Text: Luke 21:5-28 NAS 1995

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: On Tuesday of Holy Week, a few days before Good Friday, Jesus told His disciples about the coming *deception, *trouble, *persecution, and *destruction. Then He told them how to respond! What happened? Let's hear what Jesus said:

- 1. Jesus mentions the destruction of the temple: ⁵ And while some were talking about the temple, that it was adorned with beautiful stones and votive gifts, He said, ⁶ "As for these things which you are looking at [that is, the temple itself], the days will come in which there will not be left one stone upon another which will not be torn down."
 - a. <u>The temple mount</u>: wall of stones—16 feet thick and, in some places, 20 stories high, the stones—weighed between 2 and 400 tons (that is, 4,000 and 800,000 lbs.).
 - b. <u>Herod's temple</u>: construction took a workforce of over 10,000; it was "shining white marble and gold, with bronze entrance doors, it was said that you could not look at the temple in daylight as it would blind you."¹

- 2. <u>Jesus' disciples asked when and for a sign</u>: ⁷ They questioned Him, saying, "Teacher, <u>when</u> therefore will these things happen [to the temple]? And <u>what will be the sign</u> when these things are about to take place?"
- 3. <u>Jesus answered: Do not be deceived</u>: ⁸ And He said, "See to it that you are not misled; for many will come in My name, saying, '<u>lam</u> He [that is, Yahweh],' and, 'The time is near.' Do not go after them." // Then He said why...
- 4. Jesus told what would precede the destruction: ⁹ "When you hear of wars and disturbances [that is, political unrest, turmoil, revolution, insurrection], do not be terrified; for these things must take place first, but the end [of the Jewish nation] does not follow immediately." ¹⁰ Then He continued by saying to them, "Nation will rise against nation and kingdom against kingdom, ¹¹ and there will be great earthquakes, and in various places plagues and famines; and there will be terrors and great signs from heaven [such as meteors, comets, and eclipses]."

12 "But before all these things, they will lay their hands on you and will persecute you [that is, they will pressure you to reject me, by], delivering you to the synagogues and prisons, bringing you before kings and governors for My name's sake. 13 It will lead to an opportunity for your testimony. 14 So make up your minds not to prepare beforehand to defend yourselves; 15 for I will give you utterance [that is, the very words to say] and wisdom which none of your opponents will be able to resist or refute."

¹⁶ "But <u>you will be betrayed</u> even by parents and brothers and relatives and friends, and they will put *some* of you to death, ¹⁷ and you will be hated by all because of My name. ¹⁸ Yet not a hair of your head will perish. ¹⁹ By your

endurance [not giving up] you will gain your lives." // Lenski: "When a disciple suffers... death through wicked men, let him not think that God has forgotten him—he is in God's care and keeping to the last hair of his head" (1017).

- 5. Jesus told when and how to respond: ²⁰ "But when you see Jerusalem surrounded by [Roman] armies, then recognize that her desolation is near. ²¹ Then those who are in Judea must flee to the mountains, and those who are in the midst of the city must leave, and those who are in the country must not enter the city; ²² because these are days of vengeance, so that all things which are written will be fulfilled." // In Judea—flee; in Jerusalem—leave; in the country—do not enter the city!
- 6. <u>Jesus told of the coming difficulties</u>: ²³ "Woe to those who are <u>pregnant</u> and to those who are <u>nursing</u> babies in those days; for there will be great distress upon the land and wrath to this people; ²⁴ and they will <u>fall by the edge of the sword</u>, and will be <u>led captive</u> into all the nations; and Jerusalem will be trampled underfoot by the Gentiles <u>until the times of the Gentiles are fulfilled</u> [that is, until Jesus' second coming]."
 - a. What happened? Jesus' words came true AND many ignored His advice to flee and leave and not enter! "It is estimated by the ancient historians <u>Tacitus</u> (AD 56-118) and <u>Josephus</u> (AD 36-100) that there were about **1,100,000 people killed** in the siege [and **97,000 taken captive** (Lenski, 1021)]. Males aged 17 and older were either put in hard labor camps or made to be gladiators. <u>Women</u> and children were sold into slavery."²

- b. Why is what happened significant? As the **unlikely** destruction happened in AD 70, so Jesus' **unlikely** return will also happen just as He said!
- 7. Jesus told about His second coming: ²⁵ "There will be signs in sun and moon and stars [sun—darkened, moon—no light, stars—will fall from the sky (Matt. 24:29)], and on the earth dismay [severe emotional stress] among nations, in perplexity [anxiety—why?] at the roaring of the sea and the waves, [and how else will the unrepentant respond?], ²⁶ men fainting from fear and the expectation of the things which are coming upon the world [why?]; for the powers of the heavens will be shaken. ²⁷ Then they [that is, all who are living on the earth] will see THE SON OF MAN COMING IN A CLOUD with power and great glory. ²⁸ But when these things begin to take place, [you, my disciples / Christians / repentant ones] straighten up and lift up your heads, because your redemption [rescue, deliverance] is drawing near."

Take Aways:

- Truth Regarding Herod's temple, Jesus said what seemed impossible – BUT IT HAPPENED!
- <u>Relevance</u> Regarding Jesus' return, Jesus said what seems impossible – <u>BUT LET US KNOW IT WILL HAPPEN!</u>
- Inspiration When we are repentant, we are ready! Since we care about others, let us call them to repentance!
