Prophecy: ⁹ Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion [a people waiting to be saved]! Shout in triumph, O daughter of Jerusalem! Behold, your king is coming to you [at the LORD's appointed time]; He is just and endowed with salvation [thus coming to save], Humble, and mounted on a donkey, Even on a colt [male], the foal of a donkey [under one year old]. // Connections to David and Solomon:
 - a. <u>David</u>: Jesus is David's greatest descendant, *a.k.a. David's greatest Son!* As David thoroughly defeated Israel's enemies, so Jesus won a total victory over death and hell! **Now**, we know by faith; **when Jesus returns**, we will see and experience the fullness of His victory!
 - b. <u>Solomon</u>: When David was near death, *he told his son* Solomon to ride his own mule to his coronation (1 Kings 1:33). As Solomon arrived on a donkey, an animal of peace, so Jesus, the Prince of Peace, entered Jerusalem on a donkey to establish everlasting peace between God and people by taking away their sins!
- 2. The GREAT BLESSINGS of God's Kingdom: ¹⁰ I will cut off the chariot from Ephraim [a reference to the northern kingdom,

which was defeated by the Assyrians in 721 BC] And the horse from Jerusalem [a reference to the southern kingdom, which was defeated by the Babylonians in 587 BC];



And the bow of war will be cut off. And He will speak peace to the nations; And His dominion will be from sea to sea, And from the River to the ends of the earth.

- a. <u>Remove the things of war</u>: Whether it be physical or spiritual, *war is horrible*! Therefore, it is certainly good news that the coming Messiah would remove the things of war such as <u>chariots</u> and <u>horses</u> and <u>bows</u>!
- <u>Establish peace and dominion</u>: The kingdom of God is a spiritual kingdom, *thus a non-geographical kingdom*.
 Whenever the Messiah is reigning in a person's heart as Savior and Lord, *that person is a member of God's kingdom*, which stretches "to the ends of the earth."
- 3. For the Hopeless FREEDOM: ¹¹ As for you also, because of the blood of *My* covenant with you, I have set your prisoners free from the waterless pit.
 - a. <u>Trapped in a pit</u>: Imagine the pit is deep and dry, you have ***no** water or food, ***no** way to climb out, ***no** one to help you, and you are almost unconscious. Then, just then, you are aroused because someone has come to set you free, and provide you with water and food[©]!
 - b. <u>Trapped by sin</u>: Whether people know it or not, *sin has brought* \$spiritual death and \$separation from God. All people were *trapped in a spiritual pit*, so they had \$no

way to overcome their sin, ***no** way to escape, and *hell* was imminent. Then, just then, the Messiah arrived to win the victory over <u>sin</u> and <u>hell</u>, and gift people with <u>forgiveness</u> and <u>heaven</u>!

- 4. A GREAT Invitation and a DOUBLE Blessing: ¹² Return to the stronghold, O prisoners who have the hope; This very day I am declaring that I will restore double to you.
 - a. <u>Repent</u>: The stronghold is the Messiah; He is our place of safety from *sin, death, and hell*! For all who are currently prisoners, *the cry to repent is going forth* <u>so</u> be sorry AND trust in Jesus for eternal life!
 - b. <u>Be blessed</u>: There is *NO neutral position* with the Messiah; He does NOT simply remove us from <u>sin</u>, <u>death</u>, and <u>hell</u>; *INSTEAD*, *He blesses us with* <u>forgiveness</u>, <u>life</u>, and <u>heaven</u>!

Conclusion<mark>:</mark>

- Truth The Messiah has come, and His name is Jesus!
- Relevance We deserve death and hell, so we all desperately need the Messiah!
- Inspiration Through our God-worked sorrow and faith, we are richly blessed now and forever!

Let Us Pray: Dear Lord Jesus, out of perfect love and obedience, You <u>came</u>, <u>lived</u>, <u>suffered</u>, and <u>died</u> to win our freedom. May peace and joy overflow from us in such a way that others might gladly receive You as their Savior and Lord!

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
