

Introduction: <u>Dear friends in Christ</u>: So far in this sermon series, we have covered about 4,000 years of history:

- ✓ 1,700 Adam through the flood
- ✓ 300 the flood to Abraham
- ✓ 2,000 Abraham to Jesus

During that time, \Rightarrow the people kept doing wrong, BUT \Rightarrow God kept following His plan to redeem the world through His Son.

Today, we focus on JESUS, **†who** He is, **†what** He did, and **†why** He did it.

1. JESUS – Who He Is<mark>:</mark>

- a. Initially, He was only the Son of God:
 - i. He was with God the Father in the beginning: "In the beginning was the <u>Word</u> [Son], and the Word was with <u>God</u> [Father], and the Word was God" (John 1:1).
 - ii. He is the One through whom God the Father created all things: "All things came into being through Him..." (John 1:3).

- iii. He is the promised descendant of Eve: He would +battle Satan and +be injured by Satan, BUT He would also +defeat Satan. God said to Satan, "He [Jesus] shall bruise you on the head, and you [Satan] shall bruise Him on the heel" (Genesis 3:15).
- iv. Many things in the OT pointed ahead to His coming and work: He would be ♥Abraham's ultimate descendant, ♥Isaac's ultimate replacement, ♥the ultimate Passover Lamb, ♥the ultimate fulfillment of every blood sacrifice, ♥the ultimate defeater of our enemies, ♥the ultimate rest for our salvation, and ♥the Leader into the ultimate Promised Land!
- b. In the fulness of time, He put on human flesh:
 - From the beginning He was the Word the Son of God, then: "the Word became flesh, and dwelt among us..." (John 1:14).
 - ii. Jesus made a HUGE connection between Himself and the OT: He said, "...the Scriptures... testify about Me" (John 5:39).
- JESUS What He Did: The BIG 5 [™]; there are certainly more than 5, but most have 5 digits on each hand.
 - a. <u>Birth</u>: This part begins with conception; Gabriel said to Mary, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you" (Luke 1:35). <u>What does that mean</u>? We confess in the Nicene Creed: The Son of God "was incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the Virgin Mary and was made man..." So, by the Holy Spirit, the Son of God put on human flesh! Then, as prophesied (Micah 5:2), He was born in Bethlehem of Judea (Luke 2:1-7).

- b. <u>Life</u>:
 - Jesus repeatedly showed the connection between Himself and God the Father: He said, "I and the Father are one" (John 10:30), and Peter said, God performed "miracles and wonders and signs... through [Jesus]" (Acts 2:22).
 - ii. Jesus was our sinless substitute: being "tempted in all things as we are, yet without sin" (Heb. 4:15).
 - iii. Jesus is the Christ: When the high priest asked Him, "Are You the Christ...?" [He said,] "I am..." (Mark 14:61-62).
- c. <u>Death</u>: We were born to live, yet our sins have brought the penalties of death and hell upon us (Rom. 6:23). But Jesus was born to die to deliver us from death and hell (1 Peter 2:24)! So, Jesus, †in perfect obedience to His Father and †with great love for us, laid down His life!
- d. <u>Resurrection</u>: *Jesus did die, *His body was pierced with a spear probably through His heart, and *His body was placed in a new tomb on Good Friday. Even though Jesus said He would "be raised up on the third day" (Matt. 16:21), none of His followers understood.
 But God did raise Jesus to life for many reasons:
 - i. To prove the truth of what Jesus taught!
 - ii. To show His acceptance of Jesus' sacrifice!
 - iii. To prove Jesus' victory over sin, death, and Satan!
- e. <u>Ascension</u>: →Jesus' death was so horrible and →His resurrection so wonderful, *but who would believe it!* So, *between Jesus being raised and ascending*, the Bible says that "He appeared to Cephas, then to the

twelve.... [And] to more than five hundred brethren at one time" (1 Cor. 15:5-6). Then, after giving important final instructions – **call everyone to repent and believe**, He "was carried up into heaven" (Luke 24:46-51).

3. JESUS – Why He Did It: Three HUGE events:

- a. <u>Creation</u>: *The Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit* ⇒loved us, ⇒made a perfect world, and ⇒made sinless people who would live forever in perfect harmony with God and all.
- b. <u>Fall</u>: Satan tempted the people and they fell which ruined the relationship between [⊕]people and God and [⊕]people and people.
- c. <u>Salvation</u>: Since God's love is greater than Satan and sin, the Holy Trinity worked together to save the world:
 ➡God the Father planning, ➡God the Son doing the work, and ➡God the Holy Spirit ©clothing repentant ones in Christ and ©making them members of God's kingdom!

Conclusion<mark>:</mark>

- <u>Truth</u> The God-Man created, saved, and will come again!
- <u>Relevance</u> Jesus lived, died, and rose for every person!
- Inspiration God welcomes all who repent and believe!
