

- Sunday: Pastor will lead you through this same folder, alone with the Lord's Supper.



This Service Is Divine Service, Setting Three (Adapted from Lutheran Service Book, 184-202).

- L: Jesus is coming!

PRESERVICE CONFESSION and ABSOLUTION

(Isaiah 40:8; Rom. 3:23; 5:6-8; John 3:16; 1:29; John 20:21-23)

- L: <u>Dear brothers and sisters in Christ</u>: Since we believe God's Word over our feelings, *we know we have sinned and *we know we cannot save ourselves.
- C: We also know about:
 - **→** God's great love,
 - **→** Jesus' sinless life, and
 - **→** Jesus' perfect sacrifice.
- L: Now, being confident that God will be merciful to us, let us confess our wrongs.
- A: Almighty God, since You know everything:
 - ⇒ show us our sins,

OLD TESTAMENT: Isaiah 7:10-16 NAS-95

What was the situation? Ahaz, the king of Judah, was filled with great fear – because Syria and Israel were planning to attack!

How did the LORD help? He sent Isaiah to tell Ahaz to not be afraid – because Syria and Israel would not attack.

This is how the LORD tried to give assurance to Ahaz: 10 ...the LORD spoke to Ahaz: 11 "Ask a sign of the LORD your God; let it be deep as Sheol [as hell] or high as heaven." 12 But Ahaz said, "I will not ask, and I will not put the LORD to the test." // Ahaz did not ask because he did not believe.

<u>Isaiah expressed his disappointment</u>: ¹³ **Isaiah** said, "Hear then, O house of David [referring to Ahaz and all of Judah]! Is it too little for you to weary men, that you weary my God also?

So, the LORD gave two signs:

- The sign AFTER the lifetime of Ahaz:
 ¹⁴ Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel.
- 2. The sign DURING the lifetime of Ahaz: ¹⁵ He [speaking of another child to be born] shall eat curds and honey [a sign of restoration in the land] when he knows how to refuse the evil and choose the good [pointing to a time of some maturity for the child]. ¹⁶ For before the boy knows how to refuse the evil and choose the good, the land whose two kings you dread will be deserted. // That is the reason why Ahaz should not fear; the nations who thought they would conquer would themselves be conquered. Let us always trust the LORD and be at peace!

EPISTLE: Romans 1:1-7 NAS-95

Look for *Paul's identity, *Jesus' identify, and *the great blessings we have through Jesus!

One long sentence as Paul begins his very important letter to the Christians in Rome.

¹ Paul, a bond-servant of Christ Jesus, called *as* an apostle, set apart for the gospel of God, ² which He promised beforehand through His prophets in the holy Scriptures, ³ concerning His Son, who was born of a descendant of David according to the flesh, ⁴ who was declared the Son of God with power by the resurrection from the dead, according to the Spirit of holiness, Jesus Christ our Lord, ⁵ through whom we have received grace and apostleship to bring about *the* obedience of faith among all the Gentiles for His name's sake, ⁶ among whom you also are the called of Jesus Christ; ⁷ to all who are beloved of God in Rome, called *as* saints: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

L: The Word of the Lord.

C: Thanks be to God!

HOLY GOSPEL: Matthew 1:18-25 NAS-95

Let Us Marvel at the Birth of Our Savior

L: The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, the first chapter.

C: Glory to You, O LORD.

¹⁸ Now the birth of Jesus Christ was as follows:

- when His mother Mary had been betrothed to Joseph, before they came together she was found to be with child by the Holy Spirit. ¹⁹ And Joseph her husband, being a righteous man and not wanting to disgrace her, planned to send her away secretly.
- 20 But when he had considered this, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife; for the Child who has been conceived in her is of the Holy Spirit. 21 She will bear a Son; and you shall call His name Jesus, for He will save His people from their sins."
- Now all this took place to fulfill what was spoken by the Lord through the prophet: ²³ "BEHOLD, THE VIRGIN SHALL BE WITH CHILD AND SHALL BEAR A SON, AND THEY SHALL CALL HIS NAME IMMANUEL," which translated means, "GOD WITH US."
- And Joseph awoke from his sleep and did as the angel of the Lord commanded him,

and took *Mary* as his wife, ²⁵ but kept her a virgin until she gave birth to a Son; and he called His name Jesus.

L: The Gospel of the Lord.

Sunday THE SERVICE OF THE SACRAMENT

SUPPER PREPARATION -

LORD'S SUPPER SELF-EXAMINATION:

The Supper can certainly give us much assurance that our sins are forgiven through Jesus, but self-examination is essential: "Let a person examine himself" (1Co. 11:28 ESV).



Part 1: Am I a Christian?

- 1. Do I believe the Bible is true? Y N
- 2. **Am I sorry for my sins** (admitting them and wanting to turn from them)? Y N

- 3. Am I trusting in Jesus alone (in who He is the Son of God, and what He did living as my sinless substitute, receiving my sins and eternal punishment, and laying down His life) for my entrance into heaven? Y N
- 4. Am I baptized? Y N
- 5. Do I desire to live for Christ? Y N

<u>Summary</u>: A Christian knows the Bible is true, is sorry for his sins, is trusting in Jesus alone for eternal life, has been baptized into Christ, and desires to live for Christ! If those things are true for you, *then you are a Christian!* If not, let's schedule a time to talk!

Part 2: Am I right with others?

- 1. Am I reconciled with others? Y N
- 2. Am I forgiving others? Y N

<u>Summary</u>: Even if others refuse to reconcile or accept our forgiveness, it is vital for us to try to work things out and extend forgiveness! Are such things true in your life? If not, repent!

<u>Part 3</u>: Do I believe what the Bible says about the Lord's Supper?

- Are the elements of the Lord's Supper bread, body, wine, and blood? Y N
- 2. Is the main benefit of the Supper the assurance of the forgiveness of sins? Y N

<u>Summary</u>: Since all have sinned (Rom. 3:23), Jesus gave His body and shed His blood to provide forgiveness. In the Lord's Supper, by the power of God, Jesus' given body has been united to the bread and Jesus' shed blood has been united to the wine. Since Christians cannot live sinless lives (Eccl. 7:20), the Lord's Supper is God's way of assuring us that – *in Christ* – we are forgiven. Do you believe such things? If not, let's schedule a time to talk!

↑ THE WORDS OF OUR LORD: Spoken on the evening before He finished His saving work!

PAX DOMINI: The Peace of the Lord

L: The peace of the Lord be with you always!

C: Amen

READ → THINK → SHARE:

Read: "...the Lord himself will give you a sign. Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel" (Isaiah 7:14 NAS-95).

<u>Think</u>: Apart from modern medicine, a virgin cannot have a child! *Yet God promised it and caused it to happen!* Why? Who was the virgin? Who was the child? He came for your benefit, but are you receiving those benefits?
