## Seventh Sunday of Easter – 2024 <u>Saturday</u>, 5/11 at 4:00 | <u>Sunday</u>, 5/12 at 9:00



Text: Acts 1:12-26 NAS 1995

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: Going back to the time of Acts chapter 1: Much has happened in the last two months:

- Judas betrayed Jesus and ended his life.
- Jesus finished His work and laid down His life.
- God raised Jesus to life on the third day.
- Jesus showed many people that He was alive.
- 40 days after Jesus was raised, He ascended into heaven.

**Now**, we are on the weekend between ▶Jesus' ascension into heaven and ▶God pouring out the Holy Spirit on the Day of Pentecost. In our **Acts** series, this is number **7 of 9**. We are in **Acts chapter 1**; Jesus just ascended into heaven. Now what?

1. The Setting: Acts 1:12 Then [after Jesus had ascended] [Jesus' disciples] returned to Jerusalem from the mount called Olivet, which is near Jerusalem, a Sabbath day's journey away [about ¾ of a mile]. 13 When they had entered the city [of Jerusalem], they went up to the upper room where they

were staying; that is, Peter and John and James and Andrew, Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Matthew, James the son of Alphaeus, and Simon the Zealot, and Judas the son of James. <sup>14</sup> These all with one mind [with no division among them] were continually devoting themselves to prayer, along with the women, and Mary the mother of Jesus, and with His brothers.

- a. The Upper Room: We learn from Acts 12:12 that the upper room was part of the house owned by Mary, the mother of Mark, who wrote the second gospel account. The upper room is where \*they\* ate the Passover meal, \*Jesus\* instituted the Lord's Supper, \*Jesus\* appeared on Resurrection Sunday, and \*Jesus' disciples\* stayed whenever they returned to Jerusalem.
- b. <u>Jesus' Eleven Apostles</u>: **11**: The **12** minus Judas Iscariot, who betrayed Jesus and ended his life (Mt. 27:3-5).
- c. Certain Others are Mentioned:
  - Women: Matthew recorded that many women, who had followed Jesus from Galilee, were present at Calvary (Mt. 27:55), and many or all were probably in the upper room.
  - ii. <u>Jesus' Mother</u>: She was the woman chosen by God
     • through whom the Son of God put on human
     flesh and who raised Him from birth. However,
     <u>Acts 1:14</u> is the <u>last time</u> Mary is mentioned in the
     Bible; now the focus is on proclaiming Jesus!
  - iii. <u>Jesus' Brothers</u>: Prior to Jesus' death and resurrection, they did not believe in Jesus as the Messiah. That is why Jesus entrusted the care of His mother to John (John 19:26-27). However, now, by the grace of God, they are repentant believers.

- 2. The Need to Replace Judas: 15 At this time Peter stood up in the midst of the brethren (a gathering of about one hundred and twenty persons was there together [the ones named and other believers]), and said, 16 "Brethren, the Scripture had to be fulfilled, which the Holy Spirit foretold by the mouth of David concerning Judas, who became a guide to those who arrested Jesus. 17 For he was counted among us and received his share in this ministry." // Judas was NOT predestined to betray Jesus, BUT GOD, according to His divine foreknowledge, knew in advance what Judas would do.
  - a. What Happened to Judas: <sup>18</sup> (Now this man acquired a field with the price of his wickedness [a field that was bought with the blood-money he returned], and falling headlong [after he hanged himself (Mt. 27:5)], he burst open in the middle and all his intestines gushed out. <sup>19</sup> And it became known to all who were living in Jerusalem; so that in their own language that field was called Hakeldama, that is, Field of Blood.)
  - b. What David Wrote: <sup>20</sup> "For it is written in the book of Psalms, 'LET HIS HOMESTEAD BE MADE DESOLATE, AND LET NO ONE DWELL IN IT [Ps. 69:25]'; and, 'LET ANOTHER MAN TAKE HIS OFFICE [Ps. 109:8]." // Bible numbers are important: The 12 sons of Jacob (Israel) symbolize all the OT believers, while the 12 apostles symbolize all the NT believers; 144,000 (12 x 12 x 10 x 10 x 10) symbolizes all believers (Rev. 7:4; 14:1, 3).
- 3. The Qualification to be an Apostle: <sup>21</sup> "Therefore it is necessary that of the men who have accompanied us all the time that the Lord Jesus went in and out among us<sup>22</sup> beginning with the baptism of John until the day that

He was taken up from us-- one of these must become a witness with us of His resurrection." // The only qualified men were the men who had been with Jesus and the 12 from His baptism through His ascension. Note: The man who was chosen became a witness of Jesus' resurrection.

- 4. The Qualified: <sup>23</sup> So they put forward two men, Joseph called Barsabbas (who was also called Justus), and Matthias. // Only two men met the qualifications: <u>Joseph</u> and <u>Matthias</u> *only they made the final list*.
- 5. Letting the Lord Make the Choice: <sup>24</sup> And they prayed and said, "You, Lord, who know the hearts of all men, <u>show which one of these two You have chosen</u> <sup>25</sup> to occupy this ministry and apostleship from which Judas turned aside to go to his own place." <sup>26</sup> And they drew lots for them, and the lot fell to Matthias; and he was added to the eleven apostles.
  - a. The Lord's Choice: As Jesus chose the original 12, so He chose the replacement for Judas. But how? Through the drawing of lots! They brought the choice to Jesus through prayer; then they trusted that the lot that was chosen was the choice of the Lord.
  - b. <u>Matthias</u>: He replaced Judas, then he went to preach the gospel. He served Jesus, and then died as a martyr.

Let Us Pray: Dear Jesus, as Your ancient followers \*sought Your will, \*served You with their lives, and \*died loving You more than life on earth, so help us to be fully convinced that Your will is best; then give us faith and courage to do it!
