His Final Steps...

Led to His Father's House

Text: Selections from Matthew 21:12-17 NAS 1995

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: During these Wednesdays of Lent, we are on a journey with Jesus as He takes His final steps toward the cross.

- Ash Wednesday Jesus' final steps led to the tomb of Lazarus, about 2 to 4 weeks before Good Friday, then Jesus raised the very dead Lazarus back to life!
- <u>Last Wednesday</u> Jesus' final steps led to the home of Lazarus, Mary, and Martha, on the Saturday before Palm Sunday – when Mary anointed Jesus with a very expensive perfume in preparation for His burial!
- <u>Today</u> Jesus' final steps led to the temple in Jerusalem, on Holy Monday – where Jesus did things that were *shocking, *wonderful, *anger-inducing, and *instructive! Today we are in <u>Matthew chapter 21</u>:
- 1. Jesus Cleansed the Temple: ¹² And Jesus entered the temple [complex] and drove out all those who were buying and selling in the temple [that is, the Court of the Gentiles], and overturned the tables of the money changers and the seats of those who were selling doves. ¹³ And He said to them, "It is written, 'MY HOUSE SHALL BE CALLED A HOUSE OF PRAYER'; but you are making it a ROBBERS' DEN."

a. Within the Temple: There were separate areas for priests, Jewish men, Jewish women, and Gentiles. Each area was intended for gathering, praying, and worshiping, but, at the time of Jesus, the Court of the Gentiles had become a place for exchanging money and buying an animal for sacrifice. Astrange scene: The lowing of the cattle, the bleating of the sheep and lambs, the cooing of the doves, the cry of the venders, the clink of money, all this in the place which was sacred to the name of God. [At the time of Jesus:]

"...the priests were often deriving benefit from this [money-changing and animal-selling] arrangement by [making money from those businesses]... / cheating and overreaching was the order of the day" (Kretzmann).



b. <u>Den of Robbers</u>: <u>Why did Jesus say that</u>? 600 years earlier, the LORD spoke these words through Jeremiah: "Will you steal, murder, and commit adultery and swear falsely, and offer sacrifices to Baal and walk after other gods that you have not known, then come and stand before Me in this house, which is called by My name, and say, 'We are delivered!'...? Has this house, which is called by My name, become a den of robbers...?" (Jer. 7:9-11). People WRONGLY thought they could ***** continue in sin **and**, at the same time, ***** have God's forgiveness ...

- 3. The Jewish Leaders Became Angry: ¹⁵ But when the chief priests and the scribes saw the wonderful things that He had done, and the children who were shouting in the temple, "Hosanna to the Son of David," they became indignant [angry] ¹⁶ and said to Him, "Do You hear what these children are saying?"
 - a. The Bible is clear from the Gospel according to Mark that Jesus was welcomed as The Promised Messiah
 by the crowds on Palm Sunday and by the children in the temple on Holy Monday. They both shouted, "Hosanna to the Son of David." In other words: Jesus, the promised Messiah, save us, we pray!
 - b. Since Jesus *drove out the changers and merchants without the permission of the Jewish leaders AND *accepted the Messianic-directed praise of the children, those leaders were steaming mad!
- 4. Jesus Explained the Scriptures: And Jesus said to them, "Yes; have you never read, 'OUT OF THE MOUTH OF INFANTS AND NURSING BABIES YOU HAVE PREPARED PRAISE FOR YOURSELF' [Ps. 8:2]?"
 - a. What is normal? The adults know more than the children. But what happened on Holy Monday in the

- Court of the Gentiles? The children understood, so they responded with proper praise. But the learned Jewish leaders, who were spiritually dead and blinded to their own wickedness, did **not** recognize Jesus, so they did **not** praise Him as the Messiah.
- b. Then, to help the Jewish leaders get it about who He is and what was going on, Jesus quoted Psalm 8:2 as the fulfillment of what they had just witnessed. Would some of them, by God's grace, finally ▶see the connection, ▶recognize Jesus, ▶repent of their sins, and ▶embrace Him as Savior? Some did; thanks be to God!
- 5. Jesus Left Jerusalem: ¹⁷ And He left them and went out of the city to Bethany, and spent the night there. // Each day for Jesus had to be very intense †as His arrest, beatings, and crucifixion drew near, and †with His many encounters and challenges from the Jewish leaders. So Jesus followed His practice of leaving Jerusalem each day to travel the two miles to Bethany to stay at the home of Lazarus, Mary, and Martha.

Let Us Pray: Dearest Jesus, with Your cleansing of the temple – You showed love for the Gentiles, with Your reference to the den of robbers – You called the Jewish leaders to repent, with Your healing of the blind and lame – You showed the loving power of God, and with Your acceptance of praise from the children – You identified Yourself as the Promised Messiah. Now, please help us to be sorry for our sins, always trust in You for eternal life, and honor You in all our lives!
