

Introduction: Dear friends: *Welcome to Palm Sunday*! <u>Try to</u> imagine being in Jerusalem on that very day:

- You have traveled there to celebrate the Passover,<sup>1</sup>
- multitudes are there with you,<sup>2</sup> and
- many think that Jesus may be the Promised Messiah, so many are longing to see Him!

<u>As the week begins</u>: Many are super-excited about Jesus, but the Jewish Leaders have already *decided* and *made it known* that He must be arrested and be put to death. What a contrast – many loving Jesus, some hating Jesus.

 <u>Why did many love Him</u>? They believed He was \*the Promised Messiah, \*the Son of David, \*the King of Israel. <u>And why were such things significant for many</u>? Israel had been under the rule of others nations for

600+ years, so they longed for the Great Deliverer who would rally the people and defeat the Romans!

Why did the Jewish Leaders hate Jesus? Since He was drawing the people away from them to Himself, those leaders were worried about their jobs and nation!

With all of that in mind, we go to Matthew 21:1-11:

- Behind the Scenes Preparation: <sup>1</sup> When they had approached Jerusalem and had come to <u>Bethphage</u>, at the Mount of Olives, then Jesus sent two disciples, <sup>2</sup> saying to them, "Go into the village opposite you [Bethany], and immediately you will find a donkey tied there and a colt with her; untie them and bring them to Me. <sup>3</sup> If anyone says anything to you, you shall say, 'The Lord has need of them,' and immediately he will send them."
  - a. <u>Get the donkey</u>: Go..., you will find a donkey and her colt. Untie them... When you are questioned, say this and they will send them.
  - <u>Realize that I know everything</u>: \*The donkey's location,
     \*the owner's question, \*the owner's response, \*My coming death, \*the coming ministry of My disciples, and \*the details of all your hearts and minds.
  - c. <u>Realize our important location</u>: They were in Bethphage – *east of Jerusalem* (the donkey was brought there from Bethany). <u>Why is Bethphage significant</u>? The LORD gave Ezekiel a vision shortly before the fall of the southern kingdom (11:22-23); he saw the glory of the LORD depart the temple and stand over the mountain to the east of Jerusalem – *the area of Bethphage*. Then, it was from there that Jesus, *who fully glorified God the Father*, entered Jerusalem – *from the east*!

- God's Unfolding Plan: <sup>4</sup> <u>This took place</u> [the behind the scenes preparation] to fulfill what was spoken through the prophet [Zechariah (9:9)]: <sup>5</sup> "SAY TO THE DAUGHTER OF ZION, 'BEHOLD YOUR KING IS COMING TO YOU, GENTLE, AND MOUNTED ON A DONKEY, EVEN ON A COLT, <u>THE FOAL</u> [the baby] OF A BEAST OF BURDEN.'"
  - a. <u>Since before the creation of the world</u> (1 Peter 1:17-21), God had a grand plan to save the world! So 500+ years before the time of Jesus, the HS moved Zechariah to tell in advance what would happen on Palm Sunday!
  - b. <u>Why a donkey and not a powerful horse</u>? The humble Jesus rode a humble animal – *not trusting in Himself but following the perfect plan of the Father in heaven*. Let us also be humble in all things *and trust in God*!
- More Behind the Scenes Preparation: <sup>6</sup> The disciples went and did just as Jesus had instructed them, <sup>7</sup> and brought the donkey and the colt, and laid their coats on them; and He sat on the coats. // Then, everything was in place to start moving *from the east* toward Jerusalem.

## 4. The One-Mile Procession to Jerusalem:

- a. <u>As the donkey moved forward, many were already</u> <u>present to welcome and honor Jesus</u>: <sup>8</sup> Most of the crowd spread their coats in the road, and others were cutting branches from the trees and spreading them in the road.
- b. <u>Crowds in front of Jesus and behind Jesus</u>: <sup>9</sup> The crowds going ahead of Him, and those who followed, were shouting, "<u>Hosanna to the Son of David</u> [that is, <u>Save, we pray, Son of David</u>]; BLESSED IS HE WHO COMES IN THE NAME OF THE LORD [Psalm 118:25-26]; Hosanna

in the highest!"// Those great crowds welcomed Jesus
as \*the Promised Messiah, \*the Son of David, \*the
King of the Jews. They \*acknowledged Him, \*prayed to
Him, and \*blessed Him. For most, they wanted the
LORD to bless Jesus so that He would ✓ gather them,
✓ lead them, and ✓ conquer the Romans.

- 5. Those in Jerusalem: [The ones in the procession then came to the ones in the city:] <sup>10</sup> When [Jesus] had entered Jerusalem, all the city was <u>stirred</u> [that is, shaken like an earthquake, only mentally and spiritually], saying, "Who is this?" <sup>11</sup> And the crowds were saying, "This is the prophet Jesus, from Nazareth in Galilee."
  - a. <u>Many were wondering, many were interested</u>: The excitement continued Holy Monday as Jesus cleansed the Court of the Gentiles; then, on Holy Tuesday, Jesus taught over 20 different lessons (Matt. 21:18-26:13)!
  - b. Why did wonder and interest turn to "Crucify"? For many they wrongly thought the Messiah would be an earthly king – to \*defeat the Romans and \*restore the nation to the glorious days of King David. However, when the people saw that Jesus' plan did not align with their plan, they rejected Him! What do YOU want – His way or your way? His mission was FAR GREATER than political freedom, He purchased our eternal freedom!
