

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: We are in Mark chapter 7, focusing on the topics of Scripture and tradition.

1. The Traditions of the Elders: ¹ The Pharisees and some of the scribes gathered around [Jesus] when they had come from Jerusalem, ² and had seen that some of His disciples were eating their bread with impure hands, that is, unwashed. ³ (For the Pharisees and all the Jews do not eat unless they carefully wash their hands, thus observing the traditions of the elders; ⁴ and when they come from the market place, they do not eat unless they cleanse themselves; and there are many other things which they have received in order to observe, such as the washing of cups and pitchers and copper pots.) // The traditions of the elders are "...practical rules handed down by learned

Rabbis..." (Lenski, 283). Oftentimes, they took a law of God and put a fence around it. In other words, the house is the law, but they expanded the law to the property lines. For example, the Bible required the OT priests to wash before they served in the temple (Ex. 30:17-21), so they expanded it to washing when they come from the marketplace.

2. Tradition Over Scripture:

- a. <u>Blind to the truth</u>: ⁵ The Pharisees and the scribes asked Him, "Why do Your disciples not walk according to the tradition of the elders, but eat their bread with impure hands?" // Rules can be good, but for the Pharisees and the scribes, "'the tradition' was placed above the [Scriptures]" (284), which is upside down! They were "so steeped in their traditionalism... that they [were] utterly blind to the true teaching of their own divine Torah" (Lenski, 286). <u>Unfortunately</u>, that is also true in many church bodies today: They read from the Bible giving the impression they believe it, but they teach some things that are false! Two examples:
 - i. <u>6-Day creation</u>: The Bible is crystal clear; read Genesis 1, etc.; however, in a 2014 Pew Research Poll, ONLY the LCMS (Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod) and the SBC (Southern Baptist Convention), of all those polled, are firmly in agreement with the Bible.¹
 - ii. <u>Faith alone</u>: The Bible is crystal clear; read John 3:16; 5:24; 6:47; Rom. 3:28; 1Jo. 5:12; etc., etc., etc.; however, the RCC and OC officially teach faith + works and, according to a 2017 Pew Research poll, half of protestants also believe faith + works[©] ^(C) ^(C).²

- b. <u>Actors</u>: ⁶ And He said to them, "Rightly did Isaiah prophesy of you hypocrites, as it is written: 'THIS PEOPLE HONORS ME WITH THEIR LIPS, BUT THEIR HEART IS FAR AWAY FROM ME. ⁷ 'BUT IN VAIN DO THEY WORSHIP ME, TEACHING AS DOCTRINES THE PRECEPTS OF MEN.' ⁸ "Neglecting the commandment of God, you hold to the tradition of men." // Jesus called the leaders hypocrites, thus actors; they pretended to be devout followers of God, yet they ignored God's ways and followed their own. Three important points:
 - i. <u>Bible weight</u>: It **is** GOD'S WORD, so it **is** MUCH HEAVIER than every other word!
 - Bible interpretation: Historical Grammatical It means what it says! Historical Critical – What does it really mean? Sadly☺, most now use the latter, HC which is *complicated, *foolish, and *dangerous!
 - iii. <u>Our sinful hearts</u>: Jesus said, "...out of the heart of men, proceed the evil thoughts, fornications... deeds of coveting *and* wickedness, *as well as* deceit... envy... pride *and* foolishness" (Mk. 7:21-22). So, *it is always best to go with God's Word*!
- c. <u>Actor example</u>: ⁹ He was also saying to them, "You are experts at setting aside the commandment of God in order to keep your tradition. ¹⁰ "For Moses said, 'HONOR YOUR FATHER AND YOUR MOTHER'; and, 'HE WHO SPEAKS EVIL OF FATHER OR MOTHER, IS TO BE PUT TO DEATH'; ¹¹ but you say, 'If a man says to *his* father or *his* mother, whatever I have that would help you is Corban (that is to say, given *to God*),' ¹² you no longer permit him to do anything for *his* father or *his* mother; ¹³ *thus* invalidating the word of God by your

tradition which you have handed down; and you do many things such as that." // God's command is clear about children to parents – HONOR, yet they canceled God's commandment. Similar things are done today:

- Infant baptism: Since children have sin (Ps. 51:5), need Jesus (John 14:6), and should be baptized first and taught second (Matt. 28:19-20), God acts through baptism (Eph. 2:4-5; Acts 2:38-39) to save them! Yet today, many well-intentioned pastors and parents use human reason to overturn God's Word.
- ii. <u>Stewardship</u>: God calls us to honor Him with our money (see our <u>Tithing brochure</u>) **AND** our abilities (Rom. 12:1-8; 1Co. 12:4-31a). However, some have chosen to practice one while neglecting the other.
- 3. A Sharp Distinction Between Scripture and Tradition: We have traditions, like our Ascension Day meal, yet all BLC teachings are based ONLY on the Holy Scriptures (in the RCC, they give equal weight to the Bible, tradition, and reason[®]). Challenge me to show you the Bible basis for any teaching!

- <u>Truth</u> Scriptures from God; traditions from people.
- <u>Relevance</u> Scripture saving truth; tradition should never contradict Scripture.
- Inspiration Blessed with our own Bibles, let us *read,
