

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: This is Part 3 of a 6-Part Series on The 12 Days of Christmas. We are counting down from Day 12 to 1, and plan to arrive on Day 1 on the First Day of Christmas, which is Christmas Day, 12/25.

The poem, **The 12 Days of Christmas**, was written in **1558**, and then turned into a song in **1909** (see parts 1 and 2 for more historical information).

What is the song about? It is about **God the Father** giving **12 Bible Gifts** to people who **trust in Jesus as their Savior**.

<u>What are those gifts</u>? So far in this series we have covered these days of The 12 Days of Christmas:

- Day 12 Twelve Drummers Drumming, which point to The 12 points of belief in the Apostles' Creed.
- Day 11 Eleven Pipers Piping, which point to The 11 faithful disciples.
- Day 10 Ten Lords A-Leaping, which point to The 10 Commandments.

 Day 9 – Nine Ladies Dancing, which point to The 9 Parts of the Fruit of the Spirit.

<u>Today we focus on days 8 and 7</u>, as we continue to countdown to day 1 – A Partridge in a Pear Tree, which points to Jesus, the Christ, our Savior and our Lord!

- Day 8 Eight Maids A-Milking: The Eight Beatitudes, which begin the Sermon on the Mount. They tell us

 what we are / how we live as disciples of Jesus and → identify eight eternal blessings.
 - a. Matthew 5:3-10 Blessed are <u>the poor in spirit</u>, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. // Aware of their spiritual helplessness, they **are trusting in Jesus* and **have God's gift of heaven!*
 - b. ⁴ Blessed are <u>those who mourn</u>, for they shall be comforted. // Aware that their sins separated themselves from God, they are *trusting in Jesus* and *comforted with forgiveness!*
 - c. ⁵ Blessed are <u>the gentle</u> [considerate], for they shall inherit the earth. // As followers of Jesus, they
 show consideration to others and *have an amazing inheritance*!
 - d. ⁶ Blessed are <u>those who hunger and thirst for</u> <u>righteousness</u>, for they shall be satisfied. // As followers of Jesus, they *are righteous in God's sight* and *desire to live righteous lives!*
 - e. ⁷ Blessed are <u>the merciful</u>, for they shall receive mercy. // As followers of Jesus, they *have received God's mercy* and *extend it to others!*

- f. ⁸ Blessed are <u>the pure in heart</u>, for they shall see God. // As followers of Jesus, *they are clean on the inside, and *it shows on the outside!
- g. ⁹ Blessed are <u>the peacemakers</u>, for they shall be called sons of God. // As followers of Jesus, they *are at peace with God* and *seek the same for others* by sharing God's truth and praying!
- h. ¹⁰ Blessed are <u>those who have been persecuted</u> <u>for the sake of righteousness</u>, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. // As followers of Jesus, they live for Jesus, which results in persecution. Such people have their citizenship in heaven!

<u>Application</u>: On **the Eighth Day of Christmas**, compare your life with the eight beatitudes!

- Day 7 Seven Swans A-Swimming: The Seven Gifts of the Spirit. These are seven gifts given to Christians to enable them to serve in God's kingdom. Romans 12:6-8 Since we have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, each of us is to exercise them accordingly: [As I go through the list, let us try to identify our gift or gifts. Then, let us gladly use them to serve the Lord!]
 - a. if prophecy, according to the proportion of his faith; // Prophecy is sharing God's word in a way that is accurate and beneficial. On a scale of 1 to 10, where is our faith? ... >Our faith and >our sharing of God's word should be in harmony!
 - b. ⁷ if <u>service</u>, in his serving; // Many at Bethlehem are in positions to serve within our congregation TY! Whatever our position is, let us serve <u>gladly</u>, <u>well</u>, <u>in harmony with others</u>, and <u>to God's glory</u>!

- c. he who <u>teaches</u>, in his teaching; // We are blessed at Bethlehem to have 13 people who teach others. Let us follow the pattern of Ezra by *knowing the Bible is true, *studying the Bible, and *living the Bible, then we will be ready to teach the Bible!
- d. ⁸ he who <u>exhorts</u>, in his exhortation; // Some have the gift of **inviting**, **begging**, **urging** others in a particular direction. If you have that gift, *then use it to be a blessing in God's kingdom!*
- he who gives, with liberality; // Our giving should be based on our receiving. We have all received, so let us give. For those with this gift, let them do so *generously and *with no strings attached!
- f. he who <u>leads</u>, with diligence; // Since most of our lives influence others, we are leaders to some extent. *So let us lead in God-honoring ways!*
- g. he who <u>shows mercy</u>, with cheerfulness. // Mercy is helping someone in need. Whenever we do so, let us *be positive* and *express Christ-like love!*

Application: On **the Seventh Day of Christmas**, *identify your gift(s), *give thanks, and *be diligent in using it/them to be a blessing!

Let Us Pray: Dear Father in heaven, even though The 12 Days of Christmas is a silly song, help us to +understand Your 12 precious gifts and +make use of them according to Your will!
