Text: 1 John 4:1-11 NAU (New American Standard, 1995 Version)



Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: Last week we put a dipstick into our hearts to check for the love of God. These are some questions we will answer today:

- Who is telling the truth?
- What is the truth?
- To whom are we listening?
- How did God love us?
- What should we be doing toward others?
- 1. Prophet Test: <sup>1</sup> Beloved, do not believe every spirit [thus, every teaching], but test the spirits [the teachings] to see whether they are from God, [Why?] because many false prophets have gone out into the world.
  - a. <u>What is a true prophet</u>? Someone who speaks for God - by rightly proclaiming the Word of God.
  - b. <u>How can we determine if a person is true or false</u>? Compare his words with the Bible.

- 2. Truth Test: <sup>2</sup> By this you know the Spirit of God: every spirit [thus, every person or teaching] that confesses that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is from God; <sup>3</sup> and every spirit [person or teaching] that does not confess Jesus is not from God; this is the spirit of the antichrist [people and teachings that oppose Christ or a false Christ], of which you have heard that it is coming, and now it is already in the world. // To test for the truth, ask these two questions:
  - a. What is he teaching about people?
    - i. When a person does good, God will accept him. OR
    - ii. No person can make himself acceptable to God.
  - b. <u>What is he teaching about **Jesus**</u>? For example:
    - i. Jewish leaders: No God and Jesus connection.
    - ii. Traditional Judaism: No teaching about Jesus.
    - iii. Muslims: Jesus is only a prophet.
    - iv. Roman Catholics: Jesus + works earn heaven.
    - v. The Bible: Jesus alone receives the gift of heaven.
- 3. God Is Greater: <sup>4</sup> You are from God, little children, and have overcome them [the false teachers]; because greater is [God] who is in you than [the devil] who is in the world. // All false teachers whether they know it or not are antichrist, thus against Christ and His all-sufficient work. The devil wants everyone to believe what is false, but God who is greater ♦has set us free and ♦dwells within us!

## 4. To Whom are We Listening?

a. <u>The false teachers</u>: <sup>5</sup> They are from the world; therefore they speak *as* from the world, and the world listens to them. // The "world" means the sinful world. All of us are IN the world, but false teachers and those who listen to them are OF the world. That means they belong to the world, bare outside of God's kingdom, bdo not understand God's truth, and without repentance - bwill be apart from God forever.

- b. <u>The teachers who represent God</u>: <sup>6</sup> We are from God; he who knows God listens to us; he who is not from God does not listen to us. By this we know the spirit of truth and the spirit of error.
  - i. By God's truth we have been set free from ◆sin,
    \*death, and \*hell. Therefore, let us grow up in
    \*learning God's truth and \*doing God's truth!
  - ii. I hope you understand and apply what I preach and teach, but ONLY DO SO WHEN MY PREACHING AND TEACHING AGREES WITH THE BIBLE!

## 5. Love or Lack of Love Identifies People:

- a. Love: <sup>7</sup> Beloved, let us love one another, for love is from God; and everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. // Last week we checked our hearts for the love of God. When we take sincere and loving action toward those who are in need, then we know we are born of God and know God!
- b. <u>Lack of love</u>: <sup>8</sup> The one who does not love does not know God, for God is love. // What does it mean to "not love"? Some people take no action to help those in need; that is obvious. Others take action, but they are motivated by personal gain; such action is not love.

## 6. God's Love for Us:

- a. <u>He sent His Son</u>: <sup>9</sup> By this the love of God was manifested [revealed] in us, that God has sent His only begotten Son into the world so that we might live through Him [John 3:16]. // When we were spiritually dead, God sent His Son for our salvation – God did it AND revealed it to us. God showed us our helpless condition; then He saved us through Jesus!
- b. <u>He punished His Son for our sins</u>: <sup>10</sup> In this is love, not that we loved God, but that He loved us and sent His Son *to be* the propitiation for our sins. //
  - i. <u>Some have this view of God's love</u>: **We did good**, so *God loved us and saved us*.
  - ii. <u>But reality is the opposite</u>: **We did bad**, but God still loved us and saved us!

## Conclusion: <sup>11</sup> Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another.

- Truth Since "God is love," God took sincere action for us!
- Relevance All recipients of God's love ought to take sincere action to help people who are truly in need!
- Inspiration Our sincere acts of love can point others to the ultimate, saving love of God in Christ!

Let Us Pray: Dear Holy Spirit, open our eyes to see who is truly in need, then move us to take sincere and loving action!
