

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: Our new nature always desires to follow God's word, but our old nature remains within us → trying to get us to live as if we were NOT God's holy children.

Referring to today's title: <u>Why is the internal fighting good</u>? *It shows that the new nature is still in the fight, it has NOT been overcome by the old nature*!

May the HS help us to understand:

- Our own internal fight.
- What to do when we fall into sin.
- How to strengthen the new nature.
- The Law Is Good: ¹⁴ For we know that the Law is <u>spiritual</u> [of divine origin], but I am <u>of flesh</u> [of this fallen world], sold into bondage to sin. // God's Law may seem harsh or restrictive ⇒ but it is for our good and our survival. When we follow God's Law ⇒ He is honored, and we are blessed.

When we break God's Law → we are reminded of our great need for Jesus!

- a. <u>Confusion</u>: ¹⁵ For what I am doing [according to my old nature], I do not understand; for I am <u>not</u> practicing what I would like to do [following my new nature], but I am doing the very thing I hate [following my old nature]. // <u>Repentant believers are like Paul</u>: When we are forgiven and heaven-bound, we desire to do God's will, but our old nature keeps pulling us into sin.
- b. <u>Confession</u>: ¹⁶ But if I do the very thing I do not want to do, I agree with the Law, confessing that the Law is good. // <u>What does that mean</u>? Since Paul believed the Law of God was good, he hated when he broke it. <u>May that same attitude be strong in each of us</u>: Believing the Law is good and having godly sorrow whenever we break it!

2. Sin Keeps Trying to Control Us:

a. <u>Distinguish the old from the new</u>: ¹⁷ So now, no longer am I the one doing [the sin], but [the old nature] which dwells in me. ¹⁸ For I know that nothing good dwells in me, that is, in my flesh; for the willing is present in me [according to my new nature], but the doing of the good is not. // Paul was not blaming the law for his sin, but, rather, he was blaming his old nature, which was passed down to him from Adam (Rom. 5:12). Dr. Kretzmann wrote: "The depth and power of evil in the old Adam is so great that it succeeds again and again in asserting its mastery. But of this the Christian's new life does not

approve, against it he struggles, from it he seeks deliverance."

- b. <u>Be responsible</u>: ¹⁹ For the good that I want, I do not do, but I practice the very <u>evil</u> that I do not want.
 ²⁰ But if I am doing the very thing I do not want, I am no longer the one doing it, but sin which dwells in me. // <u>What did Paul mean by evil</u>? The Greek word is κακόν, which means:
 - i. "a lack of something" I didn't give my best effort, **or**
 - ii. "an inaccuracy" I missed my goal, or
 - iii. "good-for-nothing" I wasted my time.

The word does NOT include *premeditated wickedness*. Therefore, let us *be responsible, *build up **our new nature**, and *avoid all that will surely bring God's eternal wrath!¹

3. The Internal War Within Every Believer:

- a. ²¹ I find then the principle that [the old nature] is present in <u>me</u>, the [part of me who is alive in Christ and] wants to do good. // Let us understand: In this life the old nature will always be with us[®].
- b. ²² For I joyfully [agree] with the law of God in the inner man [my new nature], ²³ but I see <u>a different law</u> [the old nature] in the members of my body, waging war against <u>the law of my mind</u> [the new nature] and making me a prisoner of <u>the law of sin</u> [the old nature] which is in my members. // Our internal war is raging, but let us *keep* fighting and *never* give in, *never TAP OUT*!

- 4. The Problem and the Solution: ²⁴ Wretched man that I am [wanting to honor God yet falling into sin]! Who will set me free from the body of this death *[the old nature]*? ²⁵ Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord! // Since we are helpless to overcome our old nature, God has sent His own Son to defeat sin, death, and the devil! Now, by grace, through faith, in Jesus, for eternal life, we +share in Jesus' victory and * will eventually be free from our old nature forevermore!
- 5. The Ongoing Internal Fight Within Every Believer: So then, on the one hand I myself with my mind [my new nature] am serving the law of God [knowing what is right and wanting to do it], but on the other, with my flesh [my old nature) the law of sin (being tempted and sometimes falling into sin].
 - a. What to do when we fall into sin: Admit it, •understand it is ultimately against God, •be sorry, Iook to Jesus for forgiveness, and seek the help of the HS to go and sin no more!
 - b. How to strengthen the new nature: Be persistent in God's word – +hearing, *reading, *marking, Iearning, and inwardly digesting!²

Let Us Pray: Dear HS, 🎔 fill us, 🎔 give us godly sorrow, assure us of forgiveness, and provide the new nature – so that we glorify God in our daily lives!
