



Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: **This is part 4** of the series, <u>Anxious for Nothing</u>.¹ So far in this series we have learned some important reasons to NOT be anxious:

- **God is SOVEREIGN** so He is in control of all things!
- "The Lord is NEAR" (Phil. 4:5) to receive our anxieties and our expressions of thanksgiving!
- The LORD will bring us safely through every storm of life – so let us trust in Him in every circumstance!

Today, **in part 4**, we will focus on the relationship between *abiding in Jesus <u>and</u> *being fruitful! But first, *God saved us*!

 God Saved Us: The Bible makes it clear that from conception we were spiritually <u>blind</u> (1Co. 2:14), <u>dead</u> (Eph. 2:1), and <u>enemies of God</u> (Rom. 8:7). Therefore, God the

Father, by the Holy Spirit and through holy baptism, took LOVING AND POWERFUL ACTION to clothe us in Christ (Tit. 3:4-7; Rom. 6:4; Gal. 3:27; Acts 2:38-39). So, let us give thanks to God and to our parents—since they \$took us to be baptized and \$helped us grow as believers in Jesus! Now that we are IN CHRIST, *let us abide in Christ*!

- Abide in Me: In John 15, Jesus said those words repeatedly. Abide comes from the Greek word, meno (μένω), which means to "remain" or "continue." Those who abide in Jesus to the end of their lives will go to heaven[©], but all who stop abiding will go to hell[®]. Since abiding is SO IMPORTANT, what should we do?
 - a. <u>Keep believing</u>: NAS John 8:31 "If you abide in My word, then you are truly disciples of Mine..." // To abide in Jesus' word means to keep believing whatever He says. For us to believe it, we must know it. For us to know it, we must hear it, read it, study it, and memorize it.
 - b. Evil, good: NAU Psalm 37:27 "Depart from evil and do good, so you will abide forever." // Since we are
 saved sinners and *learning the Bible, let us gladly
 turn from evil and *embrace what is good!
 - c. <u>No, yes</u>: NAU 2 John 1:9 "Anyone who goes too far and does not abide in the teaching of Christ, does not have God; the one who abides in the teaching, he has both the Father and the Son." // Abiding is critical.
 - d. <u>Confidence</u>: ^{NAU} 1 John 2:28 "...abide in [Jesus], so that when He appears, we may have confidence and not shrink away from Him in shame at His coming." // Since
 Jesus is coming <u>and</u> > only those who abide in Him will be welcomed in, *let us make abiding our top priority*!

3. Being Fruitful: For all who believe in Jesus, ⇒<u>fruitfulness</u> is important, BUT ⇒ABIDING SHOULD BE THE FOCUS!

- a. In John 15, Jesus said a lot about gardening:
 - i. **God** is the gardener *He prunes*.
 - ii. **Jesus** is the vine *He nourishes the branches*.
 - iii. Believers are the branches they abide in the vine.
 - iv. **Fruit** *is produced thru the branches*; two kinds:
 - <u>The fruit of the Spirit</u>: When the HS is living in us, *our lives will be showing:* "...love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control" (Gal. 5:22-23 NAU).
 - <u>The fruit of us</u>: *Certain of heaven <u>and</u> *wanting others to be IN CHRIST, we share God's saving truth: "The fruit of the righteous is a tree of life, and he who is wise wins souls" (Prov. 11:30).
- b. Some key verses in John 15:
 - i. Removing: ^{2a} "Every branch in Me that does not bear fruit, He takes away..." // A fruitless branch is a dead branch, *it is no longer abiding in Jesus*. Therefore, Jesus said, ⁶ "they gather them, and cast them into the fire and they are burned."
 - ii. Pruning: ^{2b} "...every branch that bears fruit, [God] prunes it so that it may bear more fruit. // Pruning is like Olympic training, both are difficult and extreme, BUT they effectively produce fruit or win medals!
 - iii. Source of fruitfulness: ⁴ "...As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself unless it abides in the vine, so neither *can* you unless you abide in Me." // Let us focus on abiding, *and the fruit will come naturally*.

- iv. Help in fruitfulness: ⁷ "If you abide in Me, and My words abide in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you." // All who abide will bear fruit. Doing so is not easy but important, so all who abide in Jesus should gladly pray for God's help!
- v. Results of fruitfulness: ⁸ "My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit, and so prove to be My disciples." // Since God has saved us, *He has changed us on the inside*; <u>now</u> we *love Him and *want to glorify Him. As we bear fruit, we *praise, honor, and magnify our Great God and *verify our confession that we are abiding in Jesus!
- 4. Anxiety-Free Fruitfulness: Let us go back to the vine, the branches, and the fruit. As the focus of a branch is to receive nourishment from the vine, so our focus is to receive nourishment from Jesus! As healthy branches of Christ, free from anxiety, the fruit will come <u>naturally</u>!

- Truth God speaks to us through the Bible, so let us listen carefully to learn what He desires!
- <u>Relevance</u> As we can swing a hammer to drive a nail, so God can use us to accomplish what He desires!
- Inspiration Since God is almighty in power, there is no limit to what He can accomplish through us!
