

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ:

<u>Last week</u>, on *The Day of Pentecost*, we focused on **** what happened and **** how an OT prophecy from Joel <u>began</u> to be fulfilled – <u>as believers shared God's word with others</u>.

<u>Today</u>, on the Sunday of <u>The Holy Trinity</u>, we continue in Acts chapter 2 (with sermon 9 of 9). Peter wants his hearers to
→ understand who Jesus is and → repent!

1. Who Is Jesus? ¹⁴ But Peter, taking his stand with the eleven, raised his voice and declared to them [the large crowd that had gathered – due to the "noise like a violent rushing wind" (2:2)]... ²² "Men of Israel [descendants of Jacob], listen to [understand] these words: Jesus the Nazarene, a man attested [proven] to you by God with miracles and wonders and signs which God performed through Him in your midst, just as you yourselves know—..." // Jesus did not merely CLAIM to be the Messiah, but it was proven countless times – as God Himself worked through Jesus to

- ♦ heal countless sick, ♦ cast out many demons, and ♦ raise dead people back to life!
- 2. How Did Jesus Die? ²³ "...this Man, delivered over by the predetermined plan and foreknowledge of God, you nailed to a cross by the hands of godless men and put Him to death. // In other words, before creation (Eph. 1:4), God planned what would happen and pknew what would happen to Jesus, by godless men, to save us from our sins!
- 3. Is Jesus Still Dead? ²⁴ "But God raised Him up again, putting an end to the agony of death, since it was impossible for Him to be held in its power." // <u>Still dead?</u>
 No! ◆Jesus is the Son of God in human flesh and ◆the Scriptures said He would be raised (see below).
- 4. How Did Peter Prove Jesus Is Alive? Through these inspired words of David written in Psalm 16:8-11: 25 "For David says of Him [the Son of God], 'I [Jesus] SAW THE LORD [God the Father] ALWAYS IN MY PRESENCE; FOR HE IS AT MY RIGHT HAND, SO THAT I WILL NOT BE SHAKEN. 26 THEREFORE MY HEART WAS GLAD AND MY TONGUE EXULTED; MOREOVER MY FLESH ALSO WILL LIVE IN HOPE; 27 BECAUSE YOU WILL NOT ABANDON MY SOUL TO HADES, NOR ALLOW YOUR HOLY ONE TO UNDERGO DECAY. 28 YOU HAVE MADE KNOWN TO ME THE WAYS OF LIFE; YOU WILL MAKE ME FULL OF GLADNESS WITH YOUR PRESENCE." // In other words, Jesus faced death WITHOUT FEAR because:
 - a. God was with Him!
 - b. God would not abandon His body to the grave!

- c. God promised Him eternal life.

 God has done the same for us!
 - Then, Peter further explained David's inspired words:
- d. <u>David Died and Is Still Dead</u>: ²⁹ "Brethren, I may confidently say to you regarding the patriarch David that he both died and was buried, and his tomb is with us to this day." // David was NOT writing about himself.
- e. Jesus has been Raised: 30 "And so, because [David] was a prophet and knew that GOD HAD SWORN TO HIM WITH AN OATH TO SEAT one OF HIS DESCENDANTS ON HIS THRONE, 31 he looked ahead and spoke of the resurrection of the Christ, that HE WAS NEITHER ABANDONED TO HADES [the place of the dead], NOR DID His flesh SUFFER DECAY [like all other people who die]. // The Holy Spirit moved David to write; then these significant things came to pass:
 - i. On Palm Sunday: The crowds welcomed <u>Jesus</u> as the promised Son of David (Mk. 11:9-10).
 - ii. While in the Tomb: **Jesus**' dead body did not decay.
 - iii. On Easter Sunday: **Jesus**' soul and spirit left Paradise and reentered His resurrected body.

5. Where Is Jesus Now?

- a. Raised: 32 "This Jesus God raised up again, to which we are all witnesses." // We saw Him, HE IS ALIVE!
- b. <u>Ascended</u>: ³³ "Therefore having been exalted to the right hand of God…" // Jesus is now ascended and reigning over all things!

- c. Active: "...and having received from the Father the promise of the Holy Spirit, He has poured forth this which you both see and hear." // Right now, you are witnessing the pouring out of the Holy Spirit! How did that happen? Jesus received Him from the Father, then poured Him out!
- d. Clarification: ³⁴ "For it was not David who ascended into heaven, but [David] himself says [Ps. 110:1]: 'THE LORD [God the Father] SAID TO MY LORD [God the Son], "SIT AT MY RIGHT HAND, ³⁵ UNTIL I MAKE YOUR ENEMIES A FOOTSTOOL FOR YOUR FEET."" // Even David himself clarified that not he, but his Lord would ascend to God's right hand. David's Lord is the Christ!
- 6. How Should We Respond to Jesus being Lord and Christ?

 36 "Therefore let all the house of Israel know for certain that God has made Him both Lord and Christ-- this Jesus whom you crucified." // THINK:
 - a. God sent Jesus and worked through Him!
 - b. Jesus suffered and died to take away sins!
 - c. God raised Jesus from the dead!
 - d. Jesus is both Lord and Christ!
 - e. Jesus is coming again to judge all people!

 Therefore, it is critical to repent to ✓ turn from all sins and ✓ trust in Him as Lord and Christ!

Let Us Pray: Dear Holy Spirit, TYSM for making us repentant! Please work the same in many others before it is too late!

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
