

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: Many are interested in the book of Revelation. The book records a vision given to the apostle John about future events. John (Ch 1) saw Jesus in all His glory, (Ch 2-3) received the seven letters for the seven congregations in Asia Minor, (Ch 4-5) saw the awesome throne room in heaven, (Ch 6) saw the opening of six of the seven seals, which ends with the wrath of the Lamb of God and NO ONE being able to stand before Him.

Now, in the face of total despair, chapter 7 is a pause in the action and a vision of encouragement. Dr. Becker wrote: "The scenes described in Revelation 7 are the first of a number of visions¹ in which the Holy Ghost portrays the glorious hope that ought to live in the heart of a believing child of God" (120).

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¹ The security and hope of God's people: 11:15-19; 14:1-5; 19:1-8; 21:1-22:5

In the first part of **chapter 7**, before four angels harm the earth and sea, they are commanded to put a seal on the foreheads of **all the servants of God**, that is, **144,000**. That number is **10** x **10** x **10** x **12** x **12**, which symbolizes **ALL OT and NT believers** – all whom God has chosen to be His own from before the creation of the world (Eph. 1:3-4). Now, in **7:9-17**, we focus on the eternal happiness of God's servants:

- 1. The People and Their Praise: 9 After these things I looked, and behold, a great multitude which no one could count [thus, the 144,000 is NOT literal], from every nation and all tribes and peoples and tongues, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, clothed in white robes [wearing God's gift of righteousness], and palm branches were in their hands [indicating that they are sharers in Jesus' victory over sin and death]; 10 and they cry out with a loud voice, saying, "Salvation to our God who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb." // Wow! A HUGE number of people – from ▶every nation, and ▶every tribe within every nation, and *speaking every language in the world, and having every skin color in the world, **BUT** they are all united together as the ©children of God and ©servants of God – giving God and the Lamb ALL THE PRAISE for their salvation! Just like us, they know their sins deserve hell; **BUT**, since they have heaven, they SHOUT their praises!
- 2. The Angels and Their Praise: ¹¹ And all the angels were standing around the throne and around the elders [24 of them (4:4), probably 12 representing the OT Church and 12 the NT Church] and the four living creatures; and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshiped God, ¹² saying, "Amen, blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving

and <u>honor</u> and <u>power</u> and <u>might</u>, *be* to our God forever and ever. Amen." // God is God – OVER ALL!

- a. So sad and horrible for all who reject Him:
 - The holy angels, who rejected God as their God, became demons, and are destined for the lake of fire.
 - ii. All people who reject Jesus as Savior and Lord ②automatically reject God the Father (Luke 10:16) and ③will be with the demons in eternity.
- b. The holy angels: God made them, God is their God, and they gladly pile up seven words of perfect praise upon Him!
- 3. The Saints and Their Purity: 13 Then one of the elders answered, saying to me, "These who are clothed in the white robes, who are they, and where have they come from?" [Jeopardy his answer is in the form of a question!] 14 I said to him, "My lord, you know." [Thus, you tell me.] And he said to me, "These are the ones who come [lit., coming] out of the great tribulation, and they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb."
 - a. The ones who come out of the great tribulation: Great tribulation It's not to come; instead, we live in the middle of it. Dr. Becker wrote: "John sees [the Christians] 'coming out' ...as a continuous...process. Every time one of the 144,000...dies, he 'comes out of' the great tribulation..." (124).
 - b. White robes because of the blood of the Lamb: We are all covered with filth because of our sins, **BUT** "the blood of Jesus... cleanses us from **all sin**" (1 John 1:7).

- 4. The Activity of the Saints: 15 "For this reason [because they have been washed in the blood of the Lamb], they are before the throne of God; and they serve [worship; Rom. 12:1] Him day and night in His temple; and He who sits on the throne will spread His tabernacle over them. // We pray: Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Here, we struggle to do God's will; there, we will gladly and perfectly do God's will always, day and night. Even now, let's give our best!
- 5. The Blessedness of the Saints: ¹⁶ They will hunger no longer, nor thirst anymore; nor will the sun beat down on them, nor any heat [all such things can be miserable]; [But why will all such things be gone?] ¹⁷ for the Lamb in the center of the throne will be their shepherd, and will guide them to springs of the water of life; and God will wipe every tear from their eyes." // Psalm 23: "The Lord is my shepherd—I have everything I need" (AAT). That is true now, but it will be SO AMAZING in eternity!

Conclusion:

- Truth Everyone will be somewhere in eternity!
- Relevance The Triune God is calling everyone to know Him, serve Him, and have a most happy eternity!
- Inspiration As we anticipate heaven, may the Joy move us now to gladly follow God's will in our lives!
