

Introduction: Dear friends: Jesus lived 2,000 years ago, but He should be SUPER-RELEVANT to everyone today because:

- + He is the Son of God!
- + He did take away the sin of the world!
- + He did make the one way to heaven for everyone!

This year on <u>Ash Wednesday (2/22)</u> we were in John chapter 11: *Lazarus was sick, *Lazarus died, and *many were sad. Then, when Lazarus had been dead for four days, **Jesus came and raised His body back to life!** Today we return to John 11 to discover how various people reacted to the *GREAT miracle*.

1. Many Believed, Some Snitched: ⁴⁵ Therefore many of the Jews who came to Mary, and saw what [Jesus] had done [having raised Lazarus from the dead], <u>believed</u> in Him. ⁴⁶ But some of them went to the Pharisees and <u>told</u> them the

things which Jesus had done. // Prior to Jesus raising Lazarus, He had raised others, but His raising of Lazarus was greater due to the length of time he had been dead. Think of the effects of the GREAT miracle:

- a. <u>Many believed</u>: Jesus ***** is the Messiah and *****taught the truth, so, by the HS, they trusted in Jesus for et. life.
- <u>Some snitched</u>: They *hardened their hearts, *rejected Jesus, and *told the Jewish leaders about the miracle.
- 2. The Jewish Leaders Worried about their Jobs and Nation: ⁴⁷ Therefore the chief priests and the Pharisees convened a council, and were saying, "What are we doing? For this man is performing many signs [miracles that identify Him to be the Promised Messiah]. ⁴⁸ If we let Him go on like this, all men will believe in Him, and the Romans will come and take away both our place and our <u>nation</u>."
 - a. <u>Job situation</u>: The Romans were politically wise. Since the Jews despised them, they put the Sanhedrin a group of 71 prominent Jewish men, between themselves and the Jewish people. It was the job of those leaders to control the people, but more and more of the Jews *ignored the leaders and believed in Jesus*. The leaders were failing, so their jobs were in jeopardy!
 - b. <u>Nation situation</u>: Rome permitted the Jews to live and practice their religion *if they behaved*. However, with more and more believing in Jesus, *the Romans could brutally intervene with military force and destruction*!
- The High Priest Sugar-Coated Evil: ⁴⁹ But one of them, Caiaphas, who was high priest that year, said to them, "You know nothing at all, ⁵⁰ nor do you take into account

that it is <u>expedient</u> [profitable, advantageous] for you that one man die for the people, and that the whole nation not perish." // Caiaphas was the leader of the Sanhedrin – the Jewish Ruling Council. He could have said, "Let's save ourselves and our nation by capturing and murdering Jesus." But, instead, he said something that **sounded** positive and beneficial for everyone, well, except Jesus!

- 4. God Used the Evil of the Jewish Leaders for Our Good: ⁵¹ Now [Caiaphas] did not say this on his own initiative, but being high priest that year, he prophesied that Jesus was going to die for the nation, ⁵² and not for the nation only, but in order that [Jesus] might also gather together into one the children of God who are scattered abroad. // Does God cause people to sin? No! James wrote, "God cannot be tempted by evil, and He Himself does not tempt anyone" (Jas. 1:13). However, God does use evil to accomplish His will. The evil Jewish leaders wanted to destroy Jesus, so God used their plan – working through Jesus – to †crush the head of Satan, †take away the sin of the world, and †gift all repentant ones with eternal life!
- 5. The Jewish Leaders Planned to Murder Jesus: ⁵³ So from that day on they planned together to kill [Jesus]. // The text says "kill" killing is NOT wrong *in a just war or
 * with capital punishment. But when an innocent person *like Jesus* is put to death on purpose, *that is murder*!
- Jesus Went Into Seclusion: ⁵⁴ Therefore Jesus no longer continued to walk publicly among the Jews, but went away from there to the country near the wilderness, into a city called Ephraim; and there He stayed with the disciples. // Jesus' time to complete His saving work was Page 3 of 4

drawing near, *but it had not quite arrived*. He had to wait for the Passover, *since He is THE ULTIMATE PASSOVER LAMB! Jesus and His disciples stayed in Ephraim – an undeveloped hill country, 13 miles NE of Jerusalem.*

- 7. Many Wanted to See Jesus: ⁵⁵ Now the Passover of the Jews was near, and many went up to Jerusalem out of the country before the Passover to purify themselves. ⁵⁶ So they were seeking for Jesus, and were saying to one another as they stood in the temple, "What do you think; that He will not come to the feast at all?" // Jesus' three-and-a-half-year ministry was ramping up to its horrible and wonderful conclusion. Because Jesus had recently raised Lazarus making him even more popular, the Jewish leaders decided to murder Him. Now, as the multitudes gathered for the Passover, they wanted to see Jesus, but wondered if He would come to the feast.
- 8. Jesus Was Wanted Alive or Dead: ⁵⁷ Now the chief priests and the Pharisees had given orders that if anyone knew where He was, he was to report it, so that they might seize Him. // Can you imagine signs being posted all over Jerusalem: Wanted: Jesus of Nazareth: Alive or Dead! Under such a threat, most would flee, but Jesus Our Great Champion came and taught many important things during Holy Week; then He laid down His life!

Let Us Pray: Dear Jesus, You willingly endured horrible things to pay our eternal penalty and gift us with eternal life. **TYSM!**
