Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: It's natural for us to doubt extraordinary things; therefore, today, I'm excited to encourage you to ALWAYS BELIEVE GOD'S PROMISES!

- The Setting: In the ninth century before Christ, Israel had been divided into \*the northern kingdom and \*the southern kingdom. In the north, all the kings were disobedient to the LORD. Regarding <u>Ahab</u>, a northern king, the Bible says, 1 Kings 16:30 Ahab... did evil in the sight of the LORD more than all who were before him. In contrast, Elijah faithfully served the LORD!
- 2. Elijah Told the Truth: 1 Kings 17:1 Now Elijah... [because of Ahab's great wickedness] said to Ahab, "As the LORD, the God of Israel lives, before whom I stand, surely there shall be neither dew nor rain these years, except by my word." // THINK: No rain would \*devastate the north and \*make Ahab's reign miserable.

- 3. The LORD Promised: He said to Elijah: <sup>3</sup> "...hide yourself [from Ahab] by the brook Cherith [about 28 miles from Samaria]...<sup>4</sup> ...drink of the brook, and I have commanded the ravens [who are scavengers] to provide for you there." // Quite a promise!
- 4. Elijah Obeyed: As the LORD commanded, so Elijah obeyed! <sup>6</sup> The ravens brought him bread and meat in the morning and bread and meat in the evening, and he would drink from the brook. // The LORD's promise seemed impossible, BUT He did it! Let us ALWAYS BELIEVE GOD'S PROMISES!
- 5. Again, the LORD Promised: <sup>7</sup> It happened after a while that the brook dried up, because there was no rain in the land. <sup>8</sup> Then the word of the LORD came to [Elijah], saying, <sup>9</sup> "Arise, go to Zarephath, which belongs to Sidon, and stay there; behold, I have commanded a widow there to provide for you." // First, ravens! Now, a widow!
  - a. <u>Go to Sidon Why is that Shocking</u>? Sidon was \*the birthplace of Jezebel, *Ahab's wife*, and \*known for its great wickedness!
  - b. <u>A Widow Will Provide for You</u>: **No way!** *Widows could barely provide for themselves!* 
    - i. What have YOU done when a command of the LORD did <u>not</u> make sense?
    - ii. What did Elijah do?
- 6. Elijah Did What Didn't Make Sense: <sup>10</sup> So he arose and went to Zarephath [a journey of about 50 miles], and when he came to the gate of the city, behold, a widow was there gathering sticks; and he called to her and said, "Please get

me a little water in a jar, that I may drink." <sup>11</sup> As she was going to get *it*, he called to her and said, "Please bring me a piece of bread in your hand." // <u>What happened</u>? Elijah, *seeing a woman*, asked her for water, *and she gave a favorable response! Therefore*, he also asked her for a piece of bread. Elijah **\*believed** the LORD's promise and **\*took** the necessary steps to receive the benefits. <u>How is</u> <u>the LORD calling *all people* to receive great benefits</u>?

- a. <u>Be Saved How</u>? **Repent** (turn from your sins) **and believe** (trust in Jesus) (Mk. 1:15)!
- b. <u>Be at Peace How</u>? *Trust in the LORD* (Isaiah 26:3)!
- 7. The Problem: <sup>12</sup> But she said, "As the LORD your God lives, I have no bread, only a handful of flour in the bowl and a little oil in the jar; and behold, I am gathering a few sticks that I may go in and prepare for me and my son, that we may eat it and die."
  - a. <u>THINK</u>: There had been <u>no rain</u> (since Elijah announced the LORD's will to Ahab), The Brook Cherith had dried up, and to everyone in the northern kingdom was suffering.
  - b. <u>The Widow's Plan</u>: I will use my **final flour and oil** to make a *small loaf of bread* for me and my son, *◆*then we will eat it, and *◆*then we will starve to death!
- 8. The LORD's Promise: <sup>13</sup> Then Elijah said to her, "Do not fear; go, do as you have said, but make me a little bread cake from it <u>first</u> and bring *it* out to me, and afterward you may make *one* for yourself and for your son. <sup>14</sup> For thus says the LORD God of Israel, 'The bowl of flour shall not be exhausted, nor shall the jar of oil be empty, until the day that the LORD sends rain on the face of the earth."

- a. <u>That's Impossible</u>: After making one small loaf of bread, *the flour and oil will be gone!*
- b. <u>What Do YOU Do</u>? Believe God *NO MATTER WHAT* or use your logic to cancel out God's word?
- 9. The Woman's Trust: <sup>15</sup> So she went and did according to the word of Elijah, and she and he and her household ate for many days. <sup>16</sup> The bowl of flour was not exhausted nor did the jar of oil become empty, according to the word of the LORD which He spoke through Elijah.
  - a. <u>In the Face of Death</u>: The widow brought *bread to him FIRST*; then the LORD caused *the flour and oil containers to NEVER RUN OUT until it rained*!
  - b. <u>How are WE being tempted to put OUR logic over</u> <u>God's promises</u>? Even though WE'VE done it countless times, now is the moment ⇒to STOP, ⇒to TURN AROUND, and ⇒to GO FORWARD by ALWAYS <u>BELIEVING GOD'S PROMISES</u>!
  - c. <u>How Do We Show Our Belief</u>? *By doing whatever God's word says!*

Conclusion: The widow believed what seemed impossible – AND THE LORD PROVIDED! So, when God's forgiveness seems impossible – LET US BE SURE WE HAVE IT THROUGH JESUS!

Let Us Pray: Dear LORD, Thank You for making us Your own through Jesus! Now, wherever we are weak – make us strong, and wherever we are wavering – move us to ALWAYS BELIEVE YOUR PROMISES!
