

Introduction: Dear friends: Please close your eyes and keep them closed; now, put your hand in front of your face; <u>can</u> you see it? (No!) Okay, open your eyes. Since the physically blind **cannot** see something physical that is right in front of them, so the spiritually blind **cannot** see *****<u>the condemning</u> power of sin, *****<u>the truth of the Bible</u>, nor *****<u>the saving work of</u> Jesus. Today, we focus on physical and spiritual sight!

- The Setting: As [Jesus] passed by [various people], He saw a man blind from birth.² And His disciples asked Him, "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he would be born blind?" ³ Jesus answered, "It was neither that this man sinned, nor his parents; but it was so that the works of God might be displayed in him." ... // God permitted his blindness, so that Jesus could heal him.
- The Miracle: ⁶ When He had said this, He spat on the ground, and made clay of the spittle, and applied the clay to his eyes, ⁷ and said to him, "Go, wash in the pool of Siloam" (which is translated, Sent). So, he went away and

washed, and came back seeing. // The blind man
permitted Jesus to apply the mud; then he *listened,
*washed, and *was healed – but he never saw Jesus.

- 3. Disagreement About the Man's Identity: ⁸ Therefore the neighbors, and those who previously saw him as a beggar, were saying, "Is not this the one who used to sit and beg?" ⁹ Others were saying, "This is he," still others were saying, "No, but he is like him." He kept saying, "I am the one." ... // From *blind, *sitting, and *begging his whole life to *seeing, *standing, and *rejoicing was TOO MUCH for some to believe; it seemed impossible!
- 4. Disagreement About Jesus: ¹³ They brought to the Pharisees the man who was formerly blind. ¹⁴ Now it was a Sabbath on the day when Jesus made the clay and opened his eyes....¹⁶ Therefore some of the Pharisees were saying, "This man is not from God, because He does not keep the Sabbath." But others were saying, "How can a man who is a sinner perform such signs?" And there was a division among them. // God established the 7-day week by creating on 1-6 and resting on 7. He did that for our benefit – so we would be sure to take one day every week to *rest from our work and *focus on Him! BUT JESUS IS GREATER THAN THE SABBATH (see Matt. 12:1-13)!
- 5. Pharisees Questioned the Man and His Parents:
 - a. <u>The man</u>: ¹⁷ So they said to the blind man again, "What do you say about Him, since He opened your eyes?" And he said, "He is a prophet." // Good answer: God had done miracles through the prophets – parting the sea, healing the sick, raising the dead, etc.
 - b. <u>His parents</u>: ¹⁸ The Jews then did not believe *it* of him, that he had been blind and had received sight, until

they called the parents of the very one who had received his sight, ¹⁹ and questioned them, saying, "Is this your son, who you say was born blind? Then how does he now see?" ²⁰ His parents answered them and said, "We know that this is our son, and that he was born blind; ²¹ but how he now sees, we do not know... Ask him; he is of age, he will speak for himself." ... // His parents either did not know or were afraid to say. Let us NEVER be afraid to confess Jesus to others!

- c. <u>The man</u>: ²⁴ So a second time they called the man who had been blind, and said to him, "Give glory to God; we know that this man is a sinner." ²⁵ He then answered, "Whether He is a sinner, I do not know; one thing I do know, that though I was blind, now I see." // He was blind—*seeing nothing*; then healed—*seeing everything!* The CHANGE pointed to the GREAT SIGNIFICANCE of Jesus *who He is and *what He did!
- 6. Pharisees Showed Their Spiritual Blindness: ²⁸ They [said to the man], "You are His disciple, but we are disciples of Moses. ²⁹ We know that God has spoken to Moses, but as for this man, we do not know where He is from." // Moses said to the people: "The LORD your God will raise up for you a prophet like me from among you..., you shall listen to him" (Deut. 18:15). The Jewish leaders *should* have been looking for someone GREATER THAN MOSES! John wrote: "...the Law was given through Moses; grace and truth were realized through Jesus Christ" (Jn. 1:17).
- 7. The Man Pointed Out Their Spiritual Blindness: ³⁰ The man answered and said to them, "Well, here is an amazing thing, that you do not know where He is from, and yet He opened my eyes. ³¹ We know that God does

not hear sinners; but if anyone is God-fearing and does His will, He hears him. ³² Since the beginning of time it has never been heard that anyone opened the eyes of a person born blind. ³³ If this man were not from God, He could do nothing." ... // It was obvious – the man who healed him *feared God and *was from God. What did Isaiah write about the coming of the Messiah? "Then the eyes of the blind will be opened..." (Isa. 35:5). But sadly, the learned Jewish leaders were spiritually blind[©].

- 8. The Man Met Jesus: ³⁵ ...finding [the man], [Jesus] said, "Do you believe in the Son of Man?" ³⁶ He answered, "Who is He, Lord, that I may believe in Him?" ³⁷ Jesus said to him, "You have both seen Him, and He is the one who is talking with you." ³⁸ And he said, "Lord, I believe." And he worshiped Him. // "Son of Man" is another name for the Messiah, the Christ. By God's grace, the healed man *saw Jesus, *believed in Him, and *worshiped Him!
- 9. Jesus Wants the Spiritually Blind to See: ³⁹ And Jesus said, "For judgment I came into this world, so that those who do not see [are spiritually blind] may see [be saved], and that those who see [who think they are saved – like the Jewish leaders] may become blind [aware of their need for Jesus]." ⁴⁰ Those of the Pharisees who were with Him heard these things and said to Him, "We are not blind too, are we?" ⁴¹ Jesus said to them, "If you were blind [aware], you would have no sin; but since you say, 'We see,' your sin remains." // Let us <u>be aware</u> and <u>always embrace Jesus</u>!
