

Introduction: Dear friends: This is Part 1 of a 6-Part series on "The 12 Days of Christmas." Listen to <u>Pentatonix</u> sing it...

<u>This sermon</u>: \checkmark The purpose of Advent, \checkmark the reason for **The 12 Days of Christmas**, \checkmark the sixteenth-century danger of being a Roman Catholic, and \checkmark the meaning of days 12 & 11.

1. The Season of Advent:

- a. <u>Beginning</u>: On the *fourth Sunday before Christmas*.
- Meaning: Coming Jesus <u>came</u> to save us and will <u>come again</u> to take all believers to His Father's house.
- c. <u>Moods</u>: **Advent** *sorrow for sin*; **Christmas** *forgiveness, peace, and joy*.
- d. <u>Activities</u>: *Be sorry for our sins, *prepare to celebrate Jesus' birth, and *be ready for His return.
- Materialistic: Decorating, shopping, and parties.
 May this series cause us to make some <u>Christ-centered</u> <u>changes</u> in the ways each of us proceed through the Seasons of **Advent** and **Christmas**.

2. The History Behind the 12 Days of Christmas:

- a. <u>Which 12 Days</u>? In the <u>Church Year</u> (Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, etc.), the Season of Christmas has 12 days:
 December 25 → January 5 (Jan. 6 is the Day of the Epiphany, which begins the Season of Epiphany).
- b. <u>Celebrating Christmas</u>: Long ago, people celebrated Christmas for all 12 days, *which included going to church on each of the 12 days!*
- c. <u>The Origin and Purpose</u>: Roman Catholic priests wrote *The 12 Days of Christmas* to disguise their teachings.
- d. <u>Why was Disguising Necessary</u>? "Teaching the Catholic faith was outlawed in [1558]. [Queen Mary persecuted Protestants (1554-58). Then her sister, Elizabeth, persecuted Catholics (1558-1603).] Those who instructed their children in Catholicism could be <u>drawn and quartered</u> (which was a very horrible form of capital punishment). Thus, the church went underground. To hide the important and illegal elements of their teaching, clerics composed poems... [such as] 'The Twelve Days of Christmas.'"¹
- e. <u>It was Easier Then Than Now</u>: "In ancient times... few people worked in the dead of winter.... So, devoting a dozen days to <u>prayer</u>, <u>reflection</u>, and <u>attending church</u> was not a huge undertaking. Yet with the coming of the Industrial Age and the regular year-round work schedules... the twelve days of Christmas became all but impossible for most people" (Ibid., 164-165).

- 3. The Order of This Series: Rather than go from 1 to 12; we will go from 12 to 1, arriving at 1 on Christmas Day, which is the first day of Christmas!
- 4. The Giver and Receivers: <u>The Giver</u>, "My True Love," is God the Father. <u>The receivers</u> are all who trust in Jesus.
- 5. Day 12 12 Drummers Drumming: The 12 Points of Belief in the Apostles' Creed. It was thought at one time that each of the 12 apostles wrote one point of belief in the creed, but that is unlikely. The Old Roman Creed, in written form by 180, may have developed into the Apostles' Creed. The earliest appearance of what we know as the Apostles' Creed was written between 710 and 714.² The Apostles' Creed is a summary of the Bible. These are the 12 points of belief:
 - I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth. // Father – Almighty, maker!
 - 2) And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord; // Son the Christ, named Jesus, who is our Lord!
 - **3)** who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary; // **Mystery** conception, virgin born!
 - suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; // Paid – our eternal penalty!
 - 5) He descended into hell; The third day He rose again from the dead; // Victory Tour hell and earth!
 - 6) He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty; // Ascended, Reigning!
 - 7) From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead. // Coming to reveal each person's destiny!

- 8) I believe in the Holy Spirit; // Third Person of the Holy Trinity and daily blessing us in countless ways!
- 9) the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints; // Believers – the body of Christ, united together!
- 10) the forgiveness of sins; // Received through Jesus!
- 11) the resurrection of the body; // When Jesus returns!
- 12) and the life everlasting. Amen. // Eternal happiness!
- 6. Day 11 11 Pipers Piping: The 11 Faithful Disciples. The 12 and the authority they received: Matthew 10:1-4 Jesus summoned His twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to heal every kind of disease and every kind of sickness. ² Now the names of the twelve apostles are these: The first, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew his brother; and James the son of Zebedee, and John his brother; ³ Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; ⁴ Simon the Zealot, and Judas Iscariot, the one who betrayed Him. // Sadly, Judas, numbered among the 12, betrayed Jesus for 30 pieces of silver.
