Text: 1 John 3:1-7 NAU (New American Standard, 1995 Version)



Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: We live in a world full of VARIETY or DIFFERENCES! Some differences are obvious – *like the taste of sweet* versus *sour*, but some are difficult to identify – *like who is in Christ* and *who is not*.

In today's sermon text from **1 John chapter 3**, the Holy Spirit will work through God's Word to help us to better understand *****who is in Christ* **and ***who is not* – so that *****those who are in Christ will rejoice* **and ***those who are not in Christ will be moved by God to repent and believe!*

 Wow! Children of God: ¹ See how great a love the Father has bestowed on us, that we would be called children of God; and such we are. // Imagine being a child of a great US president, a famous singer, or a billionaire... That might be amazing, but how much MORE AMAZING to be a child of God! Not just some so-called God, but the TRUE GOD, who is almighty, designed the universe, saved us through His Son, provides all we need, and invites us to live with Him forever and ever!

- Oh! That's Why: For this reason the world does not know us, because it did not know Him. // Are you aware of the differences between those who know God and those who do not? Here are a few examples:
 - a. <u>How we talk</u>: We try to say what is pleasing to God regardless of where we are or to whom we are speaking! ^{NAU} Eph. 5:4 "...there must be no filthiness and silly talk, or coarse jesting, which are not fitting, but rather giving of thanks."
 - b. <u>What we do</u>: We try to do whatever agrees with the Bible in every circumstance of our lives! NAU 1 Cor. 10:31 "Whether, then, you eat or drink or whatever you do, do all to the glory of God."
 - C. Our attitude about Divine Service: We make it a top priority to gather and receive each week! NAU Heb.
 10:25 "...not forsaking our own assembling together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another; and all the more as you see the [last] day drawing near."
- 3. Blessed Now, But Much More Is Coming: ² Beloved, now we are children of God, and it has not appeared as yet what we will be. We know that when He [Jesus] appears [thus, when He returns], we will be like Him, because we will see Him just as He is. // When Jesus appeared to various people after He was raised, He ♦was recognizable, ♦had the nail marks on His body, ♦could be touched, and ♦ate a piece of broiled fish. In other words, the bodies we will have in eternity will be like what we have now, yet MUCH BETTER; some of the GREAT ADVANTAGES include ♦no weakness, ♦no sickness, ♦no pain, and ♦no death!

- 4. The Proper Response of All Believers: ³ And everyone who has <u>this hope fixed on Him purifies himself, just as He is pure.</u> // What is "this hope"? * Jesus will come back and * we will be like Him. For all who believe those things, they try to *AVOID sin and *DO what is pleasing to God!
- Let's Not Sugarcoat Sin: ⁴ Everyone who practices sin also practices lawlessness; and sin is lawlessness. // God tells us in His Word * what is right and * what is wrong. <u>Take note</u>: In the past we have all sinned AND, going forward as Christians, we cannot completely stop sinning (Eccl. 7:20). <u>But there is an important distinction to make</u>:
 - <u>Believers in Jesus</u>: They are controlled by the new nature, so they mostly follow the will of God, which means avoiding sin (see Galatians 5:16)!
 - b. <u>People without Jesus</u>: They are controlled by the old nature, so they mostly follow their sinful hearts, which means living in sin (see Judges 21:25)! Dr. Kretzmann wrote: "Here the apostle shows that deliberate, malicious sinning is incompatible with the new life of the Christians..."

Ask yourself: <u>Where am I with Jesus</u> – only believing in His existence or trusting in Him as my only Savior? <u>What is</u> the practice of my life – avoiding sin or living in sin?

6. The Truth About Jesus: ⁵ You know that He [the Son of God] appeared in order to take away sins; and in Him there is no sin. // Since Adam fell, sin passed to all future people (Romans 5:12)[®]. Since no one can make himself right with God – by somehow washing off or canceling out his sins[®], the sinless Son of God came to remove the HUGE DIVIDING WALL OF SIN between God and all people[®]!

- 7. Hmmm! Tough Statement: ⁶ No one who abides in Him [Jesus] sins; no one who sins has seen Him or knows Him. // To "abide" in Him is to "remain" in Him, thus, to keep trusting in Him and benefitting from His saving work! Christians have a LIVING faith, not a mere memory of a former relationship with Jesus.
 - a. <u>According to the new nature</u>, *Christians do not sin*; however, the old nature is always present to deceive us and pull us into sin. So, it is important to **keep on** *feeding the new* and *starving the old*!
 - b. <u>Sometimes we fall into sin</u>, but <u>through Jesus</u> we are sinless / saints / holy ones in God's sight!
- Oh! Those Who Believe in Jesus Practice What Is Right:
 ⁷ Little children, make sure no one deceives you; the one who practices righteousness is righteous, just as He is righteous... // How might we be deceived? When we or others SAY they are Christians and yet LIVE like the devil. Since we saved through Jesus, let us practice what is right!

- Truth Some are children of God and some are not.
- Relevance When we know God, it will show!
- Inspiration Since we are saved through Jesus, let us practice what is right and call others to repent!
