**Introduction:** Dear friends in Christ: This is sermon 1 of 14 as we take **The Holy Week Journey**. If we could somehow see all of time – from creation to the return of Jesus, then we would see how Holy Week + 1 - from Palm Sunday through Easter Sunday is THE MOST IMPORTANT PERIOD OF TIME (Acts 4:12)!

Over the next 40 days or so, we will preach our way through the Gospel according to Mark, **chapters 11-16**. Since Holy Week began with Palm Sunday, *that is our focus today*.

As we take our journey, we need to remember two things:

- We are stretching out Holy Week + 1 over 47 days!
- We are recognizing Jewish time keeping. For example, on day 1, we are focusing on an event that happened FOR US on Saturday evening but FOR JEWS on Sunday.

Day 1 (We, 2/14) – Jesus Anointed at Bethany: Even though this account is recorded in Mark 14, it most likely took place after sunset – at the beginning of Palm Sunday (see Matthew 26:6-13; John 12:1-8).

The Setting: Jesus had been in Jericho at the home of Zacchaeus. Then He traveled 15 miles to Bethany, which is the location where He was anointed. On the map, notice the locations of Jericho, Bethany, and Jerusalem. Jesus probably traveled on Friday, then rested on the Sabbath – Friday at sunset to Saturday at sunset.



2. The Anointing: 14:3 While
[Jesus] was in Bethany at the home of Simon the leper
[attending a dinner in His honor], and reclining at the table, there came a woman with an alabaster vial of very costly perfume of pure nard; and she broke the vial and poured it over His head. 1 // The woman was Mary, the sister of Lazarus and Martha. She expressed



heartfelt thanks to Jesus for raising her brother, but especially for the **GREAT WORK** He was about to do to remove the sin of the world! Let us express our thanks too!

3. The Anger: <sup>4</sup> But some [including Judas Iscariot (John 12:4-5)] were indignantly remarking [speaking with anger] to one another, "Why has this perfume been wasted? <sup>5</sup> For this perfume might have been sold for over three hundred denarii [the amount a laborer would make in a WHOLE YEAR], and the money given to the poor." And they were scolding her.



// As we question paying \$7 million for a 30-second Super Bowl ad, so people questioned that expensive anointing, especially Judas, the money box holder and thief (John 12:6).

4. The Justification: <sup>6</sup> But Jesus said, "Let her alone; why do you bother her? She has done a good deed to Me. <sup>7</sup> For you always have the poor with you, and whenever you wish you can do good to them; but you do not always have Me. <sup>8</sup> She has done what she could; she has anointed My body beforehand for the burial. <sup>9</sup> Truly I say to you, wherever the gospel is preached in the whole world, what this woman has done will also be spoken of in memory of her." // We are blessed, so we should help the poor, but we should also do radical things to honor Jesus, our Lord!

## Day 2 (Th, 2/15) – Jesus' Triumphal Entry:

1. The Setting: 11:1 [On Sunday morning] As [Jesus and His disciples] approached Jerusalem, at Bethphage and Bethany, near the Mount of Olives, He sent two of His disciples, <sup>2</sup> and said to



them, "Go into the village opposite you, and immediately as you enter it, you will find a colt tied *there*, on which no one yet has ever sat; untie it and bring it *here*. <sup>3</sup> If anyone says to you, 'Why are you doing this?' you say, 'The Lord has need of it'; and immediately he will send it back here." <sup>4</sup> They went away and found a colt tied at the door, outside in the street; and they untied it. <sup>5</sup> Some of the bystanders were saying to them, "What are you doing,

untying the colt?" <sup>6</sup> They spoke to them just as Jesus had told *them*, and they gave them permission. // Jesus told His disciples to do something that could have landed them in serious trouble, nevertheless, *they did what He said!* As we read the words of Jesus, *let us do what He said!* 

- 2. The Triumphal Entry: 7 They brought the colt to Jesus and put their coats on it; and He sat on it. 8 And many spread their coats in the road, and others spread leafy branches which they had cut from the fields. 9 Those who went in front and those who followed were shouting: "Hosanna [save us now]! BLESSED IS HE WHO COMES IN THE NAME OF THE LORD; 10 Blessed is the coming kingdom of our father David; Hosanna in the highest!" // Dr. Kretzmann wrote: "The people here confessed Jesus as the Son of David, as the Messiah of Israel, whose kingdom was about to be established." Some understood Jesus' mission to take away the sin of the world, but many probably hoped that Jesus would conquer the Romans and set them free. Let us keep our focus on things that are spiritual and eternal!
- 3. The Conclusion: <sup>11</sup> Jesus entered Jerusalem and came into the temple; and after looking around at everything, He left for Bethany with the twelve, since it was already late. // After seeing what He did, Jesus knew He had important things to address on Monday. Then He and His disciples probably slept at the home of Lazarus, Mary, and Martha in Bethany about 2 miles to the southeast of Jerusalem.

**Let Us Pray:** Dear Jesus, as we journey with You, *fill us with thanksgiving for all You did to take away our sins!* 

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
