

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: This sermon is an overview of Abraham. Even though he lived about 4,000 years ago, he is looked upon with *GREAT SIGNIFICANCE* by the religions of Christianity, Judaism, and Islam. The Bible has 15 chapters on the life of Abraham (Genesis 11-25), so he should be <u>known</u> by us and <u>significant</u> to us. In this sermon I will \bigcirc give you some highlights of his life and \bigcirc try to entice you to find out more – beginning next week.

- Abram Grew Up with False Gods: "Joshua said to all the people [of Israel]..., 'From ancient times your fathers lived beyond the River, namely, Terah, the father of Abraham and the father of Nahor, and they served other gods'" (Jos. 24:2). Abram had a poor spiritual upbringing, but by God's grace he did not continue to worship false gods. Today, many are worshiping the false gods of <u>sleep</u>, <u>sports</u>, food, <u>sex</u>, and <u>money</u>, but salvation is available through Jesus to all who repent and believe!
- The LORD Called Abram (Genesis 12:1-3): The LORD called him to ⇒leave his gods, ⇒leave his family, and ⇒leave his home; HUGE and DIFFICULT THINGS! To encourage Abram, the LORD promised him land, descendants, and blessings – even to bless all people through him!
- 3. Abram and Lot Separated (Genesis 13): Since their people and livestock became SO NUMEROUS, they agreed to go their separate ways.
 - a. Unfortunately, Lot chose the area of Sodom <u>the</u> <u>ground</u>: *lush, like the garden of Eden*; <u>the people</u>: *exceedingly evil.*
 - b. Sometimes →we, →our children, →our grandchildren make *horrible* choices. If we haven't done so already, let us repent → ☺be sorry, ☺turn from our sins, and ☺trust in Jesus for forgiveness!
- Abram Defeated Four Kings (Genesis 14): Four kings defeated five kings. Among the five was the king of Sodom. The four kings took many captives and spoils *including Lot, his family, and his possessions*. When Lot's uncle, Abram heard the news, he gathered the shepherds

in his large family and – *with the powerful blessing of God* – defeated those kings and rescued Lot and his family!

- 5. Abram Displayed Great Faith (Genesis 12, 15, 16, 18): Try to imagine Abram's long and difficult situation: When he was 75 years old, the LORD promised him descendants. 24 years later, at the age of 99 years old, he and Sarai were still waiting to have their first child!
 - a. Do you believe **all** of God's promises?
 - b. Right now, are you waiting for a particular promise to be fulfilled? Are you waiting patiently – *confident that God will fulfill His promise at the best time!*

As Abraham waited with trust and patience, *let us do the same!*

- 6. Abram Saw the Area of Sodom Burning Like a Furnace: Genesis 19:27-28 Now Abraham arose early in the morning and went to the place where he had stood before the LORD; and he looked down toward Sodom and Gomorrah, and toward all the land of the valley, and he saw, and behold, the smoke of the land ascended like the smoke of a furnace.
 - a. Why did the LORD bring such intense destruction to those **GREAT** cities and that **FERTILE** land? **Because** of the sin of HOMOSEXUALITY! The LORD wanted his radical action to stand as a testimony against homosexuality for all time.
 - b. However, today, most ☺HAVE FORGOTTEN THE LESSON and ☺are calling for the LORD's wrath to be poured out upon them.

- The Sacrifice of Isaac (Genesis 22): Abraham waited 25 years for Isaac to be born, then – when Isaac was about 15 years old, the LORD commanded Abraham to offer Isaac as a sacrifice.
 - a. What did he do?
 - b. What would you do?
