

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: Are you wise or foolish?

- Let's learn the meaning of those terms!
- Let's consider some instructive Bible passages!

1. The Meanings of Wise and Foolish:

- a. Wise (Greek $\sigma o \phi \dot{o} \varsigma$ pronounced sophos): It means skillful, clever, learned. The wise are characterized by the ability to use knowledge for correct behavior or human skill (BW, Friberg).
- b. Foolish (Greek μωρὸς pronounced moros): It means stupid.
 Foolish people are intellectually weak, irrational, or lacking in foresight speaking or acting without thinking it through in advance (BW, Friberg).

2. Some Outcomes of Wise and Foolish:

- a. The Physical Versus the Spiritual:
 - i. The foolish: Live for this world!
 - ii. The wise: Have ⇒less and less concern about physical things and ⇒more and more concern about spiritual things!
 - iii. Romans 8:5-6 "...those who are according to the <u>flesh</u> set their minds on the things of the flesh, but those who are according to the <u>Spirit</u>, the things of the Spirit. For the mind set on the **flesh is death**, but the mind set on the **Spirit is life and peace**..."
- b. Same Knowledge, Different Outcomes: Jesus said in Matthew 7:24-27: "...everyone who hears these words of Mine and acts on them, may be compared to a wise man who built his house on the rock. And the rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and slammed against that house; and yet it did not fall, for it had been founded on the rock. Everyone who hears these words of Mine and does not act on them, will be like a foolish man who built his house on the sand. The rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and slammed against that house; and it fell-- and great was its fall." // Did you notice the difference?
- c. It is critical to hear, understand, believe, and apply God's word: James 1:22: "...prove yourselves doers of the word, and not merely hearers who delude themselves."

3. OT – Proverbs 9:1-9:

- a. A Wonderful Invitation vv. 4-6: "Whoever is naïve [easily deceived], let him turn in here!" To him who lacks understanding [wisdom] says, "Come, eat of my food And drink of the wine I have mixed. Forsake [abandon] your folly [foolish ways] and live [stay alive], And proceed in the way of understanding [insight, awareness]."
 - i. God is inviting everyone: To ≯learn His word and
 be saved through Jesus.
 - ii. Many young people are not paying attention: According to some Barna research in 2016:
 - 1. **25%** of US teens (13-17 years old) read the Bible once a week or more[©]. Every day = 3%[©].
 - 2. **75%** read the Bible *from once a month to never*⊗.¹
- b. A Thought-Provoking Statement v. 10: "The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom..."
 - i. When we have a healthy fear of the LORD: ◆We respect His power and ◆trust in Him as our God resulting in willing obedience to His will.
 - ii. Moses said to the people: Exodus 20:20: "God has come... in order that the fear of Him may remain with you, so that you may not sin."
- 4. EP Ephesians 5:6-21: Instructions for believers:
 - a. <u>Be Careful vv. 15-16</u>: "...be careful how you walk, not as unwise men but as wise, making the most of your time, because the days are evil."

- i. Wise people make the most of their time by focusing on eternal souls.
- ii. Proverbs 11:30: "The fruit of the righteous is a tree of life, And he who is wise wins souls."
- b. <u>Understand v. 17</u>: "...do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is."
 - i. The foolish live for this fallen world.
 - ii. The wise seek to know and do the will of the Lord!
- c. <u>Be Filled v. 18</u>: "...do not get drunk with wine, for that is <u>dissipation</u> ["the act of one who has abandoned himself to reckless immoral behavior" (BW, Friberg)], but be filled with the Spirit..." // When we are filled with the Spirit, we will walk in agreement with the Spirit!
- d. Give Thanks v. 20: "...always giving thanks for all things in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to God..." // Even on our worst days, we have countless reasons to cry out to God with thanksgiving, so let us *keep seeing our blessings and *keep giving thanks to God!

Let Us Pray: Dear Father, we thank You for *the wisdom of your word, *the living, dying, and rising of Your Son, and *the eternal gifts You have showered upon us, such as <u>full</u> <u>forgiveness</u>, <u>membership in Your kingdom</u>, and <u>the coming bliss of living in Your eternal presence</u>. **Now**, *keep us wise and *work through us to draw others to abandon their foolish ways and receive Jesus as Savior and Lord!
